ORDER CANCELLING PAY TELEPHONE CERTIFICATE NO. 3362 AND  
NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER GRANTING A PAY  
TELEPHONE CERTIFICATE TO TELE-VEN, INC.

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

I. Background

On April 28, 1994, WorldCom Supply, Inc. (WorldCom) requested that Pay Telephone Certificate Number 3362 be changed to reflect a new corporate name, Tele-Ven, Inc. (Tele-Ven). Tele-Ven is a separate legal entity from WorldCom. In order to change the name on the certificate, the certificate must be transferred from one entity to the other. Pursuant to Rule 25-24.512, Florida Administrative Code, Improper Use of a Certificate, pay telephone certificates cannot be transferred. In order to complete the name change, WorldCom requested that Certificate No. 3362 be cancelled and applied for a new certificate for Tele-Ven.

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II. Approval of Grant of Certificate

Upon review, we find that Tele-Ven's application contains the information required for certification as set forth in Sections 364.3375 and 364.335, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-24.511, Florida Administrative Code. Accordingly, we propose to grant a certificate to provide pay telephone service to Tele-Ven consistent with the conditions and requirements set forth in Rules 25-24.505 through 25-24.520, Florida Administrative Code.

III. Cancellation of Certificate No. 3362

We cancel Pay Telephone Certificate Number 3362. If it has not already done so, WorldCom is directed to return the certificate to the Commission. Our cancellation of this certificate in no way diminishes WorldCom's obligation to pay due and owing regulatory assessment fees.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that a certificate to provide pay telephone service be issued to Tele-Ven, Inc. subject to the conditions stated in the body of this Order. It is further

ORDERED that Certificate Number 3362 be cancelled effective when the issuance of a certificate to Tele-Ven, Inc. becomes final. It is further

ORDERED that WorldCom, Inc. shall return Certificate Number 3362 and remit any and all outstanding Regulatory Assessment Fees due the Florida Public Service Commission, if it has not already done so. It is further

ORDERED that, unless a person whose substantial interests are affected by the actions proposed herein files a petition in the form and by the date specified in the Notice of Further Proceedings or Judicial Review, below, the certificate issued to Tele-Ven, Inc. shall become effective and Certificate 3362 shall be cancelled on the following date and this docket shall be closed.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

As identified in Section II of this order, our action granting Tele-Ven, Inc. a pay telephone certificate is preliminary in nature and will not become effective or final, except as provided by Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code. Any person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed by this order may file a petition for a formal proceeding, as provided by Rule 25-22.029(4), Florida Administrative Code, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036(7)(a) and (f), Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0870, by the close of business on August 8, 1994.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become effective on the date subsequent to the above date as provided by Rule 25-22.029(6), Florida Administrative Code.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If Section II of this order granting a pay telephone certificate to Tele-Ven, Inc. becomes final and effective on the date described above, any party adversely affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in Section III cancelling WorldCom's certificate to provide pay telephone service may request: (1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or (2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
