This ensures that the district is added to the Official List. Resolutions dissolving districts should also be forwarded to the Department in order to assist us in maintaining accurate records.

INDEPENDENT - A Special District that is not a Dependent Special District as outlined above. A District that includes more than one (1) county is an Independent Special District. Community Development Districts, created under Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, are also Independent Districts.

**INACTIVE** - The Special District Information Program has received confirmation that the District exists but is currently not functioning. (This does not mean that the formal process for declaring a district inactive, pursuant to Section 189.4044, Florida Statutes, has been initiated.)

UNKNOWN - The Special District Information Program has been unable to contact the District OR the District has failed to respond to requests for information made by the Special District Information Program.

DISSOLVED - The enabling legislation of the Special District has been repealed or the governing board has been abolished.

#### AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this <u>Osteday</u> of <u>October</u>, 1974, between HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as HILLSBOROUGH; PASCO COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as PASCO; PINELLAS COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as PINELLAS; CITY OF ST. PETERSBURG, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as ST. PETERSBURG; and CITY OF TAMPA, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as TAMPA.

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties hereto, pursuant to the provisions of Section 7 of Chapter 74-114, Laws of Florida, 1974, and to the provisions of Section 163.01, Florida Statutes, wish to set forth certain agreements among themselves respecting the creation of a regional water supply authority; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized by the parties hereto that the water needs of their citizens can best be met by vesting water supply functions in such an authority whose prime function shall be to supply water; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the parties hereto that the cost of the water and services to be provided by the authority shall be financed insofar as possible through revenues derived from the sale of water; and

WHEREAS, it is further the intent of the parties hereto that, during the course of implementation and performance of the functions, duties and responsibilities of the authority, the rights of the property owners and inhabitants of the area of origin to the water reasonably required to supply adequately their reasonable needs shall be preserved and protected; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the parties hereto that nothing herein shall be construed to preclude the various municipalities and counties from continuing to operate water production and transmission facilities for the purpose of meeting their respective needs for dependable and adequate supplies of water; and

WHEREAS, it is the finding of the parties hereto that cooperative efforts are mandatory in order to meet the water needs of the rapidly urbanizing areas in a manner which will provide adequate and dependable supplies of water where needed without resulting in adverse effects upon the areas from which the water is withdrawn. Such efforts should utilize all practical means of obtaining water, including but not limited to withdrawals of surface water and ground water, recycling of waste water and desalinization and will necessitate not only cooperation but also well coordinated activities; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the parties that the authority shall design, construct, operate and maintain facilities in the locations and at the times necessary to insure that an adequate water supply will be available to all citizens within the authority.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The parties hereto do hereby create (and incorporate) a regional water supply authority pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 74-114, Laws of Florida, 1974, to be known as the WEST COAST REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY AUTHORITY, hereinafter referred to as AUTHORITY, to be comprised of the area described and shown in Exhibit A, for the purpose of developing regional water supplies and supplying water at wholesale to counties and municipalities, which shall constitute a special district under the laws of the State of Florida, and as such, a separate and independent governmental entity.
  - 2. The AUTHORITY shall have the following powers and duties:
    - To have perpetual succession;
- b. To adopt a corporate seal and alter it at pleasure;
  - c. To take by grant, purchase, bequest, eminent domain as authorized, devise or lease, and to hold, enjoy, lease, sell or otherwise dispose of, any and all real and personal property necessary or convenient to the full exercise of its powers; also to acquire, construct or operate, control and use any and all works, facilities and means necessary or convenient to the full exercise of its powers, and to do and perform any and all things necessary or convenient to the full exercise of the powers herein granted;

- d. To maintain an office at such place or -places within the territorial boundaries of the AUTHORITY as it may designate;
- e. To employ and to compensate such personnel, consultants, and technical and professional assistants as it shall deem necessary to exercise the powers and perform the duties set forth in this agreement;
- f. To accept and receive, utilize or expend, in furtherance of its functions, funds, grants, and services from the federal government or its agencies, from departments, agencies and instrumentalities of state, municipal, county, or other local governments, or from private or civic sources;
- g. To invest any surplus money in the AUTHORITY treasury, including such money in any sinking or other fund established for the purpose of providing for the payment of the principal or interest of any bonded or other indebtedness or for any other purpose, not required for the immediate necessities of the district, in its own bonds, or in treasury notes, or bonds, of the United States, or of this state, and such investment may be made by direct purchase of any issue of such bonds or treasury notes, or part thereof, at the original sale of the same, or by the subsequent purchase of such bonds or treasury notes. Any bonds or treasury notes thus purchased and held may from time to time, be sold and the proceeds reinvested in bonds or treasury notes thus purchased

and held shall, from time to time, be made in season so that the proceeds may be applied to the purposes for which the money, with which the bonds or treasury notes were originally purchased, were placed in the treasury of the AUTHORITY. The functions and duties authorized by this paragraph shall be performed by joint action of the Comptroller and Treasurer, with the approval of the attorney, under such rules and regulations as shall be prescribed by the board of directors of the AUTHORITY.

- h. To adopt rules of procedure for the regulation of its affairs and the conduct of its business.
- i. To receive and use such technical assistance as shall be from time to time made available for its use by any county or municipality in the AUTHORITY.
- j. To have and exercise such powers as are reasonably implied herefrom and necessary and proper to carry out the objectives and purposes of the AUTHORITY.
- k. Without in any way limiting the foregoing, to exercise and perform all powers and duties set forth in Section 7 of Chapter 74-114, Laws of Florida, 1974, as fully as though set forth herein.
- 3. All powers, privileges and duties vested in or imposed upon the AUTHORITY shall be exercised and performed by and through a board of directors; provided, however, that the exercise of any and all executive, administrative and ministerial powers may be by said board of directors delegated and redelegated to any of the offices created hereby or by the board of directors acting hereunder.

The board of directors shall consist of one representative of each party hereto. Such representatives shall serve without compensation from the AUTHORITY, except that they may be reimbursed their reasonable expenses incurred in performing their duties hereunder. One representative shall be designated and appointed by the governing body of each of the parties to this Agreement and shall serve at the pleasure of his or her respective governing body. As a member of the board of directors, each representative shall be entitled to one vote on all questions, orders, and resolutions coming before the board. The affirmative votes of members representing more than fifty (50) percent of the total number of votes of all the members shall be necessary and, except as otherwise herein provided, shall be sufficient to carry any question, order or resolution coming before the board of directors. Members of the first board of directors so constituted shall convene within thirty (30) days of the date of the full execution of this Agreement by all of the parties hereto, and immediately upon convening, such board of directors shall elect from its membership a chairman and a vice chairman, each of whom shall serve for a term of one year, or until their respective successors shall be elected and qualified. Such offices shall be filled by an election annually thereafter. The board of directors shall have power:

a. To fix the time and place or places at which its regular meetings shall be held, and shall provide for the calling and holding of special meetings.

- b. To make and pass rules, regulations, resolutions and orders not repugnant to the Constitution of the United States or of the State of Florida, or to the provisions of Chapter 74-114, Laws of Florida, 1974, or this agreement, necessary for the government and management of the affairs of the AUTHORITY, for the execution of the powers vested in the AUTHORITY and for carrying into effect the provisions of this agreement and for providing terms and conditions under which additional parties may join the AUTHORITY pursuant to Section 7(6) of Chapter 74-114, Laws of Florida, 1974.
- c. To fix the location of the principal place of business of the AUTHORITY and the location of all offices and departments maintained hereunder.
- d. To prescribe by resolution a system of business administration and to create any and all necessary offices which shall include the offices of Comptroller, Secretary and Treasurer and to establish and re-establish the powers and duties and compensation of all officers and employees and to require and fix the amount of all official bonds necessary for the protection of the funds and property of the AUTHORITY.
  - e. To delegate and re-delegate by resolution to officers of the AUTHORITY power to employ clerical, legal and engineering assistants and labor; under such conditions and restrictions as shall be fixed by the directors.
  - f. To prescribe a method of auditing and allowing or rejecting claims and demands; also to prescribe methods for

the construction of works and for the letting of contracts or furnishings of labor, materials or supplies, required for the carrying out of any of the purposes of this act; provided that in cases where work if not to be done by the AUTHORITY, itself and the amount involved shall be five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), or more, the board of directors shall provide for the letting of contracts to the lowest and best responsible bidder, after publication of notices inviting bids, subject to the right of said board to reject any and all proposals; provided further, that contracts in writing or otherwise, may be let without advertising for or inviting bids, when any repairs, alterations or other work, or the purchase of materials, supplies, equipment or other property, shall be deemed by the board of directors to be of urgent necessity, and shall be authorized by a two-thirds vote thereof.

g. To fix the rate or rates at which water shall be sold in accordance with Section 7(2)(b) of Chapter 74-114, Laws of Florida, 1974. Such rates shall be uniform for like classes of service throughout the AUTHORITY.

#### Budget.

a. The fiscal year of the AUTHORITY shall extend from October 1 of each year through September 30 of the following year. Except as hereinafter provided in paragraph 5 b., the board of directors shall during the month of July of each year complete the preparation of a tentative budget for the AUTHORITY covering its proposed operation and requirements for the ensuing fiscal year.

