Rule 25-22.009 Size of Paper Filed With Commission.

(1) Beginning on January 1, 1990, all petitions, pleadings, and motions filed with the Commission and all orders, opinions, and other official documents issued by the Commission shall be on paper measuring 8 1/2 by 11 inches in size. However, the Commission shall use legal-size paper when necessary to comply with the filing requirements of any court or other administrative body.

(2) Correspondence and other documents filed with or issued by the Commission should also be on 8 1/2 by 11-inch paper where possible. Maps, data spreadsheets, and similar documents may be on larger paper.

SUMMARY OF RULE

The rule will require all petitions, pleadings, and motions filed with the Commission to be on paper measuring 8 1/2 by 11 inches in size (i.e., letter-size). Likewise, Commission orders, opinions, and other official documents will be on letter-size paper. The rule provides exceptions for maps, spreadsheets, and filings with other agencies requiring legal-size paper.

SUMMARY OF HEARINGS ON THE RULE

No rule hearing was requested or held in this docket.

FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES JUSTIFYING THE RULE

The Commission believes that requiring a uniform size of paper will promote efficiency, convenience, and economy in the exercise of its administrative duties.
