2	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Counsel for the people,
3	good morning.
4	MR. WAHLEN: Morning.
5	MR. BEASLEY: Morning.
6	MR. REHWINKEL: Morning.
7	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Are the parties all
8	represented?
9	MR. WAHLEN: I think we're missing one.
10	MR. REHWINKEL: Yeah, I I haven't seen
11	FIPUG. I haven't seen Mr. Moyle.
12	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Are we expecting
13	Mr. Moyle
14	MR. TRIERWEILER: Yes, Commissioner, we are.
15	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Mr. Trierweiler?
16	Okay.
17	MR. TRIERWEILER: Yes, we are.
18	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Well, then, the
19	question issued is: Should we wait. Of course, we
20	should, but all right. Let's let's hold here
21	for a few minutes.
22	MR. REHWINKEL: I'm going to go outside and
23	give him a call to make sure that he's
24	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Of course. Yeah. Feel
25	free.

1	MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you.
2	(Brief recess.)
3	MR. REHWINKEL: Commissioner, when are we
4	back on the record? Can I I would like to
5	suggest something. I tried to call Mr. Moyle. I
6	texted him. I've asked him to text Mr. Wahlen
7	because I don't have coverage inside the building.
8	If I could suggest this, is I know he filed
9	a pre-hearing statement. His issues are
10	identical his positions are identical to ours.
11	If it would be acceptable to the Comm to the
12	Chair, to staff, and the party, I would represent
13	that he agrees and I think usually you give,
14	like, until 5:00 the next day to conform positions,
15	but I think, if he needs to make a change, he could
16	do it by noon tomorrow, if not the end of the day
17	today.
18	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Mr. Rehwinkel, let
19	me let me ask Counsel if we should include that
20	statement at the time that we come to the to
21	that in the proceeding.
22	MR. TRIERWEILER: We should, Your Honor.
23	Clarification, it is 5:00 today that April 26th,
24	that he would have to that they have an
25	opportunity to respond. Everyone every party

1	has filed a position and has so, they've taken a
2	position. So, they have you know, they have met
3	that burden.
4	Then there's the burden of appearance.
5	Perhaps he'll show, but it can be excused as you
6	know, for good cause shown, for whatever reason
7	that Mr. Moyle would need to be excused, but I
8	think that we should drive on and see if we don't
9	hear from Mr. Moyle before the end of the
10	pre-hearing conference, or by 5:00 today, as to
11	whether or not he wants to change any of his
12	positions.
13	But you have a legal adviser here and I
14	don't know if she has any comment.
15	MS. GERVASI: Commissioner, I would agree with
16	staff counsel on that. There is a section in the
17	order establishing procedure that deals with when a
18	party doesn't show. And a failure of a party not
19	to come to the pre-hearing constitutes a waiver of
20	that parties' issues and positions, unless they
21	show good cause. So, perhaps he will be able to do
22	that.
23	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: You know, I've been
24	here awhile and I still haven't figured out those
25	buttons. So, my apologies.

1	Thank you for those comments. Should we I
2	would like to revisit that issue under other
3	matters at the end. Would that be acceptable?
4	MS. GERVASI: Certainly.
5	MR. WAHLEN: No objection. That will be fine.
6	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: And between now and
7	then, perhaps, we'll hear from Mr. Moyle.
8	MR. REHWINKEL: I think that's a good
9	solution. Thank you.
10	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. And the issue of
11	good cause, I'll I'll get advice under other
12	matters. If if we need to address that, we'll
13	do so at that time.
14	Now, I'll take it that all the comments are on
15	the record, even though we haven't called the
16	hearing to order. So, we'll back up with regard to
17	the discussion we we just had.
18	MR. REHWINKEL: Understood.
19	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: And and we'll note
20	that that discussion was was recorded.
21	So, the let me say good morning, which
22	I've
23	MR. REHWINKEL: Morning.
24	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: already met with you
25	here before we sat down. So, good morning, again.