- During the month of July and following the preparation of a tentative budget the board of directors shall publish a notice of its intention to adopt the budget. Additionally, the board of directors shall provide copies of the tentative budget to the parties and said tentative budget shall be accompanied by the estimated annual contribution of each of the counties, as provided in paragraph 5 below. The notice shall set forth the tentative budget in full, and shall be notice to all owners of property subject to the AUTHORITY taxes that on a date and at a place appearing in the notice, opportunity will be afforded to such owners, their attorneys or agents, to appear before the board and show their objections to the budget. The notice shall be published once a week for two consecutive weeks, in any newspaper qualified to accept legal advertisements, in each county in the AUTHORITY, the last insertion of which shall appear not less than one week prior to the date set by the board for the hearing on the budget.
  - c. The hearing will be by and before the board of directors. The board of directors shall give consideration to objections filed against the budget and in its discretion may amend, modify or change the tentative budget. The board shall by August 15 following adopt a final budget for the AUTHORITY which shall thereupon be the operating and fiscal guide for the AUTHORITY for the ensuing year.
    - 5. Funding.
      - a. For a period not to exceed five (5) fiscal years

from the date of this Agreement each county which is a party hereto agrees to contribute annually to the AUTHORITY; provided that the annual contribution of any county shall not exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) without the consent of such contributing county. The annual contribution shall be determined by the following formula:

- A = Amount of County Taxable Value as shown on the Final Recapitulation of the Ad Valorem Rolls for the previous year as filed with the Florida Department of Revenue
- B = Total of County Taxable Value of all Counties which are parties to the Agreement
- C = Amount of funds designated by the Board of Directors to be derived from counties

### Contribution = $\frac{A}{B} \times C$

- b. The parties hereto adopt the budget, attached as Exhibit B, in the amount of Two Hundred Twenty-Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$228,960.00) as its final budget for fiscal year 1974-75.
- 6. HILLSBOROUGH hereby affirms that, at a duly constituted meeting of the Board of County Commissioners on the Richard of Lipture , 1974, it approved the terms of this Agreement and the execution thereof by HILLSBOROUGH.
- 7. PASCO hereby affirms that, at a duly constituted meeting of the Board of County Commissioners on the Scuday of County Commissioners on the Scuday of Agreement and the execution thereof by PASCO.

#### EXHIBIT A

### AREA OF THE WEST COAST REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY AUTHORITY

The area of the authority shall consist of all of Hillsborough County, Pasco County and Pinellas County, and is more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the southeast corner of Section 36, Township 32 South, Range 22 East, for a Point of Beginning (P.O.B.). Said P.O.B. is the intersection of the range line between Range 22 East and Range 23 East and the township line between Township 32 South and Township 33 South and also is the southeast corner of Hillsborough County, Florida.

- From the P.O.B. run westerly on the township line between Township 32 South and Township 33 South to the south bank of Tampa Bay;
- Thence in a direct line to a point midway between Eqmont and Passage Keys in the Gulf of Mexico;
- Thence westerly to the western boundary of the jurisdictional waters of the State of Florida;
- 4. Thence northerly on the western boundary of the jurisdictional waters of the State of Florida to the point where the township line dividing Township 23 South and Township 24 South intersects with said western boundary;
- Thence easterly along the township line dividing Township 23 South and Township 24 South to the range line dividing Range 20 East and Range 21 East;

Thence northerly along the range line dividing Pange 20 East and Range 21 East to the Northwest corner of Section 19, Township 23 South, Range 21 East; Thence easterly along the section line dividing Section 19 and Section 18 of Township 23 South, Range 21 East to the range line dividing Range 22 East and Range 23 East; Thence southerly along the range line dividing Range 22 East and Range 23 East to the township line dividing Township 25 South and Township 26 South; 9. # FOR THE WEST COAST REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY AUTHORITY'S

REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM

#### BACKGROUND

#### The West Coast Regional Water Supply Authority (Authority)

On October 24, 1974, following enactment of enabling legislation by the Florida Legislature, a five-party agreement creating the Authority became effective. The five parties to the agreement include Hillsborough County, Pasco County, Pinellas County, and the Cities of St. Petersburg and Tampa. Location of the Authority's service area is shown in Figure 1. Each of the five entities appoints one representative to the Authority's Board of Directors. The purpose of the Authority is to insure that there is an adequate and dependable supply to meet the potable water needs of the area, to allow optimum economic resource development, and to protect the environment to the maximum extent.

One of the first objectives of the Authority was to accurately project the future water needs of the Authority members and to develop plans for meeting those needs. A comprehensive study was authorized during 1976 and was completed in 1978, culminating in a report entitled "Comprehensive Study of the Regional Water Supply Needs and Sources (1980 to 2020)". This and subsequent reports have provided guidelines for implementation of water supply development plans since that time. A 1982 update report was completed which incorporated adjustments in water demand projections, additional information regarding water supply sources, and increased consideration of water conservation measures. During 1986, the report was updated again in order to develop plans to meet new regional water supply needs with projections based on the most recent population, water consumption and water supply data. This report also established a revised plan for meeting near-term regional water needs through 1995 with long range projections through 2020.

The Authority has grown over the past 18 years from an annual budget of \$229,000 and no customers to an annual 0&M budget of \$25,000,000, assets of \$163,000,000, and a wholesale customer base of 114 million gallons per average day (MGD), supplying water to over one million residents of the Tampa Bay area. The Authority is staffed with 93 employees, who operate and maintain the over 100 miles of transmission main, 77 production wells, four pumping stations, 20 million gallons of storage and an environmental laboratory which comprise the physical assets of the Authority.

#### HISTORY OF FACILITY DEVELOPMENT

The Authority's facilities are comprised of a combination of wellfields, transmission mains, and pumping stations located throughout the tricounty area. The Authority has operated water supply facilities continuously since 1977 when the Cypress Creek Wellfield, Pumping Station and Transmission Mains were sold to the Authority by Pinellas County and St. Petersburg. The Authority's Cross Bar Ranch project was completed in 1980 and during the same year, the Authority took over the management of the Section 21 and Cosme/Odessa Wellfields. The Starkey Phase I and Northwest Hillsborough Wellfields were completed in 1983 and 1985 respectively. The South Central Hillsborough Regional Wellfield, pump station and transmission mains and Cypress Bridge interim Wellfield were completed in 1988, followed by completion of the Starkey Phase II expansion in 1989, construction of the Northwest Hillsborough Interim Pump Station in 1990 and the Tampa Bypass Canal Pump Station in 1991. Combined, these supply facilities have a rated capacity of 302 MGD as permitted by the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD). Details of the facilities, including age, capacity and capital costs are presented in Table 1.

#### HISTORY OF ANNUAL AND OTHER COSTS BUDGETED TO FUND FACILITY DEVELOPMENT

The facilities identified in Table 1 have been financed by a wide range of methods including pay-as-you-go, cash contribution by participating member, short term bank loans, lines of credit, and revenue bonds. Costs for each facility's construction have been secured with a revenue-type "take or pay" agreement. Table 2 provides a summary of the basic agreement, participating members, and the type of financing used for the major facilities of the Authority.

Along with the growth in capital facilities, the Authority has experienced growth in the number of personnel needed to operate and maintain the wellfields, and has experienced increases in the budgeted costs necessary to operate, maintain and perform renewal and replacement as needed. Table 3 provides a summary of annual budgets including a general comparison to those historic activities of the Authority.

#### EXISTING AUTHORITY FACILITIES WITHIN THE PROPOSED REGIONAL (GRID) SYSTEM

#### Cypress Creek/Cross Bar Water System

The Cypress Creek Water System (CCWS) was constructed by Pinellas County and the City of St. Petersburg in the 1970's to meet the municipal demands for potable water on the Pinellas County peninsula that exceeded locally available fresh groundwater resources. The CCWS includes the Cypress Creek Wellfield (CCWF), located on 4,900 acres in Central Pasco County, Florida (13 wells currently permitted at a combined 30 million gallons per day average and 40 million gallons per day maximum by the Southwest Florida Water Management District) the Cypress Creek Pumping Station (CCPS; currently rated a firm capacity of 120 million gallons per day (mgd) and located at the CCWF) and the 84"/66" Cypress Creek

Transmission Main (CCTM). On November 22, 1976 the Authority entered into an agreement with the City of St. Petersburg and Pinellas County that assigned the operation and maintenance responsibilities of the Cypress Creek Wellfield, Pumping Station and Transmission Main to the Authority commencing in 1977. This arrangement for operation and maintenance of the CCWS was reaffirmed by the parties in 1989. Subsequent to this construction program, Pinellas County entered into agreements in 1977 and 1979 with the Authority to construct, operate and maintain the Cross Bar Ranch Wellfield (17 wells on 8,100 acres in North Central Pasco County and currently permitted at a combined 30 mgd average, 45 mgd maximum) which is conveyed to the County by way of the CCPS and CCTM.

The CCTM transports disinfected, stabilized and pressurized water from the CCPS to the Pinellas County Water System and the City of St. Petersburg's Cosme Water Treatment Plant. Construction of the CCTM began in January, 1974 and was completed May, 1975, and immediately began supplying water to Pinellas County and the City of St. Petersburg. The pipeline extends approximately 17 miles along an abandoned railroad right-of-way from the CCPS to the Pinellas/Pasco County line. Approximately 12 miles of the CCTM leaving the pump station is 84 inches in diameter, sized to convey 130 million gallons per day. The remaining 5 miles of the CCTM is 66-inches in diameter, sized to convey 80 million gallons per day. The 84-inch transmission main was jointly constructed by Pinellas County and the City of St. Petersburg. The 66-inch main was constructed by Pinellas County. Ownership, operation and maintenance of the CCTM, CCPS and CCWF were transferred to the Authority in 1977.

