Two of our accounts in particular, a hotel (Eden Roc) and a restaurant (Joe's Stone Crab), have asked that we advise the Commission that simply because the LDC has imposed a minimum should be no reason for the gas consumer to be penalized from obtaining what may be cheaper and more competitively priced natural gas. In the past, LDC's have suggested that many of the smaller customers may not have the expertise or experience to purchase gas from a third party provider. Now that deregulation and unbundling is taking place at a very rapid pace, we suggest to the Commission there is not a more competitive environment in this country than the hotel and restaurant business. Owners and managers in these industries have to compete on a daily or hourly basis to make a living and my clients are prepared to enter the deregulated world of natural gas right now and without the limits imposed on them by the LDC. In effect, they want to be able to purchase gas from third party suppliers *immediately* and not have to wait any length of time. They are willing to sign off that they will be responsible for their actions, if that be the case.

We are aware that the PSC will be announcing a new tariff on this subject on or about October 3, 1997. We wanted to let you know that smaller commercial accounts want and need to be able to purchase more competitively priced gas. They are quite aware that natural gas is being deregulated and desire the ability to compete on a level playing field with their competitors.

In addition to the Peoples accounts, several City Gas customers have also retained our firm and are facing the same situation; albeit less of a threshold (120K) it still presents a problem for them that is not necessary in a deregulated environment. Dear Madam Chairman:

We would like to go on record in the above docket, and in particular concerning the availability of all commercial and industrial customers having the choice of using third party gas suppliers. As you are aware, most, if not all of the LDC's have imposed volumetric thresholds beyond which many of the smaller commercial accounts can not qualify for cheaper third party gas supplies.

Our firm has been retained by a number of smaller commercial accounts that do not meet the volumetric requirements of Peoples Gas Miami division, which is presently set at 500,000 therms per year. Two of our accounts in particular, a hotel (Eden Roc) and a restaurant (Joe's Stone Crab), have asked that we advise the Commission that simply because the LDC has imposed a minimum should be no reason for the gas consumer to be penalized from obtaining what may be cheaper and more competitively priced natural gas. In the past, LDC's have suggested that many of the smaller customers may not have the expertise or experience to purchase gas from a third party provider. Now that deregulation and unbundling is taking place at a very rapid pace, we suggest to the Commission there is not a more competitive environment in this country than the hotel and restaurant business. Owners and managers in these industries have to compete on a daily or hourly basis to make a living and my clients are prepared to enter the deregulated world of natural gas right now and without the limits imposed on them by the LDC. In effect, they want to be able to purchase gas from third party suppliers *immediately* and not have to wait any length of time. They are willing to sign off that they will be responsible for their actions, if that be the case.


We are aware that the PSC will be announcing a new tariff on this subject on or about October 3, 1997. We wanted to let you know that smaller commercial accounts want and need to be able to purchase more competitively priced gas. They are quite aware that natural gas is being deregulated and desire the ability to compete on a level playing field with their competitors.

In addition to the Peoples accounts, several City Gas customers have also retained our firm and are facing the same situation; albeit less of a threshold (120K) it still presents a problem for them that is not necessary in a deregulated environment. The University of Miami is a case in point and is anxious to proceed to third party gas at the earliest possible time.

We will be happy to discuss this with you if you have any questions. On behalf of our accounts, we respectfully request your full consideration as you are making final decisions on the tariff.



The Greater Miami and The Beaches Hotel Association has a membership totaling over 100 hotels, all of which are consumers of natural gas.


With deregulation, most of our members are eligible for substantial savings, except for one major obstacle--that being the volumetric thresholds imposed by certain local natural gas distribution companies.
