It will force me to pay a high price to "hookup" and then an expensive monthly fee.

It will force me to purchase a generator, since the proposed system is electricity dependent. Without electricity, putrid contents could leach out into the open. Consider how this would attract rats and disease.

It will tear up my personal property, including my vegetation. Who will replace and return my property to its pre construction state?

My name is Michael Riley

I am a Florida resident and property owner of 220 Kettle Harbor Drive, Don Pedro island, which is within the boundaries of the proposed service area of Environmental Utilities, Inc. (EU) application for waste water service.

I have lived at this address for over 15 years.

I object to the proposal under docket #20240032-SU and ask the Public Service Commission to deny the application for original certificate of authorization for this proposed central sewer system.

Basically there is no proven need to do a 'septic to sewer' conversion in this service area. The water quality around our bridgeless barrier islands is good and the issues with the Lemon Bay water quality (high level of nutrients) has been found to be caused primarily by Charlotte County Utilities Recycle Water system which does not meet federal recycle water standards. Many forward thinking coastal counties have instituted a moratorium on septic to sewer conversions until each county can bring their own contaminating recycle water within federal standards. This process takes from 3 to 10 years to accomplish, yet Charlotte County has not seen fit to do a moratorium on conversions, and is in support of this private party septic to sewer conversion, which I do not understand – clean your own house before blasting others without proven need.

Our Islands are blessed with having a population of people that are environmentally conscious. We have the Bocilla Islands Conservancy, Inc. (BICI) to thank for implementing various programs to help maintain our islands attitude for nature and education on environmental issues.

BICI has a Gopher Tortoise relocation program to safely relocate this endangered species on new home sites. They also help residents build a Tortoise berm to provide habitat, and honor those with 'Tortoise Friendly Yards' (a unique and celebrated program by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservancy Commission).

BICI got our islands certified as a 'Community Wildlife Habitat' per below certificate. 'Palm Island' consists of Don Pedro and Knight islands as well as Thornton Key. Construction of the sewer system will devastate our certification and damage our wildlife habitat.





Palm Island is now a.... Certified Community Wildlife Habitat!

Leading a nationwide trend in community concern for habitat loss, Palm Island has been officially designated as a NWF Community Wildlife Habitat by the National Wildlife Federation.

Palm Island is a unique barrier island that is home to a diverse array of wildlife, native & migrating birds, endangered species such as gopher tortoises, interesting insects, bob cats, seasonal sea turtles and of course, our abundance of fish & marine life. All of these animals play a role in the health & quality of our fragile environment. Some are productive pollinators while others balance the food chain.

Bocilla Islands Conservancy strives to protect island wildlife thru preservation of green space, and ongoing education.

BICI also has sponsored the 'Mini-reef" program on our islands. These are mini-reefs that are placed under docks to clean our waters as well as provide a safe habitat for fish and marine life. This is part of the 10,000 reef challenge that many communities along the Florida coast have adopted with great success. BICI also helps remove invasive species of plants and encourages plantings of native or Florida friendly plants and flora.

One of my major concerns is the devastation to our roadways, trees, landscaping, wildlife habitat, etc. with the proposed sewer system. We enjoy and properly maintain septic systems, sand roads, open spaces, parks, trails, etc. which make living on our islands peaceful and tranquil. One of the downsides of living on these bridgeless barrier islands is ferry access furnished by the Palm Island Transit, Inc., or private boat. Because of Hurricane Ian and all the rebuilding by contractors that do not live on island, our ferry wait times have been an hour or so to leave or regain access to our homes. This proposed multiyear sewer construction project would lengthen these wait times even longer causing frustration and additional cost to EU – eventually passed on to the homeowners in rates.

Another major concern is an environmental spill of wastewater from these tanks and the intra-coastal waterway. With our current septic systems, they continue to operate efficiently and environmentally sound without electricity. I and the other island residents maintain our septic systems with routine sludge removal and inspections to ensure proper operation, replacing when deemed necessary and Charlotte County continues to supply permits for rebuild or replacement. The proposed system would be reliant on electricity to operate the pumps to move the wastewater off island. If the power fails for a period of time (a frustratingly regular occurrence and definitely when there is a hurricane or high winds creating no ferry service), we would be subject to the possibility of a wastewater environmental spill (only a small 60 gallon storage tank without a septic field) which would have a devastating effect on wildlife, wildlife habitats, and also our residents. By taking the wastewater off island through a subaqueous line in the intra-coastal waterway, there is the potential of a horrible environmental disaster in our waterways.

Why does the application allow EU a non-compensated easement for each resident to place their tank on our property near our house and allow them 24 hour access without homeowner permission. EU should have to purchase the easement from each homeowner because granting an easement without compensation goes contrary to real property ownership laws in Florida. This oversteps the boundaries of eminent domain without adequate legal proceedings or representation. It is basically granting access and ownership of private property to another entity without due process.

The cost to Homeowners for this wastewater system is tremendous, especially considering the fact of having to rebuild from Hurricane Ian. Our insurance costs are out of sight, again because of Hurricane Ian and the States position on insurance programs. This proposal would cost each Homeowner slightly less than \$15,000 up front with no pay over-time option. The monthly cost of around \$250 (or \$3,000 per year) is unconscionable for the removal of wastewater only – no sludge. The additional 'homeowner' costs of electrical panel installation, electricity, and sludge removal from the storage tank are too much. The costs estimated by EU have proven to be inaccurate or only estimates and the actual cost could and probably would be significantly higher. We can't afford uncontrolled spiraling costs to force many to move from the islands. This application also **requires mandatory** hookup by each resident – no exceptions, even if they recently replaced their septic system with a new, permitted, latest code system at a cost of \$10-20,000. The newest septic systems being installed are highly efficient and have been proven to clean wastewater to levels that exceed current federal and state levels, so why create potential problems building an expensive sewer system when septic systems can and will work adequately for bridgeless barrier islands without environmental issues.

Septic systems retard high density development where sewer systems encourage it. Our bridgeless barrier islands need to remain an environmentally balanced residential area of Florida that seems to be disappearing state wide on a daily basis.

This application is a repeat attempt to do 'private' sewers on our islands without support of the homeowners or a proven need. The prior application from 2020 was denied by the PSC because no need for service was justified or proven. The 2024 proposed private sewer system design is the same as the old denied proposal. There is already a private sewer system (Knight Island Utilities, Inc.) to handle the Palm Island Resort, which trucks its wastewater and sludge off island via the ferry. I would assume that the Resort would prefer to use the proposed subaqueous intra-coastal wastewater crossing of EU to remove their wastewater, but does not want to pay the same initial hookup and monthly fees as the rest of the service area homeowners. EU has designed their system to handle this Resort's additional volume (at the cost of the proposed service homeowners), but does not include the Resort in their service area and does not provide for any bulk transmission rates or other commercial rates in their application. This question was not answered in the prior case and needs to be addressed immediately.

Bottom line – This application needs to be denied immediately and not allowed to proceed.

I cannot put into words all the objections I have for this unwarranted and unwanted attempt to force a high cost, unjustified, inadequate wastewater removal service, by a politically astute/active 'private' party (with a big profit incentive) down our throats.

Again, I object to the proposal under docket #20240032-SU and ask the Public Service Commission to deny the application for original certificate of authorization for this proposed central sewer system.

My husband, Kevin Mackin and I, Charlene Mackin are very concerned regarding the possibility of adding a sewer system to our island currently consisting of individual septic systems for each homeowner. These concerns are:

- 1. Environmental: No studies have been done to prove the need for sewer
- 2. EU is NOT a contractor and has no experience with a massive project such as installing a sewer system for the entire island. We all know what can happen if you get a bad contractor and the many issues that could befall on a project as complex and environmentally difficult as this would be.
- 3. Cost: The hook-up costs are exceeding high and are vague on the actual the costs will eventually be on not just a month by month water bill, but the installation fees can go up and up.
- 4. Warranty: There are no guarantees that the treatment of sewer waste will be processed in an environmentally efficient manner as well as no guarantees on lifespan of the equipment, system maintenance, and on and on. Again, a contractor who has never tackled an operation as complex as this would inevitably be a disaster.
- 5. Access to homes: What about some property owners would have physical restraints on getting access to their homes, the car ferry would be delayed in unbelievable amounts of time to prohibit a timely journey on and off the island, and this could take years to complete.
- 6. Potential of sewer spill in the Intracoastal Waterway. The risk of central sewer leak is far greater than the risk of septic systems developing leaks.
- 7. Grandfathering of septic systems regardless of age. My husband and I just spent \$12,000 installing a new septic system for our home at 381 Bocilla Dr. This fact would not even be considered.