#### Northwest Hillsborough Regional Wellfield

The Northwest Hillsborough Regional Wellfield, owned and managed by the Authority, was developed under a contract executed in 1981 with Hillsborough County. The wellfield was developed in order to meet the municipal demands for potable water in northwest Hillsborough County. This facility includes seven 3 mgd production wells on one acre sites and raw water piping with a permitted production capacity of 18.4 mgd. The regional wellfield has been in operation since 1985.

#### Northwest Hillsborough Interim Pump Station

The Northwest Hillsborough Interim Pump Station, completed in 1990, provides disinfection by chlorination for up to 5 mgd to the County's utility system during peak demands, using raw water from the Northwest Regional Wellfield. This facility will be retired from service and replaced with the County's new Sheldon Road Pump Station upon completion of the Regional System Phase I

#### OTHER EXISTING AUTHORITY WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES

The Authority is responsible for providing potable water supply sources for more than one million people. Those facilities managed, owned, and/or operated by the Authority are shown on Figure 2 and include the

#### following:

Starkey Wellfield - located to the west of the Cypress Creek Wellfield in Pasco County on approximately 8,000 acres. The wellfield consists of 14 wells with a permitted production capacity of 25 mgd. The Authority entered into a contract with the City of New Port Richey and Pasco County in 1981 to construct, operate and maintain the facility.

North Pasco Wellfield - located on 104 acres in Northwest Pasco County is a raw water supply, which will initiate delivery of water to New Port Richey and Pasco County Water Treatment Plants by Spring 1992. The water supply agreement for this facility was executed in January, 1990 by Pasco County, New Port Richey and the Authority. The wellfield will be developed in three phases (two wells per phase), ultimately consisting of six 4 mgd production wells and approximately 8 miles of 36" raw water piping with a permitted capacity of 16.1 mgd. Completion of the final phase is anticipated in 1996.

Section 21 and Cosme Odessa Wellfields - managed by the Authority under a contract executed in 1980 with the City of St. Petersburg. Section 21 Wellfield includes 6 wells on 640 acres in northwest Hillsborough County. The wells have an average permitted production of 13 mgd. The Cosme Odessa Wellfield includes 23 wells with an average permitted production capacity of 13 mgd. These wellfields continue to be owned, operated and maintained by the City.

South Central Hillsborough Wellfield - constructed, owned and managed by the Authority under contract executed in 1981 with Hillsborough County. The wellfield includes 17-4 mgd production wells and 74,000 LF of 16"-54" prestressed concrete and ductile iron raw water piping with a permitted production capacity of 45 mgd. The regional wellfield has been in operation since 1987, and was fully completed in 1988.

<u>Lithia Pump Station</u> - constructed by the Authority under contract with Hillsborough County, executed in 1981. The pump station, completed in 1988, which is operated by Hillsborough County utilities, receives water from the South Central Hillsborough Wellfield. It is equipped with two five-million gallon ground storage reservoirs and five 400-900 Hp high service pumps with a combined peak production capacity of 60 mgd. The water is treated for hydrogen sulfide removal, ph control and disinfection. Standby power is available for operation of three of five pumps at the pump station during power outages.

South County Transmission Mains - constructed by the Authority under contract with Hillsborough County in 1981. This pipeline supplies water from the Lithia Pump Station to communities in south Hillsborough County including Brandon, Ruskin, Riverview, Sun City, and Apollo Beach. This facility consists of approximately 60,000 feet of 42-inch prestressed cylindrical concrete pipe (PCCP), 29,000 feet of 36-inch ductile iron pipe (DIP), and 27,000 feet of 24-inch DIP.

Tampa Bypass Canal - a raw surface water supply permitted at 40 mgd

capacity and utilized for augmentation of the Hillsborough River Reservoir. The Authority installed and operated temporary facilities in the years 1981, 1985, 1989, 1990 and 1991 under a contract executed in 1985 with the City of Tampa. The Authority constructed a permanent facility for pumping water into the Hillsborough River which began operating in November, 1991. This facility includes three-150 Hp submersible pumps each rated at 20 mgd.

Northeast Brandon Wellfield - an existing raw water supply consisting of 5 production wells. Hillsborough County is entitled to receive a maximum daily supply of 4.1 mgd from this wellfield as stipulated by the 8th amendment to the 1981 water supply contract between Hillsborough County and the Authority.

Central Hillsborough Transmission Main - a proposed transmission main that will connect the Regional Water Supply System to a delivery point north of the Northeast Brandon Wellfield as per the 8th amendment to the 1981 water supply contract between Hillsborough County and the Authority. Design of the transmission main is scheduled to begin in 1992 and is tentatively comprised of 10 miles of 36" pipe.

#### REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM - THE PROJECT

#### General

The proposed Regional Water Supply System (Figure 3) includes 76 miles of transmission mains of various diameters, a 40-million gallon per day capacity wellfield, a 50 million gallon per day pump station, 10 million gallons of storage and interconnects with all five member governments' water supply systems. The project is proposed to accomplish two goals, namely: 1) new water supply, and 2) construction of a regional "grid" system of transmission lines. Both goals of this project represent years of detailed planning efforts.

In 1986, the Authority's Board of Directors adopted the conceptual 2020 Needs and Sources Master Plan which proposed several elements of the Regional System including:

- A new source of supply between the existing Cypress Creek and Morris Bridge Wellfields (Cypress Bridge Wellfield) to meet the increased water needs in Pasco, Hillsborough and Pinellas Counties, including interconnects between the Cypress Bridge, Cypress Creek and Cross Bar Ranch Wellfields to establish system emergency capacity as a long range goal of the regional system in concert with construction of the new water supply facilities.
- o Transmission mains westward from the new Cypress Bridge Wellfield to connection points for Hillsborough County at the Lake Park Pump Station initially, and in the long-term for St. Petersburg at the City's Cosme Water Treatment Plant (WTP), and for Pinellas County at the S.K. Keller WTP.

#### New Water Supply

Conceptual planning for the Cypress Bridge Wellfield began as early as 1982 with the identification of the corridor between Cypress Creek and Tampa's Morris Bridge Wellfield as a suitable alternative for future water supply. The area encompassing the Cypress Bridge Wellfield is characterized by a few existing agricultural operations in transition to primarily large scale residential development. The area is targeted for development over the next two decades as growth along the I-75 corridor continues to occur in Central Pasco County.

The Authority applied for a consumptive use permit from the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) in 1986, and initiated a drilling and testing program to determine aquifer characteristics for design of a full scale wellfield consisting of up to eleven (11) wells. At the same time, Pasco County and the Authority entered into negotiations for the installation of interim production wells in the area to meet the immediate public supply needs of developments in Central Pasco County. Contract negotiations were completed in June 1988 which approved the construction of three (3) full-size production wells, two (2) of which (CY-5 and CY-7) were equipped with 1.5 mgd, pumps, hydropneumatic tanks, chlorine disinfection and sodium hydroxide chemical feed systems for immediate public use. These public supply wells came on line in September 1988 after the SWFWMD granted the Authority a Temporary Water Use Permit for the interim wells. A consumptive use permit for all eleven wells was approved by the SWFWMD in June 1990 for 8 mgd annual average and 25 mgd maximum day.

The need for the Cypress Bridge Wellfield, and future supply expensions to meet the long-term needs of the tri-county area, are shown in Table 4, which provides an accounting of all member potable water demands and sources needed to meet those demands.

#### Regional Grid System

The development of a Regional Grid System, envisioned in the 1986 Needs & Sources as a long-term desirable goal for the Authority's members, was hastened to the forefront by the June, 1987 outage of the existing 84-inch portion of the 84-inch and 66-inch Cypress Creek Transmission Main (CCTM).

The 1987 outage of the CCTM caused the Authority's Board to take the following actions: a lawsuit (filed in 1988) against the manufacturer of the portion of the 84-inch and all of the 66-inch pipeline (the other manufacturer which made the rest of the 84-inch pipe was not sued), the pipeline's designer and installing contractor; and a request to the Authority staff to expedite the implementation of a regional grid system. The intent of expedition of the grid (or loop) system was to ensure that the facilities which were to be constructed with the Cypress Bridge Wellfield and transmission main would be sized at the appropriate diameter (i.e. capacity) to meet the region's long-term needs in a cost

effective manner.

At a Board workshop in November, 1990 it was determined by the Board that the optimum solution would be achieved only when the proposed system included the replacement of the defective portions of the 84" and 66" CCTM in addition to construction of the remainder of the loop. The loop would create two independent supply pipelines to each member. The Board further directed that a Technical Advisory Committee, comprised of the Utility Director of each member government, be established to assist Authority staff by reporting to the General Manager, who was charged with developing a revised system recommendation to the Board.

