### D. EXTENSION LINE MILEAGE RESERVED FOR FUTURE USE

1. General

a. The basic rates for extension stations and PBX stations as, specified elsewhere in this tariff are for such stations which are located within the same building as the main station or PBX switchboard. Where extension stations or PBX stations are provided at other locations, and for other circuit extensions of similar character, such as bells, or gongs, extension line mileage charges are applicable as set forth below, in addition to the basic rates applicable to the particular service against which mileage charges are assessed.

b. Mileage charges are computed separately for each extension line on direct airline measurements as follows:

- (1) When isolated wire or cable is placed, the direct airline mileage is measured point-to-point, i.e., from the location of the main station or FBX switchboard to the location of the extension station, PBX station, or other service,
- (2) When the extension line is bridge to the mian line in the central office, the direct airline mileage is measured from the location of serving central office (i.e., the central office serving the main station or PBX where the extension line is bridged) via any intermediate central office if necessary, to the location of the extension station, PBX station, or other service.
- c. Where, for the purpose of furnishing extension lines, it is necessary to lay underground conduit or to set poles on the subscriber's premises, the subscriber may be required to provide and install such underground conduit and to provide and erect such poles, or the Company will do the work at the subscriber's expense. Where the work is performed by the subscriber, it must be in accordance with the standard specifications of the Company.

d. When it is known or realized that the life of all or part of the outside circuit extensions will be shorter than the normal life of the plant, or the cost of providing the plant is such as to render inadequate the mileage charges quoted herein, the plant required to furnish such service will be provided on the following basis:

The subscriber may be required to pay construction and installation charges based upon the costs incurred in addition to mileage charges.

- e. In connection with party line service, extension stations must be located on the same premises as the main station.
- f. When provision of service to an extension station or PBX station of this character requires the use of four-wire (two-pair) circuit, the extension line mileage charge shall be doubled. When provision of service to an extension station or PBX station requires the use of load coils, amplifiers, repeaters, or other equipment, they will be furnished at the rates as specified elsewhere in this tariff.
- g. Nonrecurring charges for establishing extension stations are applicable as stated in the "Service Charges" section of this tariff, with the exception that certain extension service connection charges can consist of more than one access line charge, (such as for offpremises extensions where the circuit may pass through more than one central office). Access line charges will be applicable on a "per central office involved" basis, and other nonrecurring charges will be on a "per work function required" basis as applicable for establishing

extension service.

h. Mileage charges and mileage measurements also apply to customerprovided terminal equipment and communications systems subject to the provisions as stated in other sections of this tariff. ser