Most importantly, NOTHING has been shown to prove that a sewer system would be environmentally beneficial over the current septic systems we homeowners have in place. We BEG you to not even consider this project. If you investigate the EXACT step by step procedures of this very complex and time consuming project, you will find that there are many open ended questions and concerns that have not been addressed or outlined. It is vague, unprofessional and environmentally NOT SOUND.

My concerns are many, starting with a private utility being awarded a contract to install sewers. I do not believe they will be able to fulfill the obligation to install and service the system proposed as they have no prior experience in this area. I further believe the system proposed is flawed and will ultimately cause harm to our beautiful island. The system proposed will not effectively remove our waste and will require it to be pumped out on a regular basis. The tanks proposed are also made out of fiberglass; there is a very real risk of them coming out of the ground during one of our frequent Florida storms. Dear Clerk of the Commission,

I am an owner of 9752 Little Gasparilla Island and would like to ask you to deny Environment Utilities (EU) application to install wastewater service on the barrier island especially Little Gasparilla Island (LGI).

No proven need for service

On LGI there are a handful of full-time residents and the rest of the houses are only used occasionally on weekends as vacation homes, so the volume is not as much as it is with a full-time resident with large families. The low volume can be determined by looking at the water consumption. Additionally, water quality testing by independent/reputable firms have not been conducted so there is no creditable reason for converting to sewer.

Private property rights

Nobody seems to have an answer when asked why water lines were allowed to be run on private property. Utility easements on our private property especially for a tank and equipment is not acceptable as it we are giving up our rights for any sort of equipment to be placed there which could be a loud pump, unsightly tank, etc.

Monthly costs and EU's lack of experience

If this is truly a need Charlotte county should devise a better plan to roll this out versus entertaining a new company that has never done sewer. EU is owned by the same company that does the current water, and the service for the water has come under scrutiny of how they reach out to residents when there is a water main break or need for a boil water advisory, etc. If there is a spill for the sewer, they have no track record of being able to deal with this timely and effectively. It has been documented that the monthly cost for sewer will be over \$200 which coupled with the existing water cost of \$135, this is \$4,020 per year which is double what we pay for our full-time residence in Pinellas County for our family of 5.

Initial costs

We purchased our house less than 4 years ago and wanted to be good Stewards of the environment and decided at the time to replace the septic system with a new tank and drain field to ensure our house did not contribute to any wastewater issues. The proposal by EU to this new system mentions that our new system will be removed and replaced with a smaller holding tank which does not make sense. Coupled with the financial issues we have run into with Hurricane Ian, and the rising insurance costs, this is a huge financial burden for us and the other homeowners which will force many folks off the island. Additionally, the \$12,000 initial cost seems outdated and we are concerned that it will exceed this and homeowners will be forced to pay this exorbitant bill.

I hope that you will deny EU's application.

If not now, when? Our environment, specifically our waterways, are at great risk. The evidence is clear. As a local resident of Englewood, a soon to be property owner in Charlotte County (1654 Tarpon Ave), and a business owner in Charlotte County, I am in strong support for the implementation of a centralized sewer system. The current reliance on septic systems is having a detrimental effect on our local environment, community and economy.

I have two businesses in Charlotte County; one of which is real estate. When I was showing property on Little Gasparilla Island last year, after a high tide, there was clear evidence of septic waste on the road. The buyers were disgusted. The effect of this is multifaceted. First, it was a safety concern. Second, it negatively impacted the buyers (and my) desire to be on the island, let alone make an investment there. And lastly, our poor wildlife and beauty of such a place is being compromised. Shouldn't fragile, more vulnerable land such as these barrier islands be protected from septic waste? I understand that many many years ago centralized sewer systems weren't even an option but now they are. Why wouldn't we want to preserve what we have before it's negatively impacted? Our land value will hold and hopefully increase with this improvement.

The bottomline is simple: the environment, the wildlife, and our waterways are all being hurt by the lack of a centralized sewer system. Now is the time.

You know that saying, "More money, more problems"? Well, that goes with this. More people, more poop. Yikes. If not now, when? Please, please help.

Dear Commissioners,

I spoke at the FPSC hearing and sent a letter in favor of septic to sewer conversion. I was shocked to hear that we were turned down. I do not think they understood that we were requesting septic to sewer. I live on LGI, and am a full time resident. This is our only home. No second home. We built our home and moved here from Hernando County. We had a smaller home on the island and decided to live out our retirement on LGI. So we sold our vacation home and built our new home. We moved in 2010. We had to put in an ATU, County permit #273187. When we moved in we had no idea what that meant until the County came to inspect our unit and I received a bill for inspection, The inspector explained everything to me, including his opinion, "that septic to sewer would most likely be in the near future for the barrier islands." He stated that 'it would be environmentally better for our ECO SYSYTEM."

Currently, we pay the County for the permit and inspection, but they never come to inspect (we have video cameras) and we pay Martin Septic service, who do come out and inspect every 6 mo.

My concern is that currently, we only have ONE service provider, who will come out to the island to maintain and pump out our septic systems. I am asking the Board to please let us know how this will be handled if Martin Septic decides not to service our Island any longer OR if we lose the barge service needed to get service trucks over to the island. Right now the barge service comes out of ELDREDS MARINA. THEY ARE CURRENTLY UNDER CONTRACT TO SELL THE MARINA. SO THIS COULD BE A BIG PROBLEM!

It is very disappointing to know, that presently there is a company who is willing and able to establish septic to sewer conversion, who has been turned down. I am deeply concerned that we will one day, unexpectedly, have a huge problem on our hands.

I requested that the County send their contingency plan for the Island regarding Sewer systems, maintaining and assuring barge service for their trucks. To date, we have received no reply.

We would feel much better knowing that our elected officials are preparing for the future of our barrier Islands and the surrounding waters.

Dear Commissioner:

This letter is to respectfully ask that you reject the proposed central sewer system for the above-referenced barrier islands here in Charlotte County. My husband, Pete, and I bought a house at 8314 Grand Avenue on Little Gasparilla Island. We have had a second home here in Placida at Boca Vista Condos for 20 years and decided after Hurricane Ian and its damage, to sell the condo and seek another property elsewhere to escape astronomical assessments and lack of control over our surrounding complex. We were familiar with Little Gasparilla Island and were fortunate enough to be able to purchase a home here where we will be spending most of our time. We do have another property and I travel back to DeLand, Florida to take care of my real estate brokerage, but will spend our time here at our homestead; one we bought with no plans of being under another mandatory assessment of any kind. So, we have been bonafide taxpayers in Charlotte County for over 20 years.

We are in receipt of a letter outlining the proposed sewer system for LGI. We are vehemently against it for many reasons. The first being that we see no problems with the current septic systems located on individual properties. There has been no study that I am aware of to determine that the septic tanks on the island are causing any damage to the estuaries or the surrounding environment.

The second reason that I am not in support of this system is because it is owned by a for-profit company and from my understanding, this is not a large corporation with the ability to install, handle and maintain for the long haul, this type of sewer/septic system. It depends on electric power, and should there be an outage, (and there are many on the Island) the system would go down... and I shudder to think about what the outcome of that mishap could be. In addition, why does a for-profit company get to apply and perhaps be awarded with this job when it has not even been put out for bids by the County or the State? I'm not sure how that works, but one would surmise that a job of this magnitude would require a governing body to request bids by qualified contractors. I do not know this contractor/company who has made an application to put in this system, have no personal reasons to object to him/it, but only care about what happens to this Lovely Little Piece of Old Florida that we now call home.

The third reason is that this island is a piece of off-the-beaten-path paradise. There are no vehicles allowed here, with the exception of a few workers still here making repairs to homes and properties destroyed or severely damaged by Ian and Irma; this island has only sandy paths and roads (if you can call them that) which are traversed by golf carts. There is no County, State or municipal infrastructure here that would be able to support the kind of elements putting this system in would require. There are many areas of native vegetation, landscaped properties with tropical plants and trees. There is also wildlife that would and should not be disturbed by such a project, including endangered species such as the gopher tortoise, many birds, native reptiles and mammals. Tearing up the sandy paths and its accompanying easements that are home to this

vegetation, trees and wildlife would be a huge detriment to all of the home owners and inhabitants of Little Gasparilla Island., especially after almost getting back to normal after the devastation wrought by Hurricane Ian

The fourth reason is the expense that would be incurred by each homeowner: many have family homes that have been passed down through the generations and cannot afford to pay for the required hookup. Many others have a second home here and live elsewhere most of the time, so their septic tanks are rarely used. Furthermore, if a for-profit company wishes to come in and do such a project, why should any property owner bear the burden of this cost. Let that company foot the bill. The majority of the islanders do not wish to have this thrust upon them and their right to a peaceful existence, so why should they be forced to use their hard-earned resources to pay for something that is not needed nor wanted?