1	And the time is approximately 9:42, a few
2	minutes behind our scheduled commencement. Today
3	is April 26th, 2018. At the noted time, I will now
4	call the time I just noted, I'll call this
5	pre-hearing conference to order. I'm Commissioner
6	Polmann, sitting as presiding officer today.
7	Staff, please read the notice.
8	MR. TRIERWEILER: By notice issued April 16,
9	2018, this time and place has been set for this
10	pre-hearing conference, in Docket No. 20170260-EI.
11	The purpose of this pre-hearing is set out in
12	the notice.
13	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you,
14	Mr. Trierweiler.
15	We'll now take appearances beginning with
16	TECO.
17	MR. WAHLEN: Good morning, Commissioner. I'm
18	Jeff Wahlen, appearing with James D. Beasley, of
19	the Ausley McMullen law firm, P. O. Box 391,
20	Tallahassee, Florida, on behalf of Tampa Electric
21	Company.
22	MR. REHWINKEL: Good morning, Commissioner.
23	Charles Rehwinkel, the Office of Public Counsel,
24	appearing on behalf of Tampa Electric's customers.
25	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: We'll note that FIPUG

1	is a party to the proceeding. And at this moment,
2	Mr. Moyle has not made an appearance here.
3	Commission staff?
4	MR. TRIERWEILER: Good morning, Commissioner.
5	I'm Walt Trierweiler and, together with Kurt
6	Schrader, we represent Commission staff.
7	MS. GERVASI: And Rosanne Gervasi, adviser to
8	the Commission.
9	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you.
10	Preliminary matters. Staff, do we have
11	preliminary matters?
12	MR. TRIERWEILER: Yes, Commissioner, staff has
13	a few items to address. The first is that the
14	parties have achieved a consensus list of issues,
15	but we don't have a consensus on the positions at
16	this time.
17	Staff requests that all parties bring at least
18	20 copies of all exhibits they wish to introduce
19	into evidence at the hearing with the appropriate
20	cover sheet to be placed on each exhibit, which
21	will be distributed by staff through e-mail,
22	following this pre-hearing.
23	No party has indicated in its pre-hearing
24	statement that it desires voir dire of the
25	witnesses.

1	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you,
2	Mr. Trierweiler.
3	Let's look at the draft pre-hearing order. I
4	trust everyone has a copy of this document; is that
5	correct?
6	MR. WAHLEN: Yes, sir.
7	MR. REHWINKEL: Yes.
8	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. I think it's
9	appropriate, we'll just go section by section.
10	MR. WAHLEN: Very well.
11	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. And what
12	I what I would like to do, rather than going
13	through all of the detail here, I think it's
14	appropriate basically, we're going to ask for
15	corrections, changes, or if you have comments that
16	you would like to make and not necessarily, you
17	know, go into a narrative here. We're specifically
18	trying to focus we we've worked on this quite
19	a bit, and I I know you've been involved.
20	So, what we're looking for is comments in the
21	sense of of changes, corrections, things of that
22	nature. So, we're we'll move here pretty
23	quickly.
24	I'm going to start here, unless you have
25	anything up front in terms of the the

1	appearances and such. We'll just go to case
2	background, Section 1. Anybody would like to
3	MR. WAHLEN: No changes.
4	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Rather than rather
5	than calling calling parties, I'll just ask if
6	you have any any issues here.
7	MR. WAHLEN: No changes.
8	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. Thank you.
9	Section 2, conduct of the proceedings.
10	MR. REHWINKEL: No changes.
11	MR. WAHLEN: No changes.
12	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. Thank you.
13	Section 3, the jurisdiction. No?
14	MR. REHWINKEL: None.
15	MR. WAHLEN: No changes.
16	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Section 4 is procedure
17	for handling confidential information.
18	MR. REHWINKEL: No changes.
19	MR. WAHLEN: No changes.
20	MR. TRIERWEILER: Regarding confidential
21	exhibits, staff would like to note the following.
22	When confidential information is used in the
23	hearing that has not been filed as prefiled
24	testimony or prefiled exhibits, parties must have
25	copies for the Commissioners, necessary staff, and

1	the court reporter, in red envelopes, clearly
2	marked with the nature of the contents and with the
3	confidential information highlighted.
4	Any party wishing to examine the confidential
5	material that is not subject to an order granting
6	confidentiality shall be provided a copy in the
7	same fashion as provided to the Commissioners,
8	subject to execution of any appropriate protective
9	agreement with the owner of the material.
10	Ten copies of all confidential prefiled
11	testimony and exhibits will be made available to
12	the parties in the hearing room on the day of the
13	hearing.
14	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you,
15	Mr. Trierweiler.
16	I'm looking at Section 5 on Page 3 of the
17	document. Any
18	MR. WAHLEN: No changes.
19	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Any comments there?
20	All right. Looking at at Section 6, we
21	have order of witnesses. Any changes, corrections
22	on that?
23	MR. WAHLEN: No changes.
24	MR. REHWINKEL: None.
25	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right.

