**ORDER CANCELLING HEARING AND CONTROLLING DATES**

Pursuant to Order No. PSC-09-0094-PCO-WS, issued February 13, 2009, the Commission abated all action in this show cause proceeding until March 2, 2009. Due to the abatement of this matter, the hearing and other controlling dates were revised by Order No. PSC-09-0091-PCO-WS.

The Commission in Order No. PSC-09-0094-PCO-WS also ordered Aloha Utilities, Inc., (Aloha or utility) to file a report in this docket upon the closing of the sale of the utility in order to address the status of the acquisition of the utility by the Florida Governmental Utility Authority (FGUA). On March 4, 2009, Aloha filed a letter with the Commission advising that the acquisition of Aloha's assets by FGUA was closed on February 27, 2009. Commission staff have been advised that an application for transfer of the utility to FGUA will be filed with the Commission shortly.

Pursuant to Rule 28-106.211, Florida Administrative Code, the presiding officer before whom a case is pending may issue any orders necessary to promote the just, speedy, and inexpensive determination of all aspects of the case. The Commission will consider the forthcoming application for transfer at a future agenda conference. Because the Commission's decision on that application may affect the proceeding in this docket, the hearing and other controlling dates set forth in Order No. PSC-09-0094-PCO-WS are hereby cancelled.

Therefore, it is

ORDERED by Nancy Argenziano, as Prehearing Officer, that the hearing and controlling dates set forth in Order No. PSC-09-0091-PCO-WS are hereby cancelled.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code; or (2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Office of Commission Clerk, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
