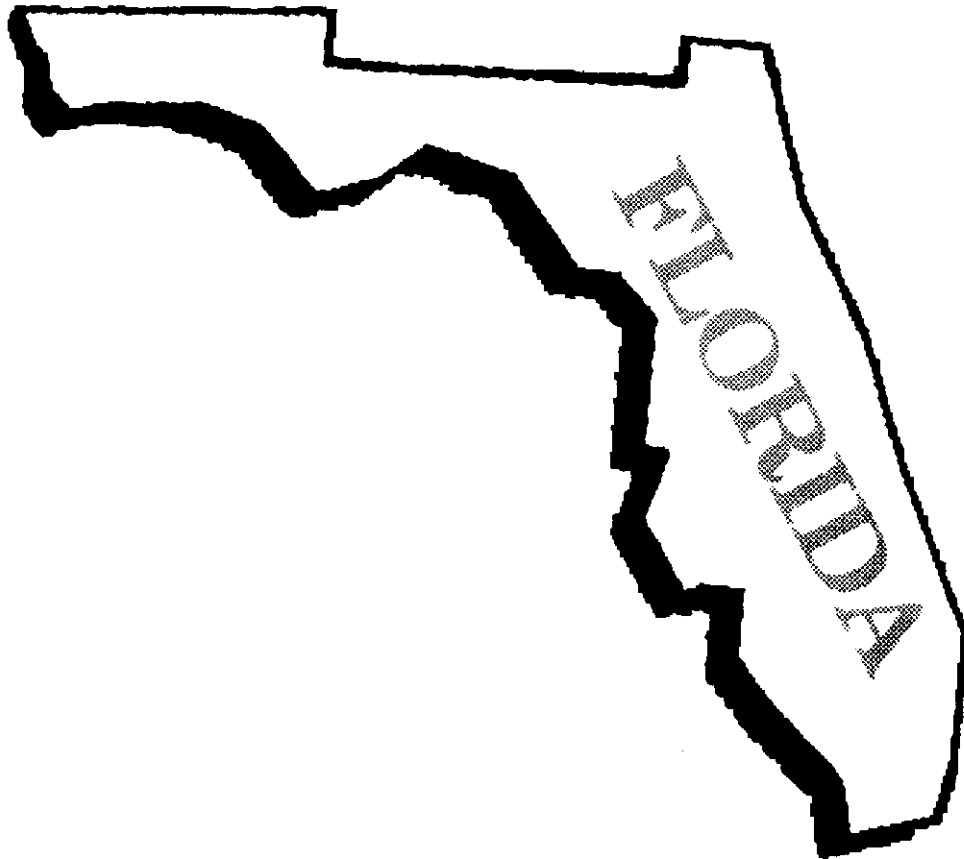

The data source for the test year units for the 1993 Schedule E-1a are the same as those already identified in the schedule E-1c provided for the 1992 actuals. Except as noted, the rate levels and structures are also the same as those used for 1992.

Economic assumptions, specific regional events and regulatory matters are the main factors that drive the forecast levels. The access line forecasts were prepared using a bottoms-up approach reconciled to a tops-down projection. The data source for the access line history and tracking is the Company Monthly Report #7. The product-specific forecasts were prepared at a state level. The data source for history and tracking is the Company Product Profitability System.

The test year units were developed using growth rates from forecast data for the different components of the E-1a. Specific growth rates were used for the following products: Prestige, TouchStar, Custom Calling, Rotary Hunt, DID & AIOD, TouchTone, Uniserv, Off Premises Extension, Tie Lines, 911/E911/SALI, Bellboy, Dataphone Digital Service, Synchronet, FlexServ, Watchalert, DSAS, MegaLink, LightGate, Analog Data, Alarm & Control, PulseLink, FCO & FX, Number Services, Directory White Pages, Remote Call Forwarding, RingMaster, Cellular Interconnect and Toll Services.

Residence, business, public and ESSX access lines projections were used to grow their own demand as well as being used as the growth rates for all other services for which specific growth rates were not available.

For the proposed Expanded Local Calling plan, the test year units are based on a model that projects customer take rates and revenue effects by class of service using a sample of actual customer bills. In this model, individual customer bills are priced out under each of the proposed options and assigned a probability of taking the plan along with the revenue effects that would result from their decision. The results from the sample are summarized and then projected to the total line counts in Florida.