1	MR. TRIERWEILER: Commissioner, staff
2	recommends that witnesses' summaries be limited to
3	no more than five minutes per witness.
4	MR. WAHLEN: That will be fine.
5	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. No issues there.
6	MR. REHWINKEL: That's fine.
7	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Very good. Thank you.
8	All right. So, the conclusion there is that
9	five minutes would would be the would be the
10	limit. Feel free if you don't need the five
11	minutes, we'll be happy with less than five.
12	MR. WAHLEN: Less is more.
13	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. Very good.
14	Moving on, we have Section 7, the basic
15	positions. Do we have everything spelled out here?
16	You have any corrections or changes on those?
17	MR. WAHLEN: No changes.
18	MR. REHWINKEL: None from us.
19	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. Very good.
20	I'm on Section 8, issues and positions. What
21	we can do here let me just ask overall, we
22	have I should know this. I'm sure you do. How
23	many issues do we have? Is it
24	MR. WAHLEN: Eight issues.
25	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: eight. Let me ask

1	both parties: Do you have any changes or comments
2	on any of the positions?
3	MR. WAHLEN: No, sir. Tampa Electric's
4	positions, as set forth in the draft pre-hearing
5	order, are fine as is.
6	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. So, no issues
7	on no comments, changes on any of the eight.
8	MR. WAHLEN: That's correct.
9	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Mr. Rehwinkel?
10	MR. REHWINKEL: And from the Public Counsel's
11	standpoint, our issues are all accurately
12	reflected.
13	For the record, in Mr. Moyle's absence, I
14	would make this representation, based on a message
15	he sent me about a week and a half ago. I think he
16	wants to be aligned with Public Counsel's issues
17	and positions, I mean.
18	And I think it would be appropriate to change
19	his position on Issue 7, contingent upon his
20	confirmation and and showing of good cause to
21	for his absence here, to to make the FIPUG
22	position the same as the Public Counsel position,
23	which would just add the word "no" and a comma in
24	front of that position.
25	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. So, Issue 7,

1	Office of Public Counsel represents that the FIPUG
2	position, based on your communication with
3	Mr. Moyle, should be identical; that being, change
4	the FIPUG position, "Not at this time" to, "No,"
5	comma, "not at this time."
6	MR. REHWINKEL: Yes, Commissioner, subject to
7	his remaining in the docket and confirming that
8	with your Counsel by the end of the day today.
9	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, sir.
10	MR. WAHLEN: That's fine.
11	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. That was
12	concurrence from Mr. Wahlen.
13	Okay. So, we have the parties indicating, for
14	all eight issues, other than the comment we just
15	heard from Mr. Rehwinkel regarding FIPUG, that
16	there are no no changes.
17	We'll turn to Section 9, the exhibit list.
18	And I would like to hear from staff on that. And
19	then we'll we'll move forward here.
20	Mr. Trierweiler?
21	MR. TRIERWEILER: Commissioner, staff has
22	prepared a comprehensive exhibit list, which
23	includes all prefiled exhibits and also includes
24	those exhibits staff wishes to include in the
25	record

1	A copy of the draft comprehensive exhibit list
2	was provided to the parties by e-mail on Wednesday,
3	April 25th, 2018, and they were provided with an
4	updated hard copy today.
5	Staff will check with the parties prior to the
6	hearing to determine if there are any objections to
7	the comprehensive exhibit list or any of staff's
8	exhibits being entered into the record. So far,
9	we've had no objections to the comprehensive
10	exhibit list.
11	Staff requests that the parties review the
12	list that's been provided today and be prepared to
13	state whether or not they can stipulate to the list
14	or will object to specific exhibits by the close of
15	business, Tuesday, May 1st, 2018.
16	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you,
17	Mr. Trierweiler.
18	We have 11 exhibits total. If you would,
19	please confirm that you have received the list
20	Mr. Trierweiler indicated. This is referred to as
21	the comprehensive exhibit list for entry into
22	hearing record May 8 and 9, 2018.
23	MR. WAHLEN: Tampa Electric has the list and
24	we're prepared to stipulate
25	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. We're