After several committee meetings beginning in December, 1990, the committee developed an approach to the Regional Grid System, which was proposed at the Board's February, 1991 meeting. The committee recommended the following two significant grid system components:

- The system would be developed in three phases over a period of approximately ten years, (see Figure 3) with the first phase intended to meet each member's most critical needs, including replacement of the defective portions of the CCTM all the way to Pinellas County's S.K. Keller WTP, interconnection with Tampa's Morris Bridge Wellfield, St. Petersburg's Cosme Wellfield and WTP, Hillsborough County's Sheldon Road WTP, and the West Pasco Service Areas.
- The system would allow Pasco County, Pinellas County, St.
  Petersburg and Tampa to pump into the Grid System from existing wellfields owned by the members including the Tampa's Morris Bridge facility, Pinellas County's Eldridge Wilde Wellfield and St. Petersburg's Cosme-Odessa, Section 21 and South Pasco Wellfields. The ability for members to pump into the system, increases the maximum day permitted regional system capacity by 175 mgd, to a total interconnected average day water supply of over 300 mgd including the Authority's existing water supply facilities namely, the Cypress Creek, Cross Bar, Northwest Hillsborough, and the new Cypress Bridge Wellfields.

The Board adopted the Advisory Committee's proposal in June, 1991 when the draft Regional Water Supply Contract was approved. The contract itself establishes a common pool of existing water supply, pumping, and transmission facilities operated by the Authority at Cross Bar Ranch, Cypress Creek and Northwest Hillsborough County to be combined with the new Regional facilities. The purpose of the common pool is to enable all participating members to share equity in these existing facilities as well as the Cypress Bridge Wellfield and future system expansions.

#### Phase I

Construct the Cypress Bridge Wellfield which will consist of up to eleven production wells, currently permitted to produce a combined supply of 8.0 mgd (annual average), 25.0 mgd (maximum), and 57,000 feet of 16"-42" raw water piping. Ultimate capacity of the wellfield is estimated to be 40 mgd (maximum).

- Construct the Lake Bridge Pump Station which will store and treat raw supply from the Cypress Bridge Wellfield and pressurize water for injection into the loop system. The pump station will have ten million gallons of storage and a pumping/treatment capacity of 50 mgd.
- Construct the Cypress Bridge Transmission Main which will be approximately 54,000 ft. of 66-inch pipeline connecting the Cypress Creek and Lake Bridge Pump Stations.
- construct the Western End Loop Transmission Main which will consist of approximately 42,000 feet of 66-inch pipeline extending from the Odessa Intertie, westward along State Route 54, south along the east boundary of Section 33, Township 26S, Range 17E, then west along the Hillsborough/Pasco County line and then south to the S.K. Keller pump station.
- o Construct the Gunn Highway Loop Transmission Main which consists of approximately 11,000 feet of 72-inch pipeline extending from the Lutz-Lake Fern Road/Gunn Highway intersection to the southeast corner of Section 33, Township 26S, Range 17E.
- Construct the Gunn Highway Feeder Transmission Main which is approximately 30,000 feet of 48-inch pipeline along Gunn Highway from Lutz-Lake Fern Road south to the Cosme Water Treatment Plant.
- Construct the West Pasco Interconnect which is approximately 21,000 feet of 24-inch pipeline from S.R. 54/Odessa westward to connect with the County's water system.
- Replace the Interpace 84-inch line which is approximately 35,000 feet in length.
- Construct the Morris Bridge Interconnect which is approximately 26,000 feet of 36-inch pipeline from the Lake Bridge Pump Station to the Morris Bridge Water Treatment Plant.
- Construct the Sheldon Road Interconnect which is approximately 7,000 feet of 30-inch pipeline from Northwest Hillsborough Wellfield to the Sheldon Road Water Treatment Plant.

#### Phase II

- Construct the Lutz Lake Fern Transmission Main which is approximately 34,000 feet of 66-inch pipeline from Gunn Highway to Dale Mabry Highway.
- Construct the Dale Mabry Transmission Main which is approximately 17,000 feet of 48-inch pipeline from County Line Road to Lake Park

Water Treatment Plant.

#### Phase III

- Construct the Lake Bridge Transmission Main which is approximately 45,000 feet of 72-inch pipeline from the Lake Bridge Pump Station to Dale Mabry Highway.
- Replace the Interpace 66-inch line which is approximately 30,000 feet in length.

The total estimated cost of the entire program is identified in Table 5.

#### APPORTIONMENT OF THE COST OF THE PROJECT

The June, 1991 Regional Water Supply Agreement provides that the capital and other fixed cost of the existing system and future expansions shall be allocated by the following formula.

The agreement also provides that the operating and other fixed cost of the existing and future expansion shall be based on the use of the system.

The capital costs shown on Table 5 represent total expenditures over a four (4) year period for the Phase I improvements. The projected monthly cash requirements for the completion of phase I is shown on Table 6. A portion of the Table 6 Costs, including Authority labor, supplies and other costs are calculated in the Base Charges portion of the annual budget. The remainder of the project costs - construction, engineering services and property acquisition - are included in the estimate supporting the amount to be financed through the sale of bonds.


Table 7 provides a comparison between the FY 91/92 budget for the regional system (the first year of budgeting based on the Regional Allocation formula) and a five year projection of fixed and variable system cost. Included in the table is a gradual assumption of the full debt and for Phase I of the Regional System, financed in two portions.


#### IMPACT OF THE PROJECT ON MEMBERSHIP'S BUDGETS


The annual costs shown on Table 7 are allocated to the membership per


the July, 1991 Agreement. The majority of the cost to be allocated is in the Base (or fixed) costs due to the inclusion of debt service (both existing and new) in the Base category. To properly analyze the impact of the financing of the project on the Authority's membership, it is necessary to compare each member's annual budget, and that portion of the member's budget that is comprised of costs of the Authority, including other projects of the Authority funded by each member. This analysis has been performed in Tables 8 and 9.

## WCRWSA SERVICE AREA










# EXISTING TRI-COUNTY WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES AND PHASE I IMPROVEMENTS





#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The West Coast Regional Water Supply Authority (hereinafter called the "Authority") was established on October 25, 1974, as a result of enabling state legislation (FS, 1974) and a Five-Party Agreement (WCRWSA, 1974) between Hillsborough, Pasco, and Pinellas Counties, and the Cities of St. Petersburg and Tampa. The Authority was the first such entity organized under the provisions of Chapter 373 of the Florida Statutes. As stated by Chapter 373, the Authority was created "...for the purpose of developing, storing, and supplying water for county or municipal purposes in such a manner as will give priority to reducing adverse environmental effects of excessive or improper withdrawals of water from concentrated areas."

In 1978, the Authority commissioned a report entitled "Comprehensive Study of the Regional Water Supply Needs and Sources, 1980-2020." This report established a two-phase master plan to meet regional water supply needs between 1980 and 1985 (Phase I), and to plan the development of future water supplies and system interconnects through the year 2020 (Phase II).

Because of phenomenal population growth in the tri-county region, the original master plan was updated during 1981 and 1982. The updated master plan was contained in the report entitled "Regional Water Supply Needs and Sources 1982-1995 Update Report" (hereinafter called the "1982 Update Report"). This report revised regional water supply need projections based on updated population, water consumption, and water supply data; and created a revised plan to meet regional water supply needs through 1995.

The purpose of this report (he einafter called the "1986 Update Report") is to review the findings of the 1982 Update Report, and to revise the regional water supply Master Plan to accommodate current water demand projections.

The 1986 Update Report accomplishes the following tasks:

- 1. Reviews current status of major local/regional water supply facilities;
- 2. Revises population and water demand projections;
- Revises safe supply capacities of existing water supply facilities;
- Updates water supply need projections based on revised water demand projections and safe supply estimates;
- Compares the findings of the 1982 Update Report to current data, and identifies and justifies changes;
- Describes the types of water conservation programs that are available to water agencies, the impacts of implementing water conservation measures, and actions the Authority can take to encourage conservation;
- Describes water reuse applications, the regulatory considerations of water reuse, existing reuse programs in the tri-county area, and the manner in which water reuse can reduce potable water supply needs;
- Identifies and evaluates water supply source options which could meet future water supply needs; and identifies the most favorable options;
- Outlines regional water system interconnect options that will allow adequate transmission links with major demand centers;
- 10. Reviews the governmental actions, technical considerations, and policies which form the conceptual framework of the Authority's regional water supply Master Plan; and updates the Master Plan to assure that it will satisfy future water demands in the tri-county area;
- 11. Estimates the total project cost of each component of the updated Master Plan and describes alternative funding methods; and
- 12. Devises an implementation strategy for the revised Master Plan.

### 2.0 EXISTING MUNICIPAL WATER SYSTEMS

The tri-county area is located on the Gulf Coast of Florida and encompasses the Counties of Hillsborough, Pasco and Pinellas. The largest public water systems in the tri-county area are operated by Pinellas County, the City of St. Petersburg, and the City of Tampa. In 1985, these three systems served approximately 70 percent of the estimated 1,782,200 people in the tri-county area. Smaller water supply systems are operated by Hillsborough and Pasco County, and the Cities of Clearwater, Belleair, Dunedin, Temple Terrace, Plant City, Dade City, Zephyrhills, Port Richey, New Port Richey, Tarpon Springs and San Antonio. Numerous private utility companies also provide water service in the region, and some residents in outlying areas rely on private wells for water supply.

Figure I shows the approximate boundaries of public water system service areas. The locations of major water supply facilities are shown on Figure 2. Table 1 lists the major water supply facilities in the tri-county area, and their permitted water supply capacities.