In addition, the toll demand has been adjusted to reflect the expected impacts of the Local Calling Plus and Extended Calling Service plans projected to be effective in 1993.

BellSouth has forecasted minutes of use for Intrastate Access by combining historical usage with market intellegence. Forecasts are prepared at the state level by total local switched access minutes of use. Growth rates are developed considering migration trends and new service offerings. Impacts from 10XXX competition are overlayed to this base view. This forecast is also reconciled to the access line forecasts.

The switched access demand for 1993 has been adjusted to reflect the elimination of time of day discounts and the interstate application of Carrier Common Line rates for originating 800/900 access service. Rates have also been changed to reflect the ONA filing and Phase III of the Special Access restructure.

Explanation of Methodology to Determine Demand
For Column 4 of Schedule E-2

1. Extended Local Service

Minutes within the basic local calling area that are currently non-rated (i.e. flat rate service) are projected to be repressed when converted to one of the ELS usage based pricing options. In the revenue analysis, residence usage to be converted to Option 1 was repressed 5% and business usage converting to ELS was repressed 2.5%.

The stimulation rates used in the analysis for minutes that are currently toll or part of an extended local calling plan projected to convert to ELS were based on individual calling patterns. The elasticity used in estimating the proposed demand was calculated for each account studied and was dependent upon the current level of calling and the price difference per minute between the current service and ELS. For each account projected to convert to ELS the proposed demand for extended local calling was calculated by the following formula:

$$\text{New Demand} = (\text{Old Demand}) * (e^{(\text{Elasticity})})$$

2. Switched Access

In order to calculate stimulation, the percent change in rates was first developed. For switched access service, with numerous rate elements, a weighted average rate reduction was appropriate. This was obtained by first, pricing existing demand from column 3 at the current rates in column 7. This same demand was then also priced out at the proposed rates in column 8. The results of these calculations are shown in columns 9 and 11 respectively. The total for column 9 is \$266,821,873 and for column 11 \$254,822,577. The percent change in the repriced revenues versus the base revenues results in the weighted average percent change in the price of switched access $\{(\$254,822,577 - \$266,821,873) / \$266,821,873 = -4.497\%$.

Prior to applying the own price elasticity to this price change percentage, an adjustment had to be made. This adjustment accounted for the fact that access makes up only a portion of an interexchange carrier's costs. Since demand response is determined by end user reaction to changes in interexchange carrier's rates, the percent change in switched access rates must be translated into a percent reduction in end user rates. For example, if access charges represent fifty percent of an interexchange carrier's charges to the end user then a ten percent reduction in switched access rates (if passed through "dollar-for-dollar" by the interexchange carrier) would result in a five percent reduction in end user rates. BellSouth used a factor of fifty percent to approximate this effect. Therefore the percent change in end user price for the reduction in the local transport and local switching rates is -4.497% times 50% or -2.2486% .

The own price elasticity used to determine the percent change in demand was $-.345$. This represents the average of business and residence intraLATA toll elasticities. This elasticity was then applied to the percent change in price using the following formula:

$$(1 + \text{Percent Change in Price})^{(\text{Elasticity})} = (1 + \text{Percent Change in Demand}); \text{ or}$$

$$(1 + (-2.2486\%))^{(-.345)} = 1.0079$$

This price change in demand was multiplied by all the minute of use sensitive demand in column 3 to obtain the demand in column 4 of Schedule E-2.

Response: Southern Bell is proposing rate reductions in order to distribute the 1994 annual customer credit of \$47.5M. These reductions are proposed in four areas: service connection charges; Switched Access charges; Flat Rate PBX trunks, NARs and hunting; and Lifeline. Each of these is described in more detail below. These rate reductions have been designed to benefit a broad base of Florida customers. A customer refund would be appropriate in order to reduce revenues by the full \$47.5M depending on the actual implementation date of the proposed rate reductions.

In addition, Southern Bell is proposing rate reductions in 1994 in network usage rates for mobile service providers. A new local service offering for residence and business customers is also being introduced effective January 1, 1995. Finally, the message rate service tariff for business customers is being restructured. These changes are being offered in conjunction with a proposed extension of the incentive regulation plan. Each of these is described in more detail below.