1	MR. WAHLEN: to its contents.
2	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: We're showing
3	Exhibits 1, 2, and 3.
4	MR. WAHLEN: Yes, sir.
5	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Tampa Electric Company,
6	in direct, and then staff exhibit staff hearing
7	exhibits numbered 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11.
8	MR. WAHLEN: Yes, and we're we're good with
9	all of those. We have no objections and will
10	stipulate to their admission.
11	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. Thank you,
12	sir.
13	Mr. Rehwinkel.
14	MR. REHWINKEL: Yes, we have access to the
15	to the list. And we have expressed to staff and to
16	Tampa Electric that, upon confirmation and final
17	review, it is our expectation that we will agree to
18	that, in order to streamline the hearing process,
19	but we will we will endeavor to let staff know
20	far in advance of the May 1st deadline.
21	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, sir.
22	All right. Staff Counsel, do you have
23	anything further on that item, on the exhibit list?
24	MR. TRIERWEILER: No, Commissioner, other than
25	to note that the response to staff's sixth set of

1	interrogatories is due at later today, and it
2	the placeholder for those responses is Exhibit 6,
3	the last exhibit.
4	MR. WAHLEN: Tampa Electric will be filing
5	that today.
6	And I'm not sure if I was clear, but Tampa
7	Electric is fine with the exhibit list in Section 9
8	of the pre-hearing order. That accurately reflects
9	our prefiled exhibits.
10	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. Mr. Trierweiler,
11	you referred to that as Exhibit 6. That is
12	actually Exhibit No. 11, staff's sixth set of
13	interrogatories; is that correct, sir?
14	MR. TRIERWEILER: That's accurate.
15	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you.
16	Anything further from any of the parties on
17	the exhibit list?
18	MR. WAHLEN: No, sir.
19	MR. REHWINKEL: No, sir.
20	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. Thank you.
21	We're looking at Section 10 in the the
22	draft order.
23	MR. WAHLEN: I believe that's accurate at this
24	time, yes.
25	MR. TRIERWEILER: There are no stipulated

1	issues.
2	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: There are no stipulated
3	issues.
4	MR. WAHLEN: That's correct.
5	MR. TRIERWEILER: That is
6	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Is that everyone
7	agrees with that?
8	MR. WAHLEN: Yes.
9	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right. Let's see.
10	Section 11, pending motions. I'm showing motion
11	for temporary protective order. TECO has filed
12	three on various dates. Staff, you have comments
13	on those? And then we'll we'll confirm with
14	TECO.
15	Mr. Trierweiler, would you identify those,
16	please?
17	MR. TRIERWEILER: That that is accurate.
18	There are three pending motions for protective
19	order that accompanied the three requests from TECO
20	for confidentiality of certain documents.
21	MR. WAHLEN: That's correct. I believe those
22	are unopposed motions, and the list is accurate.
23	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. So, then, under
24	Section 12, those pending motions, then, leave us
25	with pending confidentiality matters.

1	Mr. Trierweiler?
2	MR. TRIERWEILER: That is correct,
3	Commissioner. And they'll be taken up at the same
4	time as the motions for protective order.
5	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. So, it's
6	understood where we stand on all of those?
7	MR. WAHLEN: Yes, sir.
8	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Very good.
9	Section 13 deals with post-hearing procedures.
10	And Mr. Trierweiler, you please elaborate on
11	that.
12	MR. TRIERWEILER: Commissioner, it is staff's
13	understanding that the parties want to waive the
14	filing of briefs and may prefer to submit this
15	docket to a bench vote. If that's true, then the
16	Commission determines whether or not that's
17	acceptable. And if it is acceptable, then no
18	briefs would be required. If the Commission does
19	not render a bench decision, then the procedures in
20	the OEP will be followed.
21	Perhaps it would be appropriate to see if that
22	is, indeed, the will of the parties.
23	MR. REHWINKEL: Yes, Commissioner, it is. I'm
24	mostly in agreement with Mr. Tri Trierweiler.
25	T hope I propounced your name correctly

1	The it is our expectation that we will
2	conduct our cross-examination at the hearing with
3	the goal of satisfying the positions that we've
4	taken, such that the Commission would be able to
5	render a bench decision, if that would be your
6	desire. And it would be our goal to work to that.
7	So, it is our expectation and hope although
8	we don't know for sure how the hearing will
9	transpire, that's how we intend to to to
10	work.
11	MR. WAHLEN: And Tampa Electric would endorse
12	that approach. We're going to do our part, too.
13	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay.
14	MR. TRIERWEILER: Your Honor, staff
15	appreciates hearing that and especially appreciates
16	the timely heads-up. Other otherwise, it might
17	induce a significant emotional event because staff
18	has certain requirements it has to perform in order
19	to prepare for a bench vote.
20	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Well, what we've heard
21	is the intentions and desires and also the
22	indication that a bench vote is not a certainty.
23	Given that it's not a certainty, let's look at
24	Section 13 in the the order, as presented today.
25	And I'll ask if there are any comments or concerns.