Major water systems in Hillsborough County are operated by the Tampa Water Department, Hillsborough County Department of Water and Wastewater Utilities, Temple Terrace Water Department and Plant City Water Department.

Numerous water supply and distribution systems are scattered throughout Pasco County. Major municipal systems are operated by the New Port Richey Water Department, Port Richey Water Department, Pasco County Utilities Department, Dade City Water Department, Zephyrhills Water Department, and Hudson Water Works, Inc.

Major municipal water systems in Pinellas County include the Pinellas County Water System, St. Petersbirg Water Supply System, Clearwater Water Division, Dunedin Water Department, Belleair Water Department and the Tarpon Springs Water Department.



The Authority operates the Starkey Well Field, Cypress Creek Well Field and Pump Station, Cross Bar Ranch Well Field, Northwest Hillsborough Regional Well Field, Tampa Bypass Canal, and the South-Central Hillsborough Regional Well Field and Lithia Pump Station (under construction). In addition, the Authority maintains the 60-inch diameter transmission main linking the Cross Bar Ranch Well Field and Cypress Creek Pump Station, and the 84-inch and 66-inch mains connecting the Cypress Creek Pump Station with the St. Petersburg Water Supply System and the Pinellas County Water System.

### 3.0 POPULATION AND WATER DEMAND PROJECTIONS

Population and water demand projections are used for regional water supply planning. The projections are dependent upon several factors, including expected economic growth in the region, the location of existing and future water service areas, and the types of water uses which occur in the region.

#### POPULATION PROJECTIONS

In recent years, several population studies have been conducted to estimate the rate and distribution of future population growth in the Tampa Bay area. The 1986 Update Report uses the countywide population projections which were published by the University of Florida Bureau of Economic and Business Research (BEBR) in June 1985 (Bulletin No. 74), and projections developed by county planning departments. The population data published by the University of Florida BEBR are the official estimates and projections endorsed by the State of Florida, and are traditionally used by the Authority for planning.

Population in the tri-county area has increased from 809,200 in 1960 to an estimated 1,782,200 in 1985, representing a 120 percent increase. As shown in the following table, population in the area increased approximately 35 percent during the 1960s, 44 percent during the 1970s, and 14 percent during the first half of the 1980s. Population growth in the region is expected to continue at a rapid rate during the remainder of the century.

The University of Florida BEBR compiles three sets of population projections based on different in-migration rates: low-, medium- and high-range. The medium-range projections are considered the most accurate predictors of future population over a short time period. Because the regional water supply Master Plan is updated every three to four years, the medium-range projections were used in this report. If the time increment between Master Plan updates were significantly longer (e.g., ten years), use of the highrange population projections would be more appropriate for predicting population shifts. Total medium-range population projections for Hillsborough, Pasco, and Pinellas Counties are summarized in Table 2. The tri-county area population is projected to be 1,953,900 in 1990; 2,241,900 in 2000; and 2,769,100 in 2020. The year 1990 tri-county area projection represents an approximate 25 percent increase in population over the 1980 census, while the year 2000 and year 2020 projections reflect 43 percent and 76 percent increases, respectively. The largest population increase between 1985 and 2020 is expected in Hillsborough County (404,800), followed by Pinellas County (346,700) and Pasco County (235,400). However, the percentage of population increase will be much higher in Pasco County than in Pinellas County and Hillsborough County. The percentage increase between 1985 and 2020 is expected to be 98 percent in Pasco County, 44 percent in Pinellas County, and 56 percent in Hillsborough County.

To develop separate population and water demand projections for existing and future water service areas, each county is divided into several water demand planning areas (WDPAs). The University of Florida countywide population projections are apportioned into individual WDPAs using information provided by local county planning departments. Medium-range population projections for WDPAs in Hillsborough, Pasco and Pinellas Counties are listed on Tables 3, 4 and 5, respectively.

#### WATER DEMANDS

Future municipal water demands are estimated for average day and maximum day demand conditions for each WDFA. Projected average day water demands are determined by multiplying the projected WDFA population by the estimated average per capita water demand. Maximum day water demands are estimated by using the appropriate demand ratio as follows:

Average Day Water Demand = Population x Average Per Capita Demand

Maximum Day Water Demand = Average Day Water Demand x Maximum Day to Average Day Demand Ratio

Current per capita demand and maximum day to average day demand ratios were estimated for each WDPA based on an analysis of historical data, discussions with water department personnel, and information presented in previous engineering studies. When limited information was available, a per capita demand and maximum day to average day ratio were selected based on comparisons to similar water systems in the tri-county area. The projected demands range from less than 150 gallons per capita per day (gpcd) in St. Petersburg, Temple Terrace, Pasco County, and Dunedin, to a high of 225 gpcd in Belleair. Projected maximum day to average day demand ratios range from a low of 1.35 for the St. Petersburg WDPA, to a high of 2.25 for the Belleair WDPA.

Tables 6 through 8 list projected water demands through the year 2020 for WDPAs in Hillsborough County, Pasco County, and Pinellas County, respectively.

Municipal water demand projections for the tri-county area are summarized in Table 9. As shown in the table, it is expected that Pasco County will experience the largest percentage increase in average day water demands between 1985 and 2020, with a projected increase of 30.1 mgd, or 98 percent. The largest quantitative increases in average day water demands between 1985 and 2020 are expected in Hillsborough County and Pinellas County, which are projected to increase 83.5 mgd and 51.8 mgd, respectively.



For the entire tri-county area, the average day demand is projected to increase from 250.0 mgd in 1985 to 415.4 mgd by the year 2020. The largest 10-year incremental increase in total tri-county average day demand (64.5 mgd) is projected to occur between 1985 and 1995.


Figures 3 through 6 illustrate historical (1975-1985) municipal, industrial and agricultural water demands in proportion to total freshwater demand in each county and in the entire tri-county area. The figures indicate that the proportions of municipal, agricultural, and industrial demands in Hillsborough County have not changed significantly since 1975. However, agricultural water demands have decreased dramatically in Pasco and Pinellas Counties. This decrease is attributed to the decline in the citrus industry caused by recent severe winters. Figure 5 also shows a significant drop in industrial water demand in Pinellas County since 1975.


Municipal water demand projections and estimated historical industrial and agricultural water demands for the tri-county area can be summarized as follows:

- Average day municipal water demands for the tri-county area are projected to increase from an estimated 250 mgd in 1985, to 335 mgd by 2000, and to 415 mgd by 2020.
- The majority of the industrial water demands in the tri-county area occur in Hillsborough and Pasco Counties. Although industrial demand projections are not presented in this report, it is expected that they will increase slightly in the tri-county area (with the exception of Pinellas County) concurrent with increasing urbanization and development.
- The majority of the agricultural water demands in the tri-county area occur in Hillsborough and Pasco Counties. Agricultural demands are generally expected to decrease due to urbanization and planned development.




Freshwater Demand in Hillsborough County, 1975-1985

# 4.0 WATER SUPPLY NEEDS

Water supply needs are defined as the difference between projected water demands and existing finished water supply capacities. Water supply needs are characterized as surpluses (supply exceeds demand) and deficits (demand exceeds supply). For planning purposes, water supply needs were projected using estimated "safe water supply capacities." A safe water supply capacity is the estimated amount of water available through groundwater or surface water withdrawal during an extended dry season drought condition. These capacities represent an average recurrence interval of 20 years (i.e., 95 percent reliability) and are in compliance with regulatory criteria (Leggette, Brashears & Graham, Inc., 1986). The Authority's consultants estimated safe supply capacities by analyzing historical water withdrawals, water levels, regulatory levels, rainfall data, water quality data, and hydraulics.

Water supply needs are projected for the areas in which the Authority is expected to supply water during the planning period (1985-2020). It is expected that the Authority will continue to supply water to the West Pasco, Pinellas, Dunedin, St. Petersburg, Northwest Hillsborough, South-Central Hillsborough and Tampa WDPAs in the future. In addition, it is likely that the Authority will serve a portion of the new growth that is expected in the Central Pasco WDPA. It is not expected that the Authority will supply water to the Temple Terrace, Thonotosassa, Plant City, Wimauma, Lacoochee, Dade City, Zephyrhills, or Belleair WDPAs during the planning period. Areas that are expected to be served by the Authority are termed water supply planning areas (WSPAs). Figure 7 shows WSPA boundaries.

A summary of projected incremental water supply needs for each WSPA through the year 2020 is presented in Table 10. It is emphasized that projected needs shown on the table are based on projected water demands and available safe supply capacities during a 1-in-20-year drought event. The quantities of water listed on the table must be developed by the dates indicated if the Authority is to satisfy projected future water supply needs. The total additional water supply capacity which must be developed to meet projected year 2020 average day and maximum day needs is 116.2 mgd and 215.6 mgd, respectively.



# 5.0 WATER CONSERVATION

Traditionally, water supply needs have been satisfied by developing new water supply sources. As long as ample quantities of nearby, high quality water have been available, this approach has been the best method for meeting increased demand. However, since the cheaper, nearby sources of water were developed first, it is now becoming increasingly expensive to develop new sources which are often remote from the point of use. During their search for more economical alternatives, water planners have identified water conservation as a means of delaying the development of new sources.

