

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

General

With this filing, St. Joseph Telephone Company proposes changes to the General Exchange Tariff to introduce Open 800 Service. Open 800 Service is an inward only long distance service for calls originating and terminating within the state. As with existing 800 Services, it will provide toll free calling to parties dialing the 800 number.

This new service will enable end-users to order a full statewide 800 Service. In the provisioning of this service, St. Joseph Telephone will screen 800 calls originating within the state of Florida. This screening will enable St. Joseph Telephone to complete all intraLATA 800 calls and to pass all interLATA calls to the appropriate interexchange carrier (IXC) for completion. The end-user will designate an IXC of choice from a list of those IXCs who choose to participate with St. Joseph Telephone in this offering.

Open 800 Service will allow the customer more flexibility in the establishment of a statewide service. With the existing Combined 800 Service, the 800 Service customer is limited in the choice of IXCs for interLATA traffic since all IXCs do not have the capability to provide the inter/intraLATA screening function. With the new service, the customer will also have the option of choosing either a dedicated WATS access line or an exchange access line for the termination of 800 calls.

CUSTOMER EFFECTS

The new Open 800 Service will allow end-user customers more flexibility in ordering 800 Service. With Open 800 Service, customers will have a choice of any participating interexchange carrier to provide their 800 Service and may maintain the same 800 number even if the end user decides to later change interLATA-intrastate carriers. In addition, the customer will have the flexibility of terminating 800 calls to an exchange line as well as to a dedicated WATS access line.

Wide Area Telecommunications Service (WATS) is the furnishing of facilities by the Company and the concurring Local Exchange Carriers and, when applicable, an interLATA carrier for dial type telecommunications between a station associated with a WATS access line and stations using the public switched network within the State of Florida in accordance with the regulations and schedule of charges specified in this Tariff and, when applicable, the tariff of the interLATA carrier. The WATS charges set forth in this Tariff are in payment for the service furnished between the calling and called stations within Florida. * ~~The intraLATA and interLATA portions of 800 Service are only offered in combination with each other and may not be subscribed to separately. For Outward WATS, the intraLATA service may be subscribed to separately, or may be offered in combination with an interLATA WATS. For WATS Access Lines arranged for bijurisdictional use, refer to 17.4.1.E.~~

1. The term "Service Group" as used in connection with Outward WATS denotes one or more Outward WATS access lines for the same service area terminated in the same multiline terminating system at the same premises.

2. The term "Service Group" as used in connection with 800 Service denotes the access lines arranged in Central Office equipment furnished by the Company as part of a given hunting arrangement.

G. WATS is furnished only if the necessary facilities are available in the offices technically capable of providing the service.

H. Combined Outward WATS is furnished only in offices where the interLATA carrier has purchased appropriate Feature Group C or D access facilities.

I. J. Option 800 Service and Open 800 Service are provided by the Company utilizing 800 Number Service.

1. 800 Number Assignment

800 Number Service provides for the assignment of a single ten digit 800 Number (i.e. 800+XXX+XXXX) to the customer which can be used on a statewide basis for Option 800 Service or Open 800 Service. 800 Number Service provides the customer with one 800 number statewide for Option 800 Service or Open 800 Service. 800 Number Service, when used for Option 800 Service, can be selected for an area consisting of less than an entire state by specifying the desired Area of Service. Option 800 Service customers shall contain in all advertisements, publications or any other communication containing the Option 800 Service number a commonly understood description of all geographic calling limitations. Area of Service is described in 2. following. The assigned 800 number can terminate to a WATS Access line provided in 17.4 following or to an exchange access line. 17.4 following provides the applicable charges for Option 800 Service and Open 800 Service terminating to an exchange access line. The Company will require the 10-digit POTS number for intraLATA screening.

2. Area of Service

Area of Service for Option 800 Service is defined as the geographic locations (LATAs) within a state from which the Option 800 Service customer desires to accept calls for a given 800 Number. The Area of Service may range from a single LATA to the entire state. A WATS Access line or exchange access line is required within each LATA specified by the Area of Service for termination of 800 Service traffic that originated within that LATA. The desired Area of Service must be specified by the customer at the time Option 800 Service is ordered. Customers requesting an Area of Service encompassing more than one LATA are required to subscribe to the Variable Call Destination feature described in 3., following. For Open 800 Service, the Area of Service is defined as the entire state.

