ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF

BY THE COMMISSION:

By Order No. 21815, issued September 5, 1989 in the Information Services Docket, we required the local exchange companies to provide new or newly unbundled information services. On August 13, 1990, Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company (Southern Bell) filed this tariff consisting of features it identifies as desired by Information Service Providers in the Open Network Architecture (ONA) process.

We have a number of concerns regarding this tariff and have forwarded data requests to Southern Bell. We are also concerned with the particular Basic Service Elements filed. In order to allow adequate analysis of the controversial issues surrounding the implementation of Southern Bell's ONA plan in Florida we hereby suspend this tariff filing.

Based on the foregoing, it is