Water conservation reduces water use, and can effectively "stretch" existing water supplies by delaying the need to develop new supply facilities. Potential benefits of a residential water conservation program include reduced average day and maximum day water demands, and postponed capital expenditures for new water system facilities. Residential water conservation strategies require intervention in two distinct modes of use: indoor and outdoor. Several conservation measures and devices have proven effective in reducing indoor and outdoor water use. These measures include: use of water conserving toilets, showerheads and faucet aerators, public information programs, planting of drought resistant grasses and shrubs, recycling of household laundry water, water rate increases during dry months, inverted water rate structures, and use of reclaimed water for outdoor non-potable purposes.

Potential reductions in regional municipal water supply needs that can result from an Authority-supported regional water conservation program are presented in Table 11. It is assumed that the program would reduce indoor water consumption by the installation of water-saving fixtures in certain existing and new residences. The program would reduce outdoor water use through a public information program dealing with proper irrigation techniques, and through inverted water rate structures imposed by member water departments. Two scenarios are presented: a modest 5 percent reduction in regional water demands, and a more aggressive 15 percent demands reduction.

An aggressive conservation program could delay the 1990 water supply needs projections by approximately 2 years, and year 2000 needs by approximately 12 years. These reduced water supply needs do not include additional reductions that could result from reclaimed water use.

A water conservation program directed at reducing water consumption by residential customers could best be implemented by the local utilities which sell water directly to the ultimate users. The Authority should encourage local utilities to undertake water conservation programs.

# 6.0 WATER REUSE

Conservation of potable water can be achieved by substituting reclaimed water (i.e., water reuse) for all uses that do not require potable water quality. In the United States, reclaimed water has been used almost exclusively for nonpotable purposes such as industrial processing and cooling, agricultural and urban irrigation, construction, and recreation and aesthetics. Use of reclaimed water can augment existing potable water supplies by providing an alternative source of water for nonpotable uses. Water reuse offers many advantages: it is a water source that is close to its demand center; its volume grows in proportion to increasing population; and its use can defer the need to develop new sources of water supply.

The potential impact of a reuse program on potable water conservation is demonstrated by the effectiveness of existing reclaimed water programs. Several reuse programs in California have reported 15 to 20 percent reductions in potable water use. Locally, St. Petersburg has shown that reclaimed water can substitute for at least 10 percent of total potable water use.

Table 12 shows the estimated reduction in regional municipal water supply needs that could be gained from a regional water reuse program. Two scenarios are presented: a modest water reuse program, and an aggressive water reuse program. A modest program would delay the projected 1990 potable water supply needs by more than 5 years, and year 2000 needs would be delayed by more than 10 years. The more aggressive reuse program delays water supply deficit conditions until after the year 2000.

Estimated reductions in water supply needs resulting from implementation of a regional water reuse program do not reflect potential constraints which could limit the program's success. These constraints could include inadequate funding, regulatory limitations (including the proposed Florida Department of Environmental Regulation G-I Rule), and public concerns.

## 7.0 SOURCES OF WATER

The tri-county region receives about 55 inches of precipitation yearly, of which an estimated 40 inches evaporates or is transpired, 14 inches runs off and feeds the surface watercourses, and 1 inch percolates into the ground and is transported through subsurface systems. There are many natural interconnections such as sinkholes and springs which may intercept runoff, or may contribute flow to surface watercourses. Both surface and groundwater systems ultimately discharge into saline waters.

The primary sources of municipal water supply in the tri-county region are groundwater and surface water. Groundwater provides approximately 80 percent of the municipal drinking water supply, and surface water contributes approximately 20 percent of the municipal water supply. Two other sources which may satisfy a portion of the future municipal water supply needs are desalted saline water, and reclaimed water.

#### DESALINATION

Desalination is accomplished by removing salts and other dissolved solids from brackish water or seawater. As a potable water production method, desalination is generally adopted when adequate freshwater reserves are unavailable. The quantity and quality of the saline or non-potable feed-water impacts the desalination process selected and the total cost of the product water supplied. The tri-county area borders vast saline reserves (Gulf of Mexico, Tampa Bay) and the Floridan aquifer contains sections of either saline influence or absence of potable water. Of the several types of desalination processes which may be used to generate tri-county area water supply, reverse osmosis is currently the most economical. Large quantities of brackish or non-potable groundwaters which could supply

reverse osmosis facilities are located in coastal areas of Central Hillsborough, Pasco and Pinellas Counties. However, the feasibility of large brackish water withdrawals from these areas may be limited by the need to protect nearby potable water supplies from water quality degradation and saltwater intrusion. The potential impacts of brackish water withdrawals on the hydrologic systems in these areas should be studied.

The operational costs and capital costs of a desalination facility are highly dependent on site-specific feedwater characteristics. For the purpose of evaluating the total cost of reverse osmosis facilities, operating costs are typically added to the annual cost of capital to obtain the total water costs, expressed in units of dollars per thousand gallons of product water. Total water costs typically include energy, chemicals, labors, maintenance and repair, membrane replacement, and amortization. Desalination of seawater is significantly more expensive than desalination of brackish waters. The costs of developing brackish water as a source of supply would be roughly two times greater than the cost of groundwater source development for the major water systems in the tri-county area.

Desalination as a water source option has several unique characteristics:

- Desalination is usually adopted only as a last resort for water supply. Almost invariably, before desalination has been used, contiguous groundwater or surface water sources were either depleted or unacceptable, and the importation of water from distant sources was necessary. The additional cost of transporting water proved prohibitive, even when compared to the high cost of the desalination process.
- The excessive energy consumed by desalination processes may reduce the viability of this alternative.
- Although desalination technology has become more refined, it still is not competitive with conventional water supply/treatment systems when nearby freshwater supplies exist.

4. Due to extensive treatment requirements, desalination schemes are more sensitive to cost fluctuations (for maintenance, energy, chemicals, and other consumables) than other water supply and treatment systems.

These unique characteristics reduce the viability of desalination in areas which are close to freshwater sources or supply facilities. However, since advances in reverse osmosis technology seem to predict lower costs for desalination in the future, developments in this field should be monitored.

#### SURFACE WATER

Abundant freshwater is a great asset to west-central Florida. More than 500 million gallons per day (mgd) are discharged into saline waters from surface water sources within the tri-county area on an average basis. Unfortunately, the undeveloped large quantity/high quality surface water sources are distant from the tri-county demand areas. Within the tri-county area, most surface sources are of poor quality, vary substantially in their rate of flow, or exhibit very low flow rates.

Surface water is currently used to supply approximately 20 percent of the tri-county municipal water demand. Of the 32 streams evaluated during this study, three sites in the tri-county area demonstrated favorable flow and quality characteristics. These are the Hillsborough River, the Tampa Bypass Canal System, and the Alafia River. Of the 17 springs evaluated, three were found potentially favorable for water source development: Weeki Wachee Springs, Silver Springs and Rainbow Springs.

Both natural and man-made constraints affect the feasibility of developing additional surface water sources to serve the tri-county area. Natural constraints include the distance of the source from the demand center, quality and quantity of flow, dependability of flow, siltation, soil permeability, topographic relief, evapotranspiration rate, hydrogeologic condition, and frequency of floods and drought. Man-made constraints include self-imposed health regulations, environmental protection, and rules regarding ownership rights. In particular, strict enforcement of the

Southwest Florida Water Management District's minimum flow and 5 percent withdrawal rules would restrict the development of surface water sources that could serve the tri-county area, unless variances are obtained.


#### GROUNDWATER

More than 10,000 billion gallons of freshwater are stored in the Floridan aquifer within Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough Counties. Groundwater is the single most promising source of water supply for the tri-county area, even though source development in certain locations may be inhibited by political, regulatory, economic or other constraints.

To aid the evaluation of potential groundwater supply source sites, selection criteria were chosen to locate hydrologically favorable areas, and to evaluate major engineering, political, and socioeconomic considerations. A composite hydrologic map was prepared to facilitate review of two important hydrologic criteria: depth to the saltwater interface, and the potentiometric surface elevation. Other hydrologic parameters include leakance, depth to water table, seasonal change in the potentiometric surface, "cumulative" potentiometric drawdowns, transmissivity, and water quality.

By combining the saltwater interface and potentiometric surface elevation hydrologic criteria on a hydrologic map, visual identification is possible of locations in the tri-county area that are hydrologically favorable for groundwater source development. These favorable areas are shown in a composite map on Figure 8, and are located in the following areas:

- 1. Central Pasco County,
- 2. East Pasco County,
- 3. Northwest Hillsborough County,
- 4. Northeast Hillsborough County, and
- 5. Central Hillsborough County



The enabling legislation which permits the formation of regional water supply authorities charges these public agencies with supplying water "in such a manner as will give priority to reducing adverse environmental effects of excessive or improper withdrawals of water from concentrated areas." To consider the environmental aspects of water supply functions, the ecological impacts and mitigations concerning well field construction, operations and water table drawdowns were addressed.

#### 8.0 WATER SUPPLY SOURCE OPTIONS

A large number of potential water supply source options were evaluated to isolate the most favorable for the regional water supply Master Plan alternatives. A water supply source option is defined as a water supply development scheme consisting of a single, specific source and/or process. Potential water supply source options are classified as groundwater development, surface water development, desalination, water reuse and water conservation.

