COMES NOW BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company ("Southern Bell" or "Company"), pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(4)(a), Florida Administrative Code, and submits its Request for Confidential Classification for certain information contained in Late Filed Exhibit No. 47.

- 1. During a panel deposition held on June 18 and 19, 1992, Public Counsel requested the production of certain documents and the provision of certain information. The parties agreed to a procedure whereby these documents and this information would be provided without the necessity of a formal request to produce and/or interrogatories. This type of document receives very limited distribution within the Company. Public disclosure of this information could bring great harm to the Company and its customers. The Company's installation and maintenance system for 9 states is administered through LMOS and the associated front and computers. If these systems were invaded by unauthorized individuals, great harm could be done to the Company's ability to provide proper installation and maintenance services.

- 3. Thus, pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(4)(a), Florida
  Administrative Code, Southern Bell moves the Prehearing Officer
  to issue an Order classifying Late Filed Exhibit No. 47 as
  confidential and exempting the information contained therein from
  § 119.07(1), Florida Statutes.