1	What we see here is a a number of dates,
2	word limits and such, recognizing that we don't
3	wish to go this way, but any
4	MR. WAHLEN: We're perfectly fine with that.
5	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Anything to offer
6	there? Is this acceptable to the parties or do we
7	need to
8	MR. REHWINKEL: Commissioner
9	MR. WAHLEN: Fine fine with Tampa Electric.
10	MR. REHWINKEL: Yeah, to the extent brief
11	would be required, this is adequate for for our
12	purposes, if we have to write one. So, we we
13	appreciate and are in concurrence with these
14	standards and limitations.
15	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. Very good. I
16	appreciate that acknowledgment.
17	So, moving on, looking at Section 14,
18	rulings and perhaps perhaps I need some
19	advice here. Where where other than what's
20	written in in the order, as we have it today
21	we've got opening statements at five minutes, which
22	we've already discussed.
23	And then, staff, what what do we have
24	remaining that I think we've already talked
25	about

1	MR. TRIERWEILER: Commissioner
2	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: a couple of these
3	things.
4	MR. TRIERWEILER: That's that is correct,
5	Commissioner. We also have the rulings on witness
6	summaries. Witnesses shall be given under five
7	minutes to present their summaries at the hearing.
8	And hearing exhibits parties must bring at least
9	20 copies of all exhibits they wish to introduce at
10	hearing.
11	Parties, are there any other rulings that you
12	need to
13	MR. WAHLEN: Just a clarification on that
14	the the 20 copies for exhibits is that for
15	exhibits that are not already identified on the
16	comprehensive exhibit list; just additional
17	exhibits? Or do you want us to bring 20 copies of
18	each of our prefiled exhibits?
19	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: This would be anything
20	to be introduced at hearing.
21	MR. WAHLEN: Okay. Very well. Okay.
22	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Staff, do we do you
23	have that same understanding?
24	MR. TRIERWEILER: We concur.
25	MR. WAHLEN: Okay.

1	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Yeah, the comprehensive
2	items
3	MR. WAHLEN: would be included. Okay.
4	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: are are included.
5	Anything you're going to introduce at hearing,
6	we're asking for 20 copies
7	MR. WAHLEN: Sure.
8	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: so that everybody
9	everybody at hearing will have access to the
10	material.
11	MR. WAHLEN: That's that's what I thought.
12	I just wanted to make sure I understood.
13	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you for the
14	question.
15	MR. REHWINKEL: And Commissioner, with respect
16	to opening statements, we would intend to make one
17	that would be less than five minutes. So, that is
18	more than enough time. And we will endeavor to
19	make it much shorter than that.
20	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. That would be
21	appreciated, so
22	MR. WAHLEN: Same for Tampa Electric.
23	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: To the utility we
24	have concurrence with with five minutes. Very
25	good. So, we have five minutes for opening

1	statements.
2	We have up to five minutes for the witness
3	summaries.
4	And exhibits introduced at hearing, 20 copies
5	to to ensure that everyone has the material in
6	front of them.
7	I think we've we've covered what we've
8	discussed here today. We have unless there's
9	something else under that section, we're looking at
10	other matters.
11	Other than the issue with FIPUG, is there
12	anything any other matters the parties wish to
13	bring forward here?
14	MR. WAHLEN: Tampa Electric has no other
15	matters.
16	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: All right.
17	MR. REHWINKEL: None from the Public Counsel.
18	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay.
19	MR. TRIERWEILER: Your Commissioner, staff
20	would remind all parties that, to the extent
21	parties' positions change or are added, due to
22	discussion at the pre-hearing conference, that they
23	provide any such changes to staff by close of
24	business, 5:00 p.m., which is today, April 26th,
25	2018. This is required to issue a timely pre-