If a sewer system was deemed a necessity because what LGI has here is broken, then let there be studies to prove that. And, should such studies show the need, then let a municipal entity (the one who collects the majority of real estate taxes from the properties on the island) take care of the project, and do it as it is done on the mainland. I don't know alot about this proposed system, but I have read enough to understand that there are many problems that are associated with the mechanics of it. If these barrier islands are to be forced to hook up to a sewer system, it should be the same types of systems used by those provided to the residents of other parts of Charlotte County and/or the State of Florida; and this should be after a need for such a service has proven to be necessary.

As a side note: this island does not need a bridge. Everything is fine just the way it is and those of us who live here the majority of the time seem to manage just fine with our boats and taxi services or with a little help from our friends. Should our access be diminished due to the sale of the Eldred's Marina in the future, then Charlotte County should step up and provide a solution to the limited availability of parking, boat ramps and slips needed for the Island access. A bridge is certainly not the answer due to the lack of infrastructure on Little Gasparilla Island.

In closing, I wish to state my strong objection to the approval of this project and request that the application for a central sewer/septic system for these barrier islands, and in particular, Little Gasparilla Island be rejected.

Thank you for your time. I look forward to following this process and to continuing to be a voice of opposition.

My name is J. Scott Almand and I'm a homeowner on Little Gasparilla Island in Charlotte County within the proposed service area reference in **Docket #20240032-SU** currently at the PSC. I own a unit in the Hideaway Bay condominiums and I serve on the condo association board as Treasurer and Vice President.

I would like to formally request the PSC deny this application for wastewater services for the following reasons –

- 1. First and Foremost The Island is still in the process of recovering from Hurricane Ian and more disruption to the landscape would be detrimental. We do not have public, traditional roads and many are simply shell paths over private property. To try to run a sewer system without public roads or roads able to accommodate construction equipment would be almost impossible.
- 2. Owners on the island are all financially strapped to the point of "breaking" after trying to recover from Hurricane Ian and then Idalia. This would put even more of a financial burden on many residents, dare I say to the point that they can not handle.
- 3. We are a Bridgeless Barrier Island that has a unique charm. We would like it to remain that way. Approving this application will only promote more development on the Island against the residents' desires.
- 4. EU is not a contractor that has won a bid to install sewer. The PSC approves certification based solely on four criteria: need for service, financial ability of the applicant, technical expertise of the applicant and fair/equitable rates and charges. Each of the other agencies (County, DEP, Army Corps, etc.) is responsible for supervising only their specific area where regulation and/or permitting is involved. There is no performance bond required and we have no single point of recourse in the event of cost overruns or project failure.
- 5. The applicant has not addressed how the system will be serviced in the event of failure during a storm or other adverse conditions. Each homeowner would need a generator at their own expense to ensure their system continues to run.

- 6. No water quality testing has been done in our area to prove a need for sewer. This project brings the potential for destruction of habitat and interference with endangered species such as the gopher tortoise. Gopher tortoise relocation is extremely expensive, with cost estimates up to \$10,000 per individual relocation.
- 7. Finally, Expert witnesses at the last Administrative Hearing refuted the arguments that EU put forward supporting the need for service. Why are we doing this again when nothing has changed?

Specifically to Hideaway Bay Beach Club Condos — The proposed system is exactly the same as the current wastewater plant on our property that serves both HBBC and Placida Condos on LGI, just on a much larger scale. Requiring us to remove our system and connect to another system would be so unbelievably expensive and such a burden to the owners in hideaway that it might push some towards foreclosure. We have been unable to occupy or rent our units for the last 18 months as we continue to try and rebuild....this would be financially devastating to our unit owners.

My name is Heather Burns, and I am a homeowner on Little Gasparilla Island. The greatest Public Service you can provide to our island community is to deny the application for Original Certification of Authorization that Environmental Utilities, LLC (EU) has put before you in Docket No. 20240032-SU.

I don't know what exactly EU is offering as a change since being denied less than a year ago for the same Certification, but it definitely has not included community involvement or approval. I have not seen evidence of feasibility studies for implementation nor how the proposed plan is better than properly functioning septic systems for our unique environment and isolated situation.

Little Gasparilla Island is designated Rural according to Charlotte County for good reason, and has additional logistical and topographic issues compared to a mainland rural area. Not only is it a low density, bridgeless barrier island with sand paths, it doesn't have a continuous North/South platted public route. Every service, supply, and piece of equipment must be brought over by boat or barge, and the cost of this has steadily increased over the past 5 years. The cost estimates cannot be comparable to what it might cost on the mainland.

EU's proposal puts a heavy burden on individual homeowners for initial expense, including electrical requirements, and uncertain ongoing service and maintenance issues in a salt air and storm sensitive area. Stating that EU will hire the experts is just further proof that they don't have any themselves. Where will these experts be based once the system is in place? Will we need to wait for days for them to get to the island to fix issues? When there is a power outage from either a storm or a transformer exploding, FPL is often limited for how quickly they can get across to the island to make repairs. The EU option has our sewage reliant on electricity as well. If, indeed, Mr. Boyer is hoping to get this system in place and then hand it over to the County for future control and maintenance, LGI residents will be even less well-served, with no resident control or say in operations.

Well worded applications and nicely drawn diagrams do not give a full picture as to the unique nature of Little Gasparilla Island, and I respectfully ask that until such a time as there is community involvement, oversight, and a better plan for bringing sewer to the island, that you DENY this application.

There is also an initial deposit required of \$414, which is identified as 2x the estimated monthly bill. That's a total of \$13,511.00. Note that costs could exceed the estimates by large measure and homeowners will likely be saddled with additional burdens.

Average Residential Bill: The rates and tariffs submitted to the PSC shows a base rate of \$115.81 per month just to provide wastewater service. In addition, the monthly residential service charge is \$39.64 per 1000 gallons. EU estimates average household usage at 2,500 gallons/month. Based on this, the monthly billing would be \$207.00/month. However, when the PSC prepared a Rate Case summary that was distributed at the 2022 Administrative Hearing, they cited a more realistic average household usage estimate of 4,000 gals/month. Using this average the monthly billing would be \$263.57/month for wastewater service alone. This is exclusive of your water bill.

Electric: the system pump requires a separate electric panel, installed by a licensed electrician at the expense of the homeowner.

More electric: If the owner has maxed out their main electric grid with pool equipment or other large-draw items, the panel will need an expensive upgrade.

Generator: the pump has a limited capacity (60 gal) and in the event of a power outage will be unable to function for long. Homeowners will need a generator to keep the system running to avoid sewage back-up.

Tree removal: Landscaping and hardscaping around the septic area will need to be cleared at the expense of the homeowner to gain access to the crush & fill the existing septic tank and install the new one.

No pay-over-time plan: Ratepayers may need to take loans to cover the cost of connection.

Mandatory Hook-up: Charlotte County regulations require all homes to connect to central water and wastewater within 1 year of availability.

No grandfathering of septic systems: regardless of age or condition.

No "contractor" and no single point of general oversight: EU is not a contractor that has won a bid to install sewer. The PSC approves certification based solely on four criteria: need for service, financial ability of the applicant, technical

expertise of the applicant and fair/equitable rates and charges. Each of the other agencies (County, DEP, Army Corps, etc.) is responsible for supervising only their specific area where regulation and/or permitting is involved. There is no performance bond required and we have no single point of recourse in the event of cost overruns or project failure.

Access to homes: Some properties have physical constraints that will complicate how the applicant gains access to the property without leaving the boundaries or damaging the grounds.

Disruption of traffic: Vehicles have only one point of entry/egress -- the car ferry. With normal traffic, service and construction trucks, delays at the ferry line in season can be an hour or more. This project could result in years of traffic issues.

New easement giveaway: Most utility easements are placed in the road right-of-way. EU has claimed ownership of a utility easement that will go from the sewer equipment, located near the house to the connection in the road without compensating the homeowner.

System maintenance and emergencies: The applicant has not addressed how the system will be serviced in the event of failure during a storm or other adverse conditions.