3. Variable Call Destination

The Variable Call Destination feature provides for multiple terminations (one ten digit telephone number per LATA) of Option 800 Service when the customer specified an Area of Service greater than one LATA. This allows for the assignment of one 800 Number, for statewide use, with termination to a WATS Access Line or exchange access line within the LATA where the 800 call originated. Rates for Variable Call Destination record establishment and record changes are provided in 17.4 following.

- K. Customers who subscribe to 800 Service provided by other than the Company may designate the Company as the intraLATA carrier. Such intraLATA usage will be billed in accordance with the rates and regulations for Option 800 Service as specified in this tariff.
- L. The Company will provide the intraLATA portion of Open 800 Service with the IC providing the interLATA portion of the service. For the rules, regulations and rates of the interLATA portion of this service, refer to the interLATA carrier's tariffs.
- M. Effective May 1, 1993, Combined 800 Service is not available for new installations or additions, changes or transfers of service associated with existing Combined 800 Service lines.

Effective May 1, 1994, Combined 800 Service will be discontinued. During the twelve-month period between May 1, 1993 and May 1, 1994, all existing subscribers will be notified that the service is to be discontinued.

17.2 Use of the Service

- A. WATS is provided for use by the subscriber and may be used by others, when so authorized by the subscriber, providing that all such usage shall be subject to the provisions of this Tariff.

17.3 Limitation of Service

- A. Wide Area Telecommunications Service does not include person-to-person, collect, conference, or other calls requiring operator handling except as provided in 17.1.B. preceding.
- B. WATS is not represented as adapted for connection to other services of the Company. This service contemplates the provision of satisfactory transmission only between the WATS access line and the called or calling station. N

Of exchange access line for Option 800 Service and Open 500 Service

Extensions from WATS access lines are restricted to the use of the subscriber, his representatives and associates and are furnished only on the same or different premises of the same subscriber except that extensions from 800 Service may be located on other than the subscriber's premises for the purpose of answering calls when the subscriber is not available at the main station and except that WATS access line extensions may be shared, provided those extension lines are located on the customer's premises.

Connection of WATS to other services is permitted on a switched basis only. No permanent connection between WATS and other service may be established. However, satisfactory transmission cannot be assured when the WATS access line is connected to other Company services or to customer-provided equipment or services.

WATS may be terminated at a premises where telecommunications management functions are performed on behalf of the customer only if the customer has a requirement to communicate over the WATS line to or from premises of that customer located in the State of Florida. In such cases the premises where telecommunications management functions are performed will be considered a customers premises. WATS access lines and extensions will be terminated only at premises located within the State of Florida.

- C. 800 Service is furnished upon condition that the customer accept and make use of the terminations or connections provided in accordance with 17.1.E. preceding, and that the customer obtain a sufficient number of access lines to prevent the percent of calls completed to calls attempted (including busy and unanswered calls) from falling below 50% for two consecutive months. Customers falling below the 50% level of completions will be required to subscribe to additional ^{WATS} access lines to handle the incoming calls with at least a 50% completion level. Should the customer refuse to subscribe to these lines, the Company, without incurring any liability, may terminate the 800 Service, provided that, in case of termination of service, at least five days have elapsed following written notification to the subscriber by mail or in person of the Company's intention to terminate the service for such cause.

D. Any arrangement permitting customer control of the number of calls completed to an 800 Service access line is not permitted.

17.4 Rates

17.4.1 Recurring Rate Structure

- A. The separate recurring usage rate structures of the Local Exchange Carrier and the interLATA carrier providing Combined IntraLATA/InterLATA Outward WATS or 800 Service are based on separate identification of intraLATA and interLATA usage as directed by the Commission.

- Combined Option 800 Service and Open 800 Services
B. For ^{Combined} 800 Service, ^{Option 800 Service and Open 800 Services} Combined Outward WATS, and IntraLATA Outward WATS, the intraLATA usage is applied to the Schedule of Monthly Usage charges in 17.4.2.C. following, and the interLATA usage is applied to the approved tariff rates of the interLATA carrier. For IntraEAEA Outward WATS, the IntraEAEA usage is applied to the Schedule of Monthly Usage Charges in 17.4.2.C. following.

- C. The Schedule of Monthly Usage Charges in 17.4.2.C. requires a separate monthly charge for each ^{WATS} access line in a service group independent of usage on that line or service group.