Three levels of ranking were established: hydrologic favorability; ecologic favorability; and a combination of reliability, public health, public acceptance, energy consumption, Master Plan agreement and implementability. A list of the water supply source options considered most favorable for incorporation in the regional water supply Master Plan alternatives appears in Table 13. The estimated combined maximum safe supply development capacity of all the favorable options is approximately 337 mgd, which greatly exceeds the additional water supply requirements in the tri-county area through the year 2020. Water reuse, water conservation, and desalination source options are not included in the list, due to the difficulty of accurately estimating the phasing and impact of these options on future water supply needs.

## 9.0 WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM INTERCONNECT OPTIONS

Throughout most of the tri-county region, adequate and dependable water supply depends on water system interconnection. Major water system interconnects may be used to convey new water supply to demand centers, or to transfer existing water supply surpluses to demand centers.

Considering these factors, the following set of policies form the conceptual framework for the Authority's regional water supply Master Plan.

- Protection of public health is the highest priority.
- The Authority should actively pursue coordination of regional water supply sources in the tri-county area.
- Existing resources will be optimized before public funds are spent for new resource development.
- Benefit to the water customer is a high priority, within economic, hydrologic and environmental limitations.
- Transfer of water within the tri-county region will make optimum beneficial use of the resource.
- All future water resource development must consider the water supply needs of the areas from which water is withdrawn.
- The most reliable and highest quality water sources will be sought, within economic and environmental constraints.
- · Water will not be withdrawn improperly.
- Source and system interconnections will be developed on a regional basis whenever practical.
- Water supply facilities will provide adequate service for the least possible cost.
- Potable water will be supplied using the most energy-efficient means.
- Saltwater encroachment will be avoided through appropriate water supply management techniques.

Regional water system interconnect options which may be used to convey water from existing and new supply sources were identified. Several of the regional interconnect options, and several of the favorable water supply source options were combined to develop regional water supply Master Plan alternatives. The selection of specific interconnect options for incorporation in the Master Plan alternatives is dependent upon the specific supply source options selected; and upon the water system operational, management and reliability philosophies which are the basis of each Master Plan alternative.

#### 10.0 MASTER PLAN PRECEPTS

The objective of this study is to update the Authority's Master Plan, to assure that it will provide adequately for the area's future water demands. Implementation of the Master Plan would create a regional supply system in which each newly developed facility would complement existing facilities. A multitude of considerations were investigated to develop the foundation for the Authority's updated Master Plan. These considerations include:

- The objectives and embodied powers of the Authority as defined by: the enabling legislation which allowed the creation of water supply authorities (Florida Statutes, 1974); the Five Party Agreement (WCRWSA, 1974) which formed the Authority itself; and accepted Authority policy.
- The objectives, policies, and guidelines of the Southwest Florida Water Management District, Florida Division of State Planning, the Environmental Protection Agency, and the Florida Department of Environmental Regulation.
- The technical aspects of water supply development, including engineering, hydrology and ecology.

- The Authority will make maximum use of publicly owned land before additional land is acquired for water supply development.
- Water conservation is encouraged.

# 11.0 THE REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY MASTER PLAN

#### GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

The regional water supply Master Plan, when implemented, will ensure the orderly, efficient and effective water resource development that is necessary to provide the tri-county area with sufficient quantities of potable water through the 1986-2000 planning period. The plan also presents a conceptual approach to water resource development during the 2000 to 2020 time frame. The Master Plan will guide the Authority in its efforts to procure water within acceptable ecologic, hydrologic, engineering, and economic constraints.

The regional water supply Master Plan is predicated on:

- Maximum use of existing facilities;
- Projected population and water demands;
- Projected water supply needs;
- The impact of water conservation and water reuse programs on water supply needs;
- Available sources of water;
- The most favorable water supply source options;
- The most beneficial water supply system interconnects; and
- Water supply policies and Master Plan precepts.

Six Master Plan alternatives were developed by combining favorable water supply source options and water system interconnect options into phased plans of water supply development. Three phases of water supply development are proposed in each Master Plan alternative, as defined by the following planning periods:

Phase	Planning Period
I	1986-1990
II	1990-1995
III	1995-2000

A fourth phase of water supply development (Phase IV, 2000-2020) is incorporated in the recommended water supply Master Plan. Uncertainty surrounds the water supply needs during this final planning period. However, consideration of the Phase IV planning period is important to provide direction for water supply development after the year 2000.

#### RELIABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

To ensure a reliable water supply for Pinellas County, St. Petersburg, and Northwest Hillsborough County in case of failure of the existing 84-inch transmission main, the Master Plan must provide for construction of an alternate transmission main route to convey water to these areas. To improve regional water supply system reliability, all water supply Master Plan alternatives will include either:

- Construction of a new transmission main paralleling the existing 84-inch transmission main; or
- Construction of a new transmission main between the Cypress Creek Pump Station and the proposed Cypress Bridge Pump Station, and a new transmission main between the proposed Cypress Bridge Pump Station and the existing Lake Park Pump Station.

#### THE REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY MASTER PLAN

The recommended 1986-2020 regional water supply Master Plan consists of two primary components:

- 1. A water supply source development component, and
- 2. A water transmission facility component.

The phased water supply Master Plan is illustrated on Figure 9. A summary of recommended water supply source development components in each phase is presented in Table 14. With one exception, recommended water supply source development is limited to groundwater development via the expansion of existing well fields, refurbishment of existing well systems, and the development of new regional well fields and new linear well fields. The exception is the proposed use of reclaimed water from the City of Tampa's Hookers Point Advanced Wastewater Treatment Plant, in conjuntion with the Tampa Bypass Canal water reuse project.

Water transmission facility components recommended in the regional water supply Master Plan include new transmission mains (interconnects) and pump stations. The primary function of the interconnects is to convey water supplied from the newly developed sources to the demand centers. To accomplish this objective, the pipelines intertie demand areas, allowing a more effective and reliable regional supply of water and creating larger supply planning areas. Moreover, improved regional water supply management may be accomplished through integrated systems incorporating dual or multi-source supplies.

A general discussion of major facilities required to implement the recommended 1986-2020 water supply Master Plan is presented in the following text. Only Authority facilities associated with the recommended plan are described.

# Phase I (1986-1990)

During this initial phase of the Master Plan, the West Pasco, Central Pasco, St. Petersburg, and Northwest Hillsborough County water supply planning areas are expected to require water supply source development. The projected West Pasco water supply needs will be supplied by expanding the existing Starkey Well Field. New facilities required at the well field include a pump, motor, and related equipment for Well No. 15, which has already been constructed; an extension of the existing 42-inch transmission main to Well Nos. 15 and 12; and related raw water collection piping. The Central Pasco, St. Petersburg, and Northwest Hillsborough County water supply needs will be satisfied by construction of a segment of the Cypress Bridge Linear Well Field. Approximately 10 mgd of new supply will be developed along the southern portion of the well field (in Hillsborough County) to supply St. Petersburg and Northwest Hillsborough County. Projected Central Pasco needs can be met by constructing a single well along the proposed well field route in the Central Pasco area. In addition, construction of the Cypress Bridge Pump Station and a transmission main interconnecting the pump station with the Lake Park Pump Station is recommended to convey new supply to St. Petersburg and Northwest Hillsborough County.

## Phase II (1990-1995)

It is expected that all seven water supply plan areas will require new water supply source development during Phase II to satisfy projected needs. Projected water supply needs in the West Pasco area will be met by further expansion of the <a href="Starkey Well Field">Starkey Well Field</a>, and initial development of the <a href="North Pasco Linear Well Field">North Pasco Linear Well Field</a>. New facilities at the Starkey Well Field will include a pump, motor, and related equipment at Well No. 12 which has already been constructed; two new wells complete; a 36-inch interconnect between the existing 42-inch raw water collection main and the existing 84-inch transmission main; and related raw water collection piping.

Approximately 15 mgd of new supply will be developed at the North Pasco Linear Well Field which will comprise new supply wells, a new transmission main and raw water collection piping, and <a href="massec-mass-rate">massec massec-mass-rate Pomp station</a> located near State Road (SR) 52. Further expansion of the Cypress Bridge Linear Well

Field is proposed to supply the needs of the Central Pasco, Pinellas County, St. Petersburg, Northwest Hillsborough County, and Tampa areas. Expansion of the linear well field will include additional supply wells, extension of the transmission main, raw water collection mains, and expansion of the Cypress Bridge Pump Station. Initial construction of the North Hillsborough Linear Well Field is also proposed to serve the Tampa area. The existing Brandon Well System will be refurbished to serve the South-Central Hillsborough County area. Refurbishment is expected to entail modification and replacement of certain existing pumps, motors, and related equipment; a new master pump station in the north Brandon area; a new transmission main linking the Brandon well system with the new master pump station and existing South-Central Hillsborough Regional Well Field discharge main located on Lithia Road; and raw water collection piping. interconnecting transmission main is also proposed between the Cosme-Odessa Well Field and the Eldridge-Wilde Well Field to ensure reliability of supply for Pinellas County.