Lifespan of the equipment: Salt air takes a heavy toll on mechanical and electrical equipment here. Equipment will need replacing when it fails, possibly at 5-year intervals. This proposal places too much responsibility on the homeowner at too great a cost.

Environmental concerns: No water quality testing has been done in our area to prove a need for sewer. This project brings the potential for destruction of habitat and interference with endangered species such as the gopher tortoise.

Potential of sewer spill in the Intracoastal: The risk of a central sewer leak with a subaqueous crossing is greater than the risk of one or more septic systems developing leaks.

Please STOP this ridiculous ask!

My name is John Granger and I am a property owner on Little Gasparilla Island. The address is: 8050 Little Gasparilla Island, Placida, FL 33946. I live on the north end of LGI, dock #4. I am formally requesting the Public Service Commission (PSC) deny Environmental Utilities (EU) application for wastewater service. The basis for my request is as follows:

- 1. EU will be owned and operated by the same people and organization that handles Little Gasparilla Water Utilities (LGWU). The water service on the island is very expensive and water quality is generally poor. We have chronic problem with "iron bacteria" which causes an orangish ring in toilets and sinks. I have complained several times but was told not much they can do about it. It is supposedly harmless but still gross. I believe the cause is lack of chlorine in the water and lack of a continuous flow loop. We are at the end of a long radial line and so water gets stagnant and conditions get worse during the summer heat.
- 2. I would like to see an implementation plan that prioritizes removal of septic systems based on condition, age and size (north end condos should go first). Houses with newer septic systems and designed/installed correctly would be required to connect after some reasonable time (e.g. 10 years)
- 3. Due to the critical nature of the wastewater system, the design needs to be very robust and should be performed by a Professional Engineer that specializes in wastewater systems and equipment. It's recommended and an Independent Engineer performs a design and installation review.
- 4. Operations and Maintenance (O&M) processes and procedures need to be developed that are specific to LGI. This needs to include off-normal procedures for expected equipment problems and a Emergency Response Plan for major failures, pipe breaks, or Hurricane.
- 5. A good cost estimate for each property should be provided. This will be tough to swallow with cost of everything sky rocketing. LGI residents pay extremely high taxes considering the very limited services on the island. There is basically no fire or police (needs to come by boat), no school access/busses, no roads or bridges to repair. Is there a way that residents can receive some sort of tax break to offset the sewer costs?

In summary, I think we all want to help the environment we are destroying so a wastewater system would be a good thing. However, due to its critical nature and location, it has to be very well planned, designed, installed, and operated. I do not think the proposed owner/operator is capable of this and EU application should be denied.

I own multiple properties on Little Gasparilla Island, specifically 8630 Wharf Avenue, 8556 Little Gasparilla Island, 8554 Little Gasparilla Island, 8558 Little Gasparilla Island, 8618 Marsh Street. I am asking that you deny Environmental Utilities Wastewater Application Docket #20240032-SU.

This is the second time we have had to fight the same illogical proposal for an inadequate, antiquated system by the same person. In addition to denying this application, please, please, please do not let him submit again.

The following are the main reasons to deny this application.

A. Will there be destruction of protected native wildlife and foliage - YES.

- B. Does Jack Boyer (EU) have the technical expertise and/or financial ability to run this project and provide ongoing services NO as evidenced by the state of Little Gasparilla Water Utility. (Also a Jack Boyer private company)
- C. Is there a need for this particular service NO. This is the wrong system to fix a problem that has not been proven to be caused by the current systems in place. Removal of the current sewage systems will cause massive destruction to our ecosystem. Replacing the septic tanks with a septic tank and pump system only removes liquids, not solids. The mechanical parts are going to need constant maintenance in this atmosphere with far more opportunity for spills. What is next? Dear Commissioners,

Our names are Bryan and Cyndy Barney. We are residents/owners of 8654 Wharf Ave. on Little Gasparilla Island. We are asking that you deny the application for certificate to provide wastewater service in Charlotte County(CC) by Environmental Utilities, LLC (EU).

In the two years we have owned our property, this is the second time we have had to fight the same illogical proposal for an inadequate, antiquated system by the same person. In addition to denying this application, please, please, please do not let him submit again.

We realize you have many objection letters to review, so we included a summary of the very unnecessary, very long, very stressful, very expensive ordeal that Jack Boyer is putting us through followed by 1/10th of the detail I would like to include.

Summary:

- A. Does EU have the technical expertise and/or financial ability to run this project and provide timely ongoing services NO.
- B. Is there a need for this particular service NO. This is the wrong system to fix a problem that has not been proven to be caused by the current systems in place.
- C. Will there be destruction of protected native wildlife and foliage YES. The removal of the current septic systems and subsequent installation of the new will decimate the protected flora and fauna that have managed to fight their way back after the hurricanes.
- D. Are the costs reasonable to ask the property owners to pay? NO. If the environment is really EU's main concern, they should be willing to become a Non-profit Public Utility.
- E. Do we want Jack Boyer to have Perpetual use of our land? NO
- F. Where is Jack Boyer? Can't be found
- G. Do we get a vote? You are our vote. Please help.

A. Lack of technical expertise and/or financial ability to run this project and provide ongoing services.

1. There is a lack of faith in EU to run a utility based on Mr. Boyer's history with LGI Water Utility (LGWUO. Mr. Boyer has proven that he cannot adequately operate a public utility as evidenced by his current and past operation of LGWU. A lot of these concerns were brought to the PSC attention previously. Some of the issues were shoddy work; repairs made with duct tape, pipes not buried to the proper depth; unavailability of LGWU employees during water pipe breaks; lack of timely boil water notices, water pipes crossing through property lines without permission; excessive lengths of time from request for service to the repairs being made (if at all).

We have personal experience with this. The water main in front of our house is frequently hit by carts going by. It is raised above the surface level of the path. We requested that it be repaired over two years ago. Amazingly, now that this proposal is before you, someone showed up and changed out the box around the shutoff so it looks "pretty". They did NOTHING to fix it the problem, only make it prettier. It is now higher above ground and more of a hazard. If they are currently taking all of the profit from LGWU and putting it in their pocket instead of investing in staff and repairs for the water system, why would we think they would do anything different with the new utility they are creating. They have learned

that they can do this without any recourse from those of us funding it.

- 2. The LGWU office is operating on antiquated equipment. They can't even take an electronic payment for the quarterly fees. They want more than double the number of properties they currently service when they can't handle the current load.
- The owners of EU don't have any experience or licensing for wastewater.
- 4. EU has less than \$5,000 in the bank. They don't want anyone to know what other resources they have as evidenced by the redaction of the financial information. What are the Boyer's hiding? Have they made so much money off the backs of residents from LGWU that they are afraid to show their financials?

The Boyers are the sole owners of what should be a public utility.

Is this smart? NO

B. Is there a need for this particular system? NO, it is not the correct system.

- 1. While there is a need for a centralized waste removal system, this is not the correct system. This system does not remove all waste, only wastewater. The septic "tank" would still need to be pumped thereby not alleviating one of the challenges of septic tanks. I haven't made it through all 493 pages of the application, but, it has come to my attention that the only one permitted to fix or maintain these systems is EU. This creates a monopoly, not to mention the fact that they have NO experience with this type of system. They can't even maintain the "Public" Utility that they currently have.
- Jack Boyer included information from Dr. Brian Lapointe about the need for a central sewer system. While he has many valid points, I didn't see anywhere in his information that the system proposed is the correct system. He did not indicate which type of Central System would cure the issues he listed.
- 3. The proposed system relies on an electric pump. Water was transported to LGI by many different means following Hurricane Ian. While some people were able to get their wells functioning and run them from generators, most were

- without water for weeks. This was an Act of God and therefore, I don't hold Jack Boyer responsible. However, if the proposed sewage system had been in place, there would have been no sewage disposal available and there would have been a much, much larger problem on the island and the surrounding waters!
- 4. The septic systems in place have been working very well if maintained properly. There has been no proof that the problems in the Bay have been caused by septic system overflow. There are many different contributing factors that are not being addressed and certainly not cured with this system. In the meantime, wildlife and plant life are thriving.

This is NOT the correct system.