SERVICE CONNECTION CHARGES

Service connection charges are being restructured from a multi-element tariff structure to a new, more simplified structure that is intended to be more easily understood by Southern Bell customers. At the same time it will be easier for Southern Bell to administer. A cost study was performed to support the restructure. The proposed rates are in line with the costs of providing the services.

FLAT RATE PBX TRUNK NARS HUNTING CHARGES

Basic exchange services continue to be priced based on value-of-service. In order to bring flat rate PBX trunks and flat rate business lines closer to parity, Southern Bell proposes to disaggregate hunting from PBX trunks and NARs, and to reduce the monthly flat rate business PBX trunk to individual business line price ratio to 1.7. Monthly flat rates for NARs (with hunting included) are proposed to be reduced by approximately the same percentage as the monthly PBX trunk rate (with hunting included) in order to treat NARs similar to PBX trunks. Additionally, Southern Bell proposes to reduce business flat rate hunting to 35% of the individual flat rate business line.

BUSINESS MESSAGE RATE SERVICE RESTRUCTURE

Consistent with flat rate service and residence message rate service, a hunting charge will be added for business message rate service. The hunting charge will apply to each business line, PBX trunk and NAR equipped with the hunting feature. Southern Bell proposes to set the business message rate service hunting charge at 35% of the corresponding message rate service individual business line which is consistent with the proposed derivation of hunting charges for business flat rate service.

Additionally, Southern Bell proposes to increase the message rate PBX trunk charge for "Additional" trunks to the same amount as that of the "First" trunk in the customer's account. At the same time, the message allowance for the "Additional" trunks will be increased from 0 to 75 messages which is the same allowance included with the "First" trunk. This proposal will price message rate PBX trunks in a consistent, rational fashion compared to business message rate individual lines.

LIFELINE

A Lifeline offering, also referred to as the Interstate Subscriber Line Charge Waiver and Matching Program, has been introduced for qualified low income subscribers. This program provides a Federal Credit, equal to the Interstate Subscriber Line Charge, plus an equivalent State/Company provided subsidy to qualified subscribers. The Federal and State credits will be applied to the local service bills of qualified subscribers.

OPTIONAL EXPANDED LOCAL SERVICE TARIFF

An optional expanded local service (ELS) tariff is proposed as part of Southern Bell's local calling plan. This tariff will be available, on an optional basis, to residential and business customers, and will provide for expanded/extended local calling out to forty miles. Seven digit dialing (within each Number Plan area) out to 40 miles will generally be available to ELS customers. The plan provides two options which customers can select based on their individual calling patterns, needs and desires. The standard option provides a low cost alternative to traditional flat rate service for those who do not place many outgoing calls within the existing (basic) local calling area and/or for those customers who make frequent calls to the expanded local calling area. The premium option for residence customers provides for flat rate calling out to 40 miles while the premium option for business customers provides for a 50% discount, on all usage, from the standard option's usage schedule. Those customers who subscribe to four or more Multi-Feature Discount Plan (MFDP) features receive credit for an additional feature when they also subscribe to ELS.

The ELS monthly line rates include touchtone at no additional charge. These rates were developed using value-of-service principles taking into consideration the proposed rates for flat rate and message rate services. Residence and business lines were priced on average at about the same percentage from their respective flat rate monthly equivalents. In the business category, monthly rates for ELS PBX trunks and hunting were developed utilizing the same ratios with respect to individual business lines as those utilized for flat rate service. Monthly NAR rates were developed with the objective of maintaining approximately the same dollar difference between NAR and PBX trunks as that of the repriced flat rate NARS and trunks.

The usage charges proposed under ELS for the standard option were tested against the levelized incremental unit costs results. This has insured that the proposed usage charges for the standard option will cover the costs of an average usage rated message.

A study was conducted using Florida specific usage data in order to determine the revenue impact (reduction) of the proposed rates.

SWITCHED ACCESS RATES

In Docket No. 920260-TL Southern Bell is proposing to reduce switched access rates by \$5.0 million. The revenue reduction will be in the local transport rate element. This rate element is being targeted for reduction to help address increased competition in switched access transport. Additionally, reducing switched access will move Florida intrastate switched access rates closer to interstate switched access rates.