# Phase III (1995-2000)

Expansion of the North Pasco Linear Well Field is proposed to meet projected needs in the West Pasco area. Facilities will include additional water supply wells, raw water collection piping, extension of the water transmission main, and expansion of the master pump station. Central Pasco area needs will be met by a new supply well in the Cypress Bridge Linear Well Field. Completion of the Cypress Bridge interconnecting transmission main is also proposed. The North Hillsborough Linear Well Field will be expanded to serve Pinellas County, St. Petersburg, Northwest Hillsborough County, and Tampa. This expansion will include construction of new water supply wells, an eastward extension of the water transmission main, and construction of raw water collection piping. Construction of the North-Central Hillsborough Linear Well Field will be initiated to supply projected South-Central Hillsborough County needs. Facilities to be provided at the linear well field include water supply wells and related raw water collection piping, a new transmiss on main extending southward from the well field to the North Brandon Pump Station, and expansion of the North Brandon Pump Station.

# Phase IV (2000-2020)

New water supply development proposed for Phase IV includes:

- Purther expansion of the <u>North Pasco Linear Well Field</u> to serve the West Pasco area;
- Expansion of the <u>Cypress Bridge Linear Well Field</u> to serve the Central Pasco area;
- Expansion of the <u>North Hillsborough Linear Well Field</u>, and construction of the <u>Northeast Hillsborough Regional Well Field</u> to serve Pinellas County, St. Petersburg, Northwest Hillsborough County, and Tampa;
- Expansion of the North-Central Hillsborough Linear Well Field and the South-Central Hillsborough Regional Well Field to serve South-Central Hillsborough County; and
- Implementation of the <u>Tampa Bypass Canal water reuse project</u> to serve Tampa, Northwest Hillsborough County, and South-Central Hillsborough County.

Expansion of previously constructed well fields will include the addition of new water supply wells, raw water collection piping, transmission mains and pump station expansions. The proposed Northeast Hillsborough Regional Well Field will comprise new water supply wells and related raw water collection piping, a new transmission main connecting the regional well field with the North Hillsborough Linear Well Field transmission main, and a new pump station at the regional well field site. Implementation of the Tampa Bypass Canal Water Reuse Project will occur only if current testing and research prove that this project is a viable and reliable potable water supply source. New facilities which are proposed in conjunction with the water reuse project include a transmission main and pump station to convey reclaimed water from Hookers Point to the Tampa Bypass Canal, a supplemental treatment facility at the Hookers Point Advanced Wastewater

Treatment Plant, collector wells to withdraw water from the Tampa Bypass Canal, and a 30-mgd potable water treatment plant to treat water supplied by the collector wells.

In addition to the new water supply source facilities, several new transmission main interconnects are proposed in Phase IV. These include an interconnect between the North-Central Hillsborough Linear Well Field and the North Hillsborough Linear Well Field, an interconnect between the Section 21 Well Field and the Cosme/Odessa Well Field, and an interconnect between the Northeast Hillsborough Regional Well Field, and the North Hillsborough Linear Well Field.

The nature and extent of new water supply facilities required in Phase III and Phase IV are uncertain, since projected populations, water demands, and water supply needs are uncertain. Consequently, the recommended water supply facilities for these phases should be reviewed and modified as necessary in the future.

# 12.0 FUNDING

The estimated total project costs associated with the implementation of the 1986-2020 regional water supply Master Plan are listed by phases in Tables 15 through 18. As noted on the tables, total project cost estimates encompass total construction costs, including: engineering, technical, legal, easement rights and contingencies, and financing. Land costs are not included. Costs were projected using mid-1986 dollar values, (ENR Construction Cost Index of 4290) for all planning horizons. This was done to allow comparison of all future facility developments. These cost estimates are very time-dependent due to inflation and other factors, and should not be used for the development of specific fiscal programs.

Total project costs for Phase IV (2000-2020) of the Master Plan are likely to change significantly due to the likelihood that the phasing and selection of improvements will change before implementation.

The facilities required to meet the projected water supply needs of existing and prospective Authority customers can be funded using a variety of methods, including ad valorem taxes, revenue bonds, loans, grants, land grants, Southwest Florida Water Management District financial aid, or funds on hand. The most expedient and viable approach is the issuance of revenue bonds which would be retired by net income from water sales.

## 13.0 IMPLEMENTATION

Best

The Authority's enabling legislation mandates that the water needs of "all citizens within the authority" be met. This 1986 Update Report is the continuing step toward fulfilling these legislative requirements, as defined in Chapter 373.1962 of the Florida Statutes. This section delineates the overall approach to implementing the recommended facilities.

To meet the projected 1986-1990 water supply needs, the Authority and its five members should immediately implement the Phase I water supply source components proposed herein. These developments include expansion of an existing well field, construction of a new well field, construction of two major interconnecting transmission mains, and construction of a new regional pump station.

In preparation for the Phase II through Phase IV planning periods (1990-2020), the Authority should conduct further investigations of the recommended supply source development sites in order to accumulate sufficient specific data to allow detailed evaluations. Finally, a provision for updating the plan should be made to ensure its usefulness and longevity.

The Authority should take action to maximize the many benefits which may be derived from regional water supply operation. The Authority should interconnect as many water supply sources as economically possible into the regional network. The use of interconnects will greatly improve the reliability of regional water supply system operation, and will permit the transfer of water within the tri-county area for the purpose of hydrologic, ecologic and water quality management. Well field rotation should be practiced, as needed, to allow for a reduction of ecological and hydrological stress. The regional management of municipal withdrawals would permit an increased distribution of well field effects, and would preclude inappropriate or excessive withdrawals from concentrated areas.

# 14.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on the findings of this 1986 Update Report and the summary and conclusions stated previously, the following recommendations are made:

 Continue to implement the proposed Phase I (1986-1990) Master Plan program to meet the water demands of existing and proposed Authority customers:

- Expand the Starkey Well Field to satisfy water supply needs in the West Pasco area;
- Initiate development of the Cypress Bridge Linear Well Field to serve the Central Pasco, Northwest Hillsborough, and St. Petersburg areas; and
- Construct the Cypress Bridge Pump Station and transmission main interconnect to convey supply to Northwest Hillsborough and St. Petersburg.
- Continue to pursue land acquisition for the proposed Northeast Hillsborough Regional Well Field (Phase IV), as authorized by the Board.
- Initiate detailed planning and investigation of the following water supply facilities proposed for development in the Phase II (1990-1995) planning period:
  - Further expand the Starkey Well Field;
  - Initiate development of the North Pasco Linear Well Field and master pump station;
  - Expand the Cypress Bridge Linear Well Field and the Cypress Bridge Pump Station;
  - Initiate construction of the North Hillsborough Linear Well Field; and
  - Refurbish existing water supply wells in the Brandon area,
     and construct a new master pump station.
- Initiate detailed planning and investigation of the water supply facilities proposed for development in the Phase III (1995-2000) and Phase IV (2000-2020) planning periods.

- Monitor the ecological and hydrological characteristics of all regional water sources proposed for development.
- Maximize the production capability of all existing water supply sources before developing new sources.
- Continue to aggressively pursue the regional approach to water supply development by developing all future regional water supply sources required to meet the needs of the tri-county area.
- Focus water supply development during the planning period (1986-2020) primarily on groundwater due to its relatively low capital cost, low energy requirements, minimal adverse ecological and hydrological impacts, high quality and excellent dependability characteristics.
- Consider the development of surface water only where it is determined to be significantly more viable than groundwater.
- Encourage local water utilities to implement water conservation programs, and take the following actions:
  - Help the local water utilities develop a public information program dealing with the potential dollar savings to be gained from the use of water conserving devices in existing dwellings;
  - In cooperation with the Southwest Florida Water Management District, the Florida Agricultural Extension Service, and local water utilities, develop educational material on lawn and shrub irrigation techniques, and foliage types which are drought resistant;
  - Create a water conservation library and make the information available to the Authority's customers; and

- Obtain water supply/water demand data and conduct several detailed studies to help the Authority understand the relationship between climatic conditions and water demands.
- Encourage the use of treated wastewater for irrigation, industry, the control of saltwater intrusion and other non-potable purposes to improve the efficiency of water use in the area. Proceed with extreme caution in using treated wastewater for potable water supply purposes.
- Monitor advances in reverse osmosis (desalination) technology
   which may result in a significant reduction in energy consumption
   and capital and operational costs. Continue to investigate the
   potential for reverse osmosis facilities in the south Pinellas
   County area.
- Interconnect all major raw water sources where and when practicable to realize the benefits of a regional water system.
   Treatment processes must be designed to ensure water quality compatibility among the interconnected sources.
- Continue to develop a long-range fiscal program that will provide sufficient funds to meet projected capital and operational requirements. A component of this program should be a rate structure that will provide sufficient economic incentive to encourage the participation in the regional water supply system.
- Continue hydrological and ecological monitoring of the regional well fields to (1) detect and analyze groundwater withdrawals and their effects, and (2) apply the knowledge gained to future water resources projects.
- Actively monitor and participate, when appropriate, in the district, state and federal planning programs related to water supply development in the Authority area.

- Actively participate in the planning of all liquid and solid waste disposal sites as they relate to possible degradation of the water quality of existing or potential water sources.
- Initiate, when appropriate, additional studies to confirm the
  design parameters of proposed future supply sources; and complete
  the regional operations and management study to develop a plan to
  improve the operational efficiency of the regional water supply
  facilities.
- Review and update this Master Plan at least every five years so that modifications may be made to respond to unanticipated water demands, water resource availability, technological advances, and policy changes.