C. Will there be destruction of protected native wildlife and foliage -YES.

- 1. The paths will be decimated. This was evident during the recovery efforts after Ian and Idalia (which are ongoing). Heavy equipment was necessary for many reasons including, but not limited to, cleanup and rebuilding. The paths were destroyed and the residents were left to repair them on their own. Jack Boyer is proposing that he have unlimited access to all Rights of Way. He is proposing to clear the entire width of Rights of Way. Currently, our path is approximately 10 feet wide with foliage on both sides. Our right of way is 40 ft wide. He will be removing mature trees that are necessary for maintaining the ecosystem and protecting the island from storms. The equipment necessary for this type of project will cause the same problems with the paths as it did after Ian. Ian was an ACT of GOD. Jack Boyer does not have the right to play God.
- 2. Oh, and by the way, he wants perpetual access to our property. God only knows what he will do to our beautiful trees! Our remaining trees have struggled since the hurricanes. We have done our best to help them recover. They are not his, nor will we sit by and let him remove them. We do NOT grant him access to even look at our property, let alone walk on it and destroy it.
- 3. The Island's Gopher Tortoises (Gopherus polyphemus) will be decimated by this type of activity. They have had a hard enough time recovering after lan and then Idalia. Are they not protected from Jack Boyer? Islanders and visitors alike are

very, very careful to take care of the Gopher Tortoise population. There are many other species that will also be affected.

D. Are the costs reasonable to ask the property owners to pay? - NO.

- 1. Up-front costs in the submission: There are many concerns about the cost of this project. Prices quoted by EU total \$13,511.00 for up-front costs. The prices estimated in the CC Sewer Master Plan (SMP) are significantly higher and listed in 2017 dollars. Costs at LGI would be \$22,540.00 based on occupied lots. These figures assume the transmission lines that EU is responsible for installing according to the CC Bulk Sewer Agreement are included in each area calculations. If, EU was able to secure the permitting to put the sewer line through two areas that are vital to the ecosystem, Don Pedro State Park and the mangrove islands between the mainland & the barrier islands. only one transmission line would be necessary. In that case, the average cost based on 964 ERC's would be \$20,722.12. Again these numbers are based on 2017 dollars. Construction costs have increased between 19 - 37 % since 2020. That would more than double EU's stated costs based on the CC SMP figures. We don't feel that EU has any idea what the monetary costs will be and less idea of the environmental impact of the construction. (Or maybe Jack just doesn't care). I don't find these up-front costs to be worth the damage that will be caused to the ecosystem for a system that is no better and probably worse for the environment than the septic systems we have.
- 2. Up front costs not addressed in the submission: They include: Electrician & electrical upgrades; barge fees for pump trucks & fill material when removing the current septic; landscaping costs; back up generators; loss of use of the homes while this is ongoing, interest costs on loans. Because EU is a for profit company, the island residents are also not able to defray the costs of the sewers using grants, bonds or MSBU's. The cost of a loan becomes a personal expense that cannot be transferred with the property if sold.

3. Ongoing costs:

a. Monthly charge from Jack Boyer: Who knows what the monthly bill for the sewer will be? An estimate of the monthly bill is a minimum of \$200 per month with additional usage fees.

- b. Pump out charges....according to epa.gov, the typical septic tank needs pumped every 3-5 years. The type of system proposed should be pumped, repaired and inspected every year. More importantly, the pump out trucks would need to be at every home every year....what will that do to our environment?
- c. Maintenance of the system at our home: According to the EPA, "A service contract is important since alternative systems have mechanized parts". As we, the residents, know, mechanized means broken on LGI since the salt air and water is particularly harmful to mechanized equipment. Jack Boyer is requesting the exclusive right to service these systems...this creates a monopoly in addition to him having NO experience with this type of system.
- 4. The regular property owner cannot afford these additional costs. This is highlighted as we struggle to carry inflated costs for property insurances (flood, windstorm, and homeowners), increasing Charlotte County property taxes with precious little services to LGI, and our ever increasing private water supply utility service charges. This is also on top of the FACT that we are still rebuilding our property after destruction from Hurricane lan!
- 5. If the health of the island and Bay are really the reason to do this project, then EU should be willing to become a Non-profit public utility.

E. Perpetual Use of our Land

Jack is asking for new easements, rights of Way, etc. onto our property. There is no reason for him to have perpetual right to our property since there is no reason for this type of system. He is making us responsible for all costs, but wants our property too? This doesn't make sense.

F. Where is Jack Boyer?

Jack Boyer is nowhere to be found. He hasn't been seen on this island in months. Does he care about this island and the others included in his reign of destruction? Has he asked for input from residents? Has he held a "town hall" meeting to talk to residents? The answer to all of these is an emphatic NO.

G. Do we get a Vote?

We as property owners do not get a vote since it is approved/denied by the Commission. We <u>BEG</u> you to do the RIGHT thing. This application MUST be denied and Jack Boyer must be barred from submitting another application. He is abusing the time and money of the Taxpayers, The Commission, the County, and the property owners to the detriment of this protected piece of "Old Florida".

Attempting to fix one problem while creating multiple, more devastating problems is not smart!

We are formally requesting an administrative hearing by the PSC for this application and to become, an intervenor and/or party of record.

I, Louise Volpe, am the owner of property on Little Gasparilla Island within the proposed service area for Environmental Utilities, LLC (EU) application to provide wastewater service. My properties are located at 9842 Little Gasparilla Island and 9848 Little Gasparilla Island.

I am writing to object and oppose this APPLICATION FOR ORIGINAL CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORIZATION AND INITIAL RATES AND CHARGES FOR WASTEWATER SERVICE (the Application). I request that you DENY the Application. The Application does not demonstrate sufficient need for service, and the application and service are not in the public interest.

My family has owned property on Little Gasparilla Island since 1963. Like me, many of the homeowners have held property on LGI for decades. I have installed a private septic system at significant personal expense, and maintain this system in good operation. Eliminating the raised drain field will not provide an environmental benefit. And the risk of environmental hazard from the low-pressure system outweighs any potential benefit from the system.

The Application has not provided sufficient demonstration of need for the proposed service. The applicant has not received any approvals from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection or the Southwest Florida Water Management District. The Application relies on general statements about removal of septic systems on barrier islands as the basis for need for service. It references service needs for failing systems and septic to sewer conversions as a basis for need. However, this is irrelevant because the proposed low-pressure system does not remove septic systems. If systems are in failure, the low pressure system will not cure those defects. Further, in the event of power loss (which occurs often on LGI) the low pressure system could fail causing back-ups and septic failures and resulting in increased environmental risk. In short, the justification for the application need is unrelated to the proposed system and irrelevant. The Application does not demonstrate need.

The proposed low pressure sewer system would be overly burdensome on the homeowners of Little Gasparilla Island. The proposed connection fees (over \$13,000) and proposed rates of over \$250/month are extremely high and a financial burden to many of the owners. These onerous rates would be among the highest in the state and cause an extreme hardship on many of the owners.

I stand with many of my neighbors in opposing this Application. It would not provide the intended benefit and the costs surely outweigh any anticipated benefit. The only one that stands to benefit is the utility owner. Thank you for your consideration of these comments. We respectfully request that you DENY the Application.

I request that you DENY the Application. The Application does not demonstrate sufficient need for service, and the application and service are not in the public interest.

My family has owned property on Little Gasparilla Island since 1963. Like me, many of the homeowners have held property on LGI for decades. I have installed a private septic system at significant personal expense, and maintain this system in good operation. Eliminating the raised drain field will not provide an environmental benefit. And the risk of environmental hazard from the low-pressure system outweighs any potential benefit from the system.

The Application has not provided sufficient demonstration of need for the proposed service. The applicant has not received any approvals from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection or the Southwest Florida Water Management District. The Application relies on general statements about removal of septic systems on barrier islands as the basis for need for service. It references service needs for failing systems and septic to sewer conversions as a basis for need. However, this is irrelevant because the proposed low-pressure system does not remove septic systems. If systems are in failure, the low pressure system will not cure those defects. Further, in the event of power loss (which occurs often on LGI) the low pressure system could fail causing back-ups and septic failures and resulting in increased environmental risk. In short, the justification for the application need is unrelated to the proposed system and irrelevant. The Application does not demonstrate need.

The proposed low pressure sewer system would be overly burdensome on the homeowners of Little Gasparilla Island. The proposed connection fees (over \$13,000) and proposed rates of over

\$250/month are extremely high and a financial burden to many of the owners. These onerous rates would be among the highest in the state and cause an extreme hardship on many of the owners.

I stand with many of my neighbors in opposing this Application. It would not provide the intended benefit and the costs surely outweigh any anticipated benefit. The only one that stands to benefit is the utility owner. Thank you for your consideration of these comments. We respectfully request that you DENY the Application.

