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(1) The Division of Appeals of the General Counsel's office, 1 in coordination with the Office of the Executive Director, serves 2 as the Commission's liaison with federal and state agencies as well 3 as the State Legislature and political subdivisions of the state. 4 The Division has primary responsibility for rulemaking and appeals 5 of Commission orders. The Division's staff attends Commission and 6 staff conferences as well as Commission hearings to provide legal 7 advice to the Commission, conducts public hearings at the 8 Commission's request, and maintains surveillance over rate 9 philosophy. In addition, the Division's staff rules on requests 10 for confidential classification of information and admission of 11 class B Practitioners to practice before the Commission, provides 12 guidance in procurement of services and commodities, drafts 13 procurement contracts, and provides counsel to the Commission on 14 personnel matters. 15

(2) The Division of Legal Services supervises the procedural
and legal aspects of rate cases and other formal proceedings before
the Commission, the Division of Administrative Hearings and, on
behalf of the Commission, in civil court proceedings. This
Division also represents the staff before the Commission and issues
reports and recommendations to the Commission as requested.

The Division functions as the Commission's liaison to all state agencies 10 regarding budgets and internal administrative matters of mutual 11 interest, in coordination with the General Counsel's office and the 12 Office of the Executive Director. The Division maintains 13 centralized accounting and financial records for the entire 14 Commission, receives and deposits incoming revenues, [including 15 fees, fines, and taxes, and other revenue etc.), processes payrolls 16 and all bills for payment, reviews and processes employees' travel 17 vouchers, reviews consultant and federal contracts, and maintains 18 property inventory and control. The Division administers the State 19 personnel rules and regulations for the Commission, assists in 20 coordinating training for employees and providing provides 21 assistance to the divisions and offices regarding personnel matters 22 such as recruitment of new employees, position classifications, 23 performance evaluations, and insurance programs throughout the 24 Commission in personnel matters. The Division functions as the 25

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> RULE CHAPTER 25-21, PART II DOCKET NO. 920403-OT

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SUMMARY OF RULE

The rule is amended to reflect the elimination of the Division of Information Processing and the transfer of its duties to a new Bureau of Information Processing, transfer of duties to and renaming of the Division of Research, designation of the Director of Records and Reporting as the agency clerk, and updating the description of other divisions' duties.

SUMMARY OF HEARINGS ON THE RULE

Pursuant to section 120.54(3)(a), F.S., the Commission was not required to offer the opportunity for a hearing on these rules because they relate solely to its internal organization; therefore, no hearing was offered and none was held. No comments on the rules were filed, and the rules are being filed without changes

FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES JUSTIFYING THE RULE

Section 120.53, Florida Statutes, requires each state agency to adopt a rule describing its organization. Rule 38-1,005; Florida Administrative Code, requires agencies to list their staff units and describe the units' functions, duties and responsibilities. Present Commission rules describe the divisions and their responsibilities as they existed prior to the reorganization accomplished in 1991.

To improve the operation of the Commission, and in response to a provision in the 1991 Appropriations Act, Chapter 91-193, Laws of Florida, requiring state agencies to eliminate a minimum of five percent of their Senior Management and Select Exempt Service ORDER NO. 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positions, the Commission made several changes in its organizational structure. Among the changes were consolidation of the Divisions of Information Processing and Administration; transfer of the Deputy Director of Auditing and Financial Analysis (AFAD), the Bureau of Management Studies, and the Office of Economic Regulation Standards Control to the Division of Research (which was renamed the Division of Research and Regulatory Review); and merger of the Bureaus of Accounting in the Divisions of Communication and Electric and Gas with the Financial Analysis Bureaus in AFAD.

The revisions to the organizational rules incorporate these changes. In addition, the description of each division was updated to reflect the changes that have been made in the assignment of duties and responsibilities since the rules were last amended in 1986.
