## ORDER APPROVING A TARIFF ON ONE-YEAR EXPERIMENTAL BASIS

BY THE COMMISSION:

On July 14, 1992 Florida Power and Light Company (FPL or utility) filed with this Commission a proposed tariff revision requesting authority to waive Reconnection Charges, Returned Check Charges, Late Payment Charge and Field Collection Charges once in any 12-month period for "customers who would otherwise have had a satisfactory payment record (as defined in 25-6.097(2) F.A.C.) upon acceptance of FPL of a reasonable explanation justifying a waiver." On August 28, 1992 FPL amended that revision request in order to include "customers affected by natural disasters or periods of declared emergencies".

We have reviewed the original filing and its amendment and find that they should be approved on an experimental basis for a one-year period. During that year FPL will keep records of the number of requests for waiver, the reasons given for the requests and the requests that were granted.

In consideration of the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Florida Power and Light Company's request to amend its Service Charges tariff as described in the body of the Order is approved for one year from the date of this Order on an experimental basis. It is further

DOCUMENT NUMBER-DATE

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ORDERED that Florida Power and Light Company shall keep the records described in the body of this Order. It is further

ORDERED that this Order shall become final and this docket shall be closed unless an appropriate petition for formal proceeding is received by the Division of Records and Reporting, 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0870, by the close of business on the date indicated in the Notice of Further Proceedings or Judicial Review.

## NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

The Commission's decision on this tariff is interim in nature and will become final, unless a person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed files a petition for a formal proceeding, as provided by Rule 25-22.036(4), Florida Administrative Code, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036(7)(a)(d) and (e), Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting at his office at 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0870, by the close of business on September 23, 1992.

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In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become final on the day subsequent to the above date.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this Order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this Order becomes final on the date described above, any party adversely affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the date this Order becomes final, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