Dear Clerk and Commissioners,

We are writing to you to let you know that we oppose the approval of the application by EU, LLC to install and manage the sewer project on the barrier island chain in southwest Florida which would encompass the islands of Palm Island, Don Pedro Island, and Little Gasparilla Island. For the record, we are owners on Little Gasparilla Island. Our opposition starts with the previously and often stated arguments of:

- **-Need for Service.** There has been no evidence provided that supports a need for service in the proposed service area. Expert witnesses at the last Administrative Hearing refuted the arguments that EU put forward supporting the need for service.
- **-Environmental.** No water quality testing has been done in our area to prove a need for sewer. This project brings the potential for destruction of habitat and interference with endangered species such as the gopher tortoise.
- -Providing utilities is the way local government promotes high-density development. Our barrier islands are in a Rural Service Area. The Charlotte County Comp Plan mandates on-site septic systems for the Rural Service Area. Now they are insisting that the Comp Plan prohibits the County from installing central sewer, but not a privately owned utility.
- **-We would be forced to give up our private property rights for free**. You will be forced to give up easement rights across your property without compensation.
- **-Traffic Congestion.** The combination of post-storm rebuilds, new home construction, and tourist traffic during season has made wait lines at the ferry both unpredictable and outrageous. Now, consider the heavy equipment and materials transport needed to construct an island-wide central sewer system. And how long it will take to build.
- **-The Costs.** The costs of central sewer are quite considerable at a very bad time for Islanders. Many are still engaged with fighting their insurance companies for settlements

from Hurricane Ian and have had to lay out large sums for their re-builds while they wait for compensation. Some owners have just paid deep-pocket sums to install new septic systems at their newly built or re-built homes. Many property owners simply do not have the resources available to convert from septic to sewer.

Additionally, there are other concerns:

Has this system, which is designed for single dwelling use and has one tank per lot, been successfully deployed on a much larger scale? What were the results?

The person behind EU, LLC, is also the person behind the Little Gasparilla Water Company. We have grave concerns of one individual having majority control/power over our utilities. The current water company is not very responsive to service requests and I fear the same will happen with the sewer company if owned and operated by same individual.

A bigger concern of ours is the current lack of routine testing of water quality in relation to septic tank waste and the absence of ongoing septic system inspections beyond the initial permitting and installation inspection.

I am an owner at Hideaway Beach Club on Little Gasperilla Island- Troy and Stacey Noor E4. My condo is condemned. Our insurance company-Citizens a non-profit owned by the State of Florida for Florida Citzens has demanded we get an adjuster, an appraiser and now finally an umpire. Our umpire found 18.1 million of damage, the 3rd party umpire agreed that Citzens needs to pay us 15.9 million dollars. Shame on politics and the State of Florida. Citizens is now not paying and our buildings are missing siding and windows as we head into our 2nd hurricane season!!! As more details are uncovered, I need to emphasize the issue of why we must deny EU their desire to be a provider. On record, our island has not been a source of leakage in Florida. This sewer installation could provide maybe an inconsequential impact of a clean water solution for a gigantic cost, grief, uncertainty and inconvenience to individual owners. There isn't much land to install a new tank in a spot apart from the septic tank while transitioning. Will we be without sewage disposal for a spell? Replacing a perfectly fine tank and drainage with grinders and pipes run by electricity prone to outages is not an improvement. Our individual septics are much safer than new lines to carry the waste water from curvy shell roads (which are finally graded by the County) across two lagoons and the inter coastal waterway. The intercoastal waterway is used continuously by the car access ferry a minimum of 16 hours a day, subject to boat traffic and strong tides. Isn't a drainage septic system servicing this unique bridgeless barrier island a wiser solution?

We already pay the highest rates for water in Florida through a private business seeking every rate hike possible. Must we also be subjected to the excessive rates threatened by EU, yet another private service provider, for negligible improvement of waste waters? I don't want EU to reap a premium rate for what has historically been their problematic and subpar installation processes and subsequent service. Why must we be made vulnerable to a contractor setting up a business that hints of intent to resell the service?

We have been residents of Little Gasparilla Island since 1995 when we purchased our condo unit at Hideaway Bay Beach Club Condo. Our association operates its own batch sewer plant and provides this service to a neighboring association, Placida Beach Club Condo. Together, our 103 units and Placida Beach Club's 30 unit constitutes a significant percentage of the island residents. We are guessing about 20% of Little Gasparilla Island.

Bringing up the sewer utility issue again comes at a time when many residents are still struggling to recover from Hurricane Ian. Our condo unit is still not habitable. Repairs ground to a halt when Citizens Property Insurance Company offered a ridiculously low settlement offer and we have been fighting them ever since. The excessive cost of appraiser and the umpire is not covered by insurance and we will be left to burden the expense on our own. That is on top of the high windstorm deductible on our policy. The possible legal fees that we may have to incur to recover insurance proceeds that we are entitled to could be the straw that breaks the camels back. Now we are faced with very significant costs that will come our way if you move forward with the private sewer utility. We feel that putting this on our backs now is completely uncalled for and insensitive.

We can't say that we are informed on this particular attempt to bring the sewer utility to Little Gasparilla Island. As we said, our home is not habitable and we don't get mail frequently since we have to make a special trip to retrieve our mail. As of two weeks ago, we received no official notification from anyone. As such, we have relied on social media for our information. That source is hardly reliable. Our community needs time to figure out just what is being proposed. We may need legal representation that we haven't put in place yet.

One of the things that we have heard through social media is that the proposed utility company intends to utilize the batch plant existing at Hideaway Bay Beach Club in their system. How can that be when no one has contacted the board that represents our association? Our contact information is filed with the State of Florida Bureau of Condominiums, so it's is easy to find us. How will that benefit us? It doesn't appear that our association will receive any services that we don't already provide for ourselves.

In summary, the timing of this proposal is poor at best. Please relieve us of the battle that would surely come with this proposition. This is not the first time we addressed this type of a project, so we know that it is contentious. Let us rebuild our home and our community and recover from the overwhelming economic consequences that come with the rebuilding process. Our board members are volunteers that have their hands full already without worrying on how to best represent our association in your proceedings. Don't put this back on the docket until the community has a chance to get the facts of the proposal without relying on social media. In blunt terms, please work for the best efforts of our community rather than the business interest of private enterprise. Now is not the time for this proposal!

We are writing this email to strongly oppose Environmental Utilities (EU) providing waste water service to Little Gasparilla Island in Charlotte County, we are homeowners on the island at Hideaway Bay Beach Club Condos.

EU was denied a similar application two years ago, my question is what has changed? Other than the devastation incurred by hurricane Ian, which at Hideaway Bay Beach Club we have not started the rebuild process.

Another question would be what expertise does EU claim to have in building and maintaining a waste water service? Have the easements been established? To hook up to the sewer which would be required within 1 year at an estimated cost of \$13,000 per home seems excessive.

The sewer system would only remove waste water and not solids, which would need to be pumped out at the owner's expense. What other waste system in the state only does the waste water? And the proposed quarterly cost would be the highest in the state of Florida and a burden to all the owners.

As proposed, if the electric goes out there is only a 6 hour window to get the system back up and running, needing to have back-up generators at whose cost? and who will be on the island to monitor this?

Previously our association was considered its own utility since we have a working septic system, which is maintained by a class A company, NES. This time it is proposed that our septic be converted to a lifting station which would result in having to decommission the current septic system for a price tag of around \$1 million dollars. It is just not fair to expect 102 owners to pay this bill. It would be extremely devastating to both our community and island.

For the above reasons and many others that were previously stated 2 years ago, we do not feel it would benefit our small island and would be unjust and not equitable for owners to pay for a system that is simply not needed.

I, Joann Guagliardo, and my husband Frank are homeowners of several properties on Little Gasparilla Island (LGI) which is in the proposed service area in Environmental Utilities (EU) central sewer proposal.

We formally request that the PSC deny EU's application for original certification of authorization for this proposed central sewer system.

We strongly object to EUs proposal and application for certification. We request an administrative hearing be held before a ruling on the application. We also request status as a Party of Record so that we can participate in legal proceedings.

We as homeowners do not need this service or request this service.

We have many concerns regarding this proposal. We are retired seniors who have been homeowners of LGI for more than 20 years.

- -First and foremost we invested in our current septic system which has served us very well throughout the years. This new proposed system is not needed and very expensive and adds additional burden for us as homeowners.
- -It is our understanding that the connection charge of this system is estimated between \$13,000 to \$20,000 per homeowner and monthly cost estimated at nearly \$200. An electric panel separate from our home will also be needed with additional cost.
- -We as the homeowner will also need to invest in a generator to avoid sewage back up in the event of power outages. This is very concerning as power outages occur frequently on our island. Also, Hurricane Ian in 2022 was devastating for our island. We are still recovering from this major hurricane with our home still in repair.

