- Α. Pursuant to Paragraph 1035 of the FCC's First Report 13 14 and Order, state commissions have the authority to determine what geographic areas should be considered 15 16 "local areas" for the purpose of applying reciprocal 17 compensation obligations for wireline carriers under section 251 (b) (5). Furthermore, Sprint believes that 18 19 the ILEC's local calling scope, including mandatory EAS, should define the appropriate local calling scope 20 21 for reciprocal compensation purposes for wireline local calling scope of the 22 carriers. The including mandatory EAS, establishes logical 23 а boundary upon which reciprocal compensation can be 24

1 determined and is both fair and practical because 2 ILECs generally have well-established flat-rated local 3 calling scopes, with tariffed access charges applicable outside the local calling scope. The should follow 1 Yes. FPSC the reciprocal Α. 2 compensation procedures already established by FCC. Specifically, according to Rule 51.711(a), 3 the compensation mechanism governing the transport 4 and delivery of traffic should be symmetrical reciprocal 5 compensation rates based on the ILEC's Commission-6 studies. Furthermore, under Rule 7 approved cost 51.711(b) the states may establish asymmetrical rates 8 if the ALEC proves to the state commission, by filing 9 their own cost study, t h a t their costs of operating 10 11 an efficiently configured network exceeds the costs incurred by the ILEC. In addition, under circumstances 12 when the ILEC has not submitted a cost study, Sprint 13 believes the ALEC should be allowed to adopt the rates 14 of another large ILEC for reciprocal compensation 15 purposes. 16