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1 hearing order. 2 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. So, we're clear 3 on the deadline for that. 4 We also have -- we have a deadline for something else, Mr. Trierweiler. Remind me what 5 6 that -- that was a May 1st --7 MR. TRIERWEILER: May 1st was a -- an 8 identification of any objections to the --9 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: That was --10 MR. TRIERWEILER: Of the exhibit list --11 Exhibit list. COMMISSIONER POLMANN: 12 you. 13 MR. TRIERWEILER: -- or a stipulation to the 14 And we've already received a stipulation --15 or --16 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. 17 MR. TRIERWEILER: -- from TECO. 18 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Very good. 19 MR. REHWINKEL: Commissioner Polmann --20 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: 21 MR. REHWINKEL: -- I just want to report, I 22 have not heard from Mr. Moyle by -- on my -- my 23 device, my phone. 24 If -- if I could offer a suggestion, is 25 that -- that, on his behalf, I would ask that you

1	take under advisement his ability to demonstrate
2	good cause shown. And perhaps, it could be
3	addressed at the start of the hearing, whether he
4	showed good cause to not make it here today.
5	It's un it's very unusual for Jon not
6	to to make a hearing like this. In the years
7	I've known him, he never has. So, something must
8	have come up.
9	And I I think it I would ask, on his
10	behalf, that he be given opportunity to make that
11	showing and and you take it under advisement
12	and and deal with it before the start of the
13	hearing, as far as whether he's eligible to
14	participate in the hearing throughout.
15	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Well, thank you for
16	for those remarks.
17	MR. WAHLEN: Tampa Electric doesn't has no
18	problem with that procedure.
19	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay.
20	MR. WAHLEN: No objection to that procedure.
21	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: So, no objection from
22	the utility.
23	MR. WAHLEN: That procedure
24	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Comments from
25	MR. WAHLEN: would be fine.

1	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: staff or
2	Ms. Gervasi?
3	MS. GERVASI: Commissioner, that sounds
4	reasonable. And particularly, since his positions
5	are identical to OPC's positions, and TECO does not
6	object, I don't see that any party would be
7	prejudiced by that approach.
8	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. Can we let me
9	just ask this, as a matter of procedure: Would we
10	memorialize that in in pre-hearing order? Is
11	that I'm just asking. I simply I simply
12	don't know.
13	MS. GERVASI: I think it would be taken up as
14	a preliminary matter at the hearing. I don't know
15	that it needs to be memorialized in the pre-hearing
16	order. I think it's fine
17	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: I'm fine either way.
18	I'm simply just asking.
19	MS. GERVASI: Yeah, I don't think it's
20	necessary.
21	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: It's on the record here
22	as a matter of discussion.
23	MS. GERVASI: Right.
24	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: How how do we
25	provide notice to Mr. Movle?

1	MS. GERVASI: I'm sure we'll be letting him
2	know.
3	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. Okay. All
4	right. So, we've dispensed with that. Is that
5	everybody is satisfied that that's been covered?
6	MR. WAHLEN: Yes, sir.
7	MR. REHWINKEL: Yes, I've been practicing here
8	for 32 years. I've never had this happen. So,
9	we're kind of winging it, so
10	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Very good. As long as
11	everyone is comfortable that that it's been
12	addressed, I'll just leave it at that.
13	MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you.
14	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. Staff, do we
15	have any any other matters at this time? We're
16	close to the end here. I think this is our last
17	shot, so
18	MR. TRIERWEILER: No, staff has no additional
19	matters, Your Commissioner.
20	MR. WAHLEN: I would just like to thank the
21	staff and and the Office of Public Counsel for
22	working cooperatively and diligently to help us
23	prepare a good draft pre-hearing order. I think
24	all the work paid off today, and really appreciate
25	the effort by everybody involved.

1	MR. REHWINKEL: I want to echo that. I
2	thought we had a very smooth plan until this
3	wrinkle came up, but your staff did a good job
4	of of making this making this work behind the
5	scenes. And we appreciate it. Thank you.
6	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Well, thank you for
7	those comments. I actually would echo those. I
8	think staff has done a great job. I'm it's gone
9	very smoothly from my office, and been a great
10	help.
11	So, I've I know of no issues, no no
12	difficulty with the parties and I I thank you
13	for your efforts. This has gone very well and I
14	look forward to the next steps.
15	Seeing no additional matters before us today,
16	I thank everybody for being here. And I believe
17	we'll we'll come to conclusion with Mr. Moyle.
18	I I would say, at this time, the pre-hearing is
19	adjourned. Thank you.
20	MR. WAHLEN: Thank you.
21	MR. BEASLEY: Thank you.
22	MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you.