My name is Candyce Cohen and I am a full-time, year-round resident of Don Pedro Island in the proposed service area having first purchased a home here in 1990. My primary and only residence is on Don Pedro Island. I am writing to request that you **DENY** this latest EU application for Service.

NOT A DEVELOPER

I am writing to this commission, once again, to ask that you DENY Environmental Utilities LLC's (EU) application to provide wastewater service to this area. I wrote you once before and spoke to you at a local hearing just two short years ago. I reviewed the application to see what if anything has changed and not a lot has. I do not the application has the support of several developers including one who submitted 21 separate letters requesting service and another who sent in 3 along with a handful of Little Gasparilla Island owners. Reviewing the docket to date, I see more multiple submissions from another 4 developers – one with 7 letters, another with 4 letters, then 3 letters. Reviewing the supporters, I see only a half dozen individual homeowners requesting service and one is the daughter of EU's principal, Jack Boyer. One EU supporter blamed 17 deaths on raw sewage from septic overflow on Little Gasparilla Island following Hurricane Ian. I know the hurricane was devastating, but I somehow missed this headline.

My husband and I are NOT developers, we're just islanders who have worked hard to build our dream home here. We support the Bocilla Islands Conservancy, pick up litter on the beach and try to help neighbors in need and keep our septic tank inspected and maintained.

SEWAGE FLOWS VIA PUMP EXCEPT WHEN POWER IS OUT - THEN IT OVERFLOWS

Hurricane lan's devastating landfall on the barrier islands has taken a significant toll, costing islanders a lot of time, money and emotion in rebuilding. Many have not been able to complete due to challenges with insurance carriers. The power and water outages for over a week following landfall were difficult, but I remain thankful that we were not on the central sewer solution such as the one proposed by EU which requires each property owner to have electricity to pump waste out of what is essentially a small holding tank. Loss of power for any extended period would lead to an environmental disaster as these much smaller tanks are all connected.



Their units do not have an emergency power receptacle. In the event of a power outage, if they need to perform an emergency pump down, they would hardwire the system.

During the last three hurricane seasons, there were instances where the power was out for up to three days. For the commercial properties, it was the property owner's responsibility to pump down their own system. For the single family homeowners, it was the County's responsibility to pump down the systems. However, the County advised the residents to pop the top on the clean out and let the sewage flow in the yard so that it would not back up into the house. The county did not go out to pump down the units with a generator.

The pumps had some maintenance issues as well. After about 6-8 years, the pumps began to have problems. They found that the ABS Piranha 09 model had fewer problems than the E-one. The E-one pumps had some manufacturer defects that the manufacturer replaced. The source of the problem was a defect that allowed water to enter the section of the station lid where the electrical components were housed, resulting in electrical failures.


With the landfall of Hurricane lan, sewage spills have not made the top headlines, but the state PNP (Pollution Notice Reporting) publishes sewer and wastewater spills. Since 2019 Charlotte County had more than 120 spills with nearly 6.6m gallons of wastewater lost to the environment. In the past 2 years, there have been an additional 40k gallons of wastewater across 5 spills from lift stations and pumps failing. Of this, a mere 300 gallons was recovered. The rest went into our land and waterways. In the past 30 days, there have additional incidents registered in Charlotte County.

The devastation from these bulk sewage spills has proven far-reaching impacts to our water quality, many multiples of the impact from low density septic tank usage.


> 120 Charlotte County Sewage Spills (since 2019) of nearly 6.6m gallons of Wastewater



WATER QUALITY AND NITROGEN LEVELS

No local water studies have shown that septic tanks are damaging island waters—but CCU's own Sewer Master Plan shows groundwater and watershed flows. Higher nitrogen levels are found in both fertilizer and reclaimed wastewater used to irrigate the several golf courses that flow directly into Lemon Bay. This nitrogen-rich runoff also exacerbates any red tide issues.

If the county is focused on local water quality, Charlotte County Utilities (CCU) would follow the lead of neighboring Sarasota, Manatee and Lee counties and prioritize work with Charlotte Harbor's National Estuary Program (CHNEP) to upgrade wastewater treatment to Advanced Wastewater Treatment (AWT) standards reducing excess nutrient in reclaimed wastewater – again which all flow into Lemon Bay. In the wake of Hurricane Ian, several wastewater treatment plants around the state dumped raw sewage into Florida Waterways. From the October 2, 2022 Bloomberg article highlighting the service area, note the sewage is flowing through the passes into the gulf and NOT from the individual island septic tanks.

In these articles, Professor LaPointe makes his position clear – that billions will need to be spent on sewer infrastructure for many of these urban areas. Urban does not describe our barrier island community.

Charlotte County has a third of the population density of the counties to our north and south. Our islands do not support high-rise, multifamily nor commercial developments. Our delicate island environment is at much greater risk of pollution from centralized sewage spills than any low-density septic tank issues.

The counties north and south acknowledge sewage spills happen and have focused on protecting sensitive estuaries by implementing Advanced Wastewater Treatment to reduce excess nitrogen and nutrients in reclaimed water.

Charlotte County Utilities should prioritize upgrading to AWT standards removing redtide fueling nutrient from wastewater before dismantling functioning low-density tanks (OSTDS).

The cost of these upgrades can be offset in full or in part with Clean Water / Clean Waterways funding and grants. EU as a private, "for-profit" BNN Bloomberg

"I'd say this is going to be unprecedented," LaPointe said in a phone interview. "We are anticipating seeing a number of these algal blooms in the wake of Hurricane Ian."

One model the state could look to in the future is in the Florida Keys. Monroe County spent about \$1 billion on a septic-to-sewer upgrade that included new, tightly sealed pipes to keep stormwater out and an advanced wastewater treatment system to remove nitrogen, preventing algal blooms that damage coral reefs. The water is then injected more than 3,000 feet underground, LaPointe said. The area reported no sewage spills after Irma, despite being flooded, he added.

"This is really where I think Florida is going to be heading in the future," LaPointe said. "We are going to have to spend billions of dollars in many of these urban areas."

limited liability "utility" has no standing to garner Clean Water / Clean Waterways funds. The nature of a Limited Liability Corporation providing this service provides no recourse to the public or the county for any costly mistakes and does not meet criteria for Clean Water grants or other financing alternatives. The limited liability nature of the LLC limits public and private funding opportunities.

Central sewer provided by an inexperienced, private, for-profit entity and NOT by a qualified, municipal utility is NOT REASONABLE environmentally or economically.

THE NEED IS GREED

We have yet to see evidence and testing documenting the NEED for a septic to sewer migration. Where is reporting that our local water quality issues result from individual septic tanks versus the millions of gallons of fertilizer-enriched, reclaimed wastewater runoff from a half dozen local golf courses and green lawns on the mainland into Lemon Bay? None of this is addressed in EU'a application rather continuing to reference East Coast/Urban waterways. And "urban" does not come close to describing our barrier island community - at least so long as the developers who have been writing in support are not successful convincing the County to change

zoning in our community. This is just one concern of seeing so many developers pushing

endorsing the EU service ... is their end game to develop properties as platted or to change zoning on the islands to increase density and commercial activities? If I wanted to live on Ft. Myers Beach or Siesta Key, I would have moved there and I don't want to see our county leaders swayed by wealthy developers to change zoning and forever change our community and love of the natural environment we have here.

For the record, it is rare than an islander considers uses sod as most embrace Florida Native landscaping options. In fact, the islands under encouragement of Bocilla Islands Conservancy Inc, the island is now a Certified Community Wildlife Habitat. We are very proud of our care of the environment and can't imagine the devastation to and disruption of our wildlife habitat proposed by EU.



CONCLUSION:

I want to be able to continue living in my island home, but I already pay amongst the highest water rates in the state to a private utility. Even considering another private utility much less a Limited Liability Corporate for sewer service with no ability to make use of Clean Water grants and funding options is an incomprehensible proposition our county is promoting.

Before considering disruption to our carefully protected environment, we would need to see evidence of the need for service from our LOCAL waters – not some urban, East Coast studies – and evidence that water quality issues are attributable to low density septic tanks – and not the millions of gallons of nitrogen-enriched runoff from commercial activities surrounding Lemon Bay, If these were our actual conditions, the our county should not shirk responsibility and subject our residents to another private, for-profit company with scant experience. Counties to the north and south have undertaken improvements to reduce nitrogen levels in their treated water thereby reducing the nitrogen-load of reclaimed water runoff into Lemon Bay.

