PURPOSE AND PROCEDURE

The purpose of this hearing shall be to allow Florida Power Corporation and Florida Power & Light Company to present testimony and exhibits in support of their petitions for increased nuclear decommissioning accrual rates; to permit any intervenors to present testimony and exhibits concerning this matter; and for such other purposes as the Commission may deem appropriate. All witnesses shall be subject to cross-examination at the conclusion of their testimony. The proceedings will be governed by the provisions of Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 25-22, Florida Administrative Code.

PREHEARING CONFERENCE

The purpose of this prehearing conference will be to consider: (1) the simplification of the issues; (2) the identification of the positions of the parties on the issues; (3) the possibility of obtaining admissions of fact and of

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documents which will avoid unnecessary proof; (4) the identification of the exhibits; (5) the establishment of an order of witnesses; and (6) such other matters as may aid in the disposition of the action.

JURISDICTION

Jurisdiction over electric utilities is vested in the Commission by Chapter 366, Florida Statutes. This proceeding will be governed by the provisions of Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, as well as Chapters 25-6 and 25-22, Florida Administrative Code.