We just went through this process less than 2 years ago and we still have yet to see EVIDENCE of the need for this project from our LOCAL, LOW DENSITY Waters. In that time, we endured Hurricane Ian, rebuild to whatever extent possible our homes and our lives and here we are again facing another round with EU

- still a private for-private LLC
- still with scant to no experience
- still with no access to funding/grants for municipalities who undertaking these projects
- still with no guarantee other than it is a for-profit company that will always take the highest rate increases available.

EU offers neither a SAFE, REASONABLE nor RELIABLE solution for our community. For all the reasons I have stated, I respectfully ask that the commission **DENY** EU's request for service.

We are property owners on Little Gasparilla Island, specifically at 8594 Marsh Ave, Placidia, Fl. 33946. We are writing to express our strong opposition to the proposed central sewer project on Little Gasparilla Island. We are formally requesting that the Public Service Commission deny the application for wastewater service proposed by Environmental Utilities, LLC. It appears this request is not driven by the needs of the island, but only to benefit a business that has no experience installing sewers. The proposed project has major implications and costs to the environment and island residents. Our major concerns include:

- 1. As homeowners, we have major concerns about mandatory hookup requirements. We are not willing or able to pay extraordinary costs to convert to a new system when there is nothing wrong with our current septic that we maintain. We are not willing or able to pay the cost of additional electric service if and the potential cost of installing a new or added panel. We see this as an unwarranted and expensive complication of what has been a simple, affordable, and reliable septic system that we have used for decades without any problems.
- 2. The proposed monthly residential cost for service is reported to be extremely high and not acceptable. The rates being discussed are above and beyond current rates on the mainland and would be a totally new monthly expense for Little Gasparilla Island homeowners.
- 3. The proposed system's reliability and maintenance is unproven. Environmental Utilities, LLC has not demonstrated any technical expertise with this type of project, nor do they have a proven record that they can safely and reliably service the proposed system. If a central sewer system is proven to be an urgent need for the barrier islands, it should be installed and

maintained as a municipal project with county and state officials responsible and accountable for the project's oversite and success.

- 4. The installation of sewer lines, tanks, and pumps at each property presents a large and immediate impact to the nature and landscape of the island. This disruption has the potential to harm our local wildlife, such as our cherished gopher tortoise population, which is included in the Florida Endangered and Threatened Species List. The installation project activities would also endanger and damage the island's vegetation that we have carefully and thoughtfully maintained for decades. The ongoing risk to the environment due to future potential system failures in the event of storms is much greater and more severe than the current private property septic system. One storm can cause much more environmental harm in the event of damage to a central sewer system than to a residential septic tank.
- 5. The need for electric pumps at each property presents a new burden on Little Gasparilla Island's electricity supply. We have concerns that this burden on the existing electrical infrastructure could lead to a risk of fires. A proliferation of propane generators being used to prevent sewer back up in case of power outages also presents an increased risk of fires on Little Gasparilla Island.

I, Louise Volpe, am the owner of property on Little Gasparilla Island within the proposed service area for Environmental Utilities, LLC (EU) application to provide wastewater service. My properties are located at 9842 Little Gasparilla Island and 9848 Little Gasparilla Island.

I am writing to object and oppose this APPLICATION FOR ORIGINAL CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORIZATION AND INITIAL RATES AND CHARGES FOR WASTEWATER SERVICE (the Application). I request that you DENY the Application. The Application does not demonstrate sufficient need for service, and the application and service are not in the public interest.

My family has owned property on Little Gasparilla Island since 1963. Like me, many of the homeowners have held property on LGI for decades. I have installed a private septic system at significant personal expense, and maintain this system in good operation. Eliminating the raised drain field will not provide an environmental benefit. And the risk of environmental hazard from the low-pressure system outweighs any potential benefit from the system.

The Application has not provided sufficient demonstration of need for the proposed service. The applicant has not received any approvals from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection or the Southwest Florida Water Management District. The Application relies on general statements about removal of septic systems on barrier islands as the basis for need for service. It references service needs for failing systems and septic to sewer conversions as a basis for need. However, this is irrelevant because the proposed low-pressure system does not remove septic systems. If systems are in failure, the low pressure system will not cure those defects. Further, in the event of power loss (which occurs often on LGI) the low pressure system could fail causing back-ups and septic failures and resulting in increased environmental risk. In short, the justification for the application need is unrelated to the proposed system and irrelevant. The Application does not demonstrate need.

The proposed low pressure sewer system would be overly burdensome on the homeowners of Little Gasparilla Island. The proposed connection fees (over \$13,000) and proposed rates of over \$250/month are extremely high and a financial burden to many of the owners. These onerous rates would be among the highest in the state and cause an extreme hardship on many of the owners.

I stand with many of my neighbors in opposing this Application. It would not provide the intended benefit and the costs surely outweigh any anticipated benefit. The only one that stands to benefit is the utility owner. Thank you for your consideration of these comments. We respectfully request that you DENY the Application.

My wife and I are Rodney and Alice Henderson. We have owned our home on Little Gasparilla Island for 24 years and are writing to strongly and formally request that the PSC deny EU's application for wastewater service

We can not believe that Jack Boyer is once again pushing his sewer system.

The reasons against his plans still exist. I can list a few.

The electric system on the island is under severe strain. We lose power several times a year. What will happen then?

This is a harsh environment, with salt mist in the air and salt water incursion from high tides. Our yard was flooded twice in the last 8 months by over a foot of sea water. Any equipment suffers with more maintenance requirements and a much shorter lifespan. Especially electrical equipment.

Movement of service vehicles is severely restricted due to our narrow sandy trails and dense vegetation. Many of the trails would have to be widened and would destroy the look of the island. This is a special place and I know of no other like it.

As I stated when he last applied, Jack Boyer has no experience installing or operating a sewage system!! This is not the place for him to be learning. A mistake here could cause severe impact with limited resources to deal with the situation.

Just yesterday, I rode past a water meter that is close to the trail. It had been run over by equipment, the water line coming from it was broken and had flooded the trail. What if it was sewage?

There is no consideration for septic tanks in good working condition. In 24 years we have not had a problem with ours.

We are retired on fixed incomes. I'm 74 & my wife is 79. After our recovery from hurricane IAN & flooding from Idalia we are at our limit financially and emotionally. The greed of this man "Jack Boyer" will force us to leave our home on Little Gasparilla Island.

I want to start with a firm request to "deny" E.U's application for wastewater service to our barrier islands. Not only do we (the majority) not want this, we do not need it.

I do not have anything negative to say about the family that owns E.U, my reservation is for the following reasons.

1st: We will still have a sewer system and a pump. Currently, if we lose power we are still able to flush our toilets as long as we have water. With this new system unless you have a generator you will be unable to flush your towel. That will be a nightmare.

2nd: This is a for-profit company without any experience owning or running a wastewater utility company.

3rd: The expense is going to be placed on the homeowner. For us this is going to run us more than the average; we face the loss of a previously installed underground propane tank (1.000 gallons). We were informed a couple of years ago this line would run directly in front of our house. This is exactly where our propane tank is buried. I should not have to remove and replace a perfectly working system and one that follows county health guidelines. For Owners/Users of Aerobic Treatment Systems:

Aerobic Treatment Units (ATU) are a special kind of wastewater disposal system that are more efficient at processing waste. They are highly versatile and efficient systems and have many advantages including the ability to be installed in a place where a conventional systems could be installed (due to soil quality or site conditions), or providing the ability to build a larger house on a smaller lot (ATUs require a smaller drainfield size than conventional systems). ATUs reduce the amount of biological material that enters your drainfield. This may extend the lifespan of your drainfield, and is more environmentally friendly than a conventional system.

There are fees associated with maintaining an ATU as a direct result of the requirments to maintain a valid operating permit and a maintenance contract for the life of the system.

What are the requirements?

- The homeowner must maintain a current operating permit for the life of the system. The operating permit must be renewed every two years, and costs \$200.00 payable to the Department of Health.
- The homeowner must maintain a valid maintenance contract with an approved maintenance entity for the life of the system. The maintenance contract on new construction will initially be good for two years. Subsequent renewals must be good for at least a one-year term for the life of the system. Prices vary depending on the maintenance entity selected and type of system.
- Maintenance entity is required to inspect/service the ATU at least two times per year. Inspection reports must be submitted to the Department of Health in Lee County.
- The Department of Health must inspect the maintenance and performance of the ATU at least once per year.