MOBILE SERVICE PROVIDERS NETWORK USAGE RATES

The Mobile Service Providers (MSPs) network usage rates are tied to the switched access rates per Commission Order No. 20475 in Docket No. 870675-TL issued December 20, 1988. This docket investigated the interconnection of mobile carriers with facilities of local exchange companies. Since the MSP originated usage rate is calculated based on a formula using terminating switched access rates, the reduction in the terminating switched access rate will be reflected in a reduction to the MSP originated usage rate. Additionally, since the optional Land-to-Mobile usage rate is based on originating switched access rates, the reduction in the originating switched access rate will be reflected in a reduction to the MSP optional Land-to-Mobile usage rate.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN

In support of the state of Florida's initiative, the Company will offer concessions on telecommunication services for qualifying businesses who locate or expand their operations in Enterprise Zones which are located in Company Territory. These concessions (which waive non recurring charges and provide a 50% reduction on recurring charges for 12 months) are intended to provide incentives for furthering the advancement of economic development in these designated areas.

Based upon the average number of businesses which have qualified for enterprise zone property tax credits from July, 1989, through June, 1991, the revenue impact on the Company is negligible.

CALL FORWARDING/CALL WAITING

As part of Docket No. 920260-TL, the revenues received from the Residence Custom Calling Services Call Forwarding Variable and Call Waiting features will be reduced by \$4.4 million. The Call Forwarding Variable rate will be reduced from \$2.45 to \$2.20 and the Call Waiting rate will be reduced from \$3.50 to \$3.35. These new rates are within the approved banded rates for these features.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE - ROTARY

On February 10, 1992 Foreign Exchange (FX) Service was restructured from a flat rate service to a measured rate service. Prior to the restructure, charges for Rotary Service (Hunting) were applied pursuant to A3.6 of the G.S.S.T. or were included with an exchange access rate element. The Rotary tariff provided charges for flat rate and message rate lines only. The fact that Rotary Service for FX measured service was not available, was not determined until after the implementation of the restructure. Billing for Rotary Service on FX was stopped immediately, with a substantial negative revenue impact.

Correction of this oversight is important since some FX customers are receiving a service at no charge, while other customers are paying for it. This proposal corrects and re-established the billing of Rotary Service for FX.

A. General

1. Enhanced Optional Extended Area Service (EOEAS) provides alternative billing for customer dialed station-to-station calls to or from locations outside a subscriber's local calling area, but within the same LATA. As an additional option, customers are allowed to reduce their unlimited calling area to their home exchange at a reduced flat rate. EOEAS is available in the following configurations:

- a. Premium - This option permits residence subscribers to increase their unlimited local calling area by allowing the subscriber to make unlimited outgoing direct dialed calls to a specified exchange or exchanges outside the subscriber's existing local calling area but within the same LATA. *Premium customers will not be billed Local Calling Plus rates. See A3.8.50 for Rates and Regulations.* Customers in the Bunnell, Flagler Beach, Palm Coast, Geneva and Sanford exchanges pay a fixed monthly charge, which includes the Individual Residence Line rate plus an EOEAS additive to subscribe to this option; in other exchanges customers pay a fixed monthly additive. (C)
- b. Discount - This option provides a fifty percent discount from the prevailing long distance rates specified in Section A18. for DDD calls from the subscriber's location to a specified exchange or exchanges outside the subscriber's local calling area but within the same LATA. As specified in B. following, there is a minimum monthly charge per account to subscribe to this service. Customers whose total discounted toll charges to the specified exchange or exchanges less than the minimum monthly charge will be billed only the minimum monthly charge. Customers whose total discounted toll charges to the specified exchange or exchanges are equal to or greater than the minimum monthly charge will be billed the total discounted toll charges. (C)
- c. Incoming Discount - This option permits a subscriber to pay for calls received at the subscriber's location and placed from a specified exchange or exchanges outside the subscriber's local calling area but within the same LATA. With this option a subscriber receives an assigned telephone number in the specified other exchange or exchanges with an associated directory listing if desired. (This number can be non-published at no additional charge.) Calls to this number will be forwarded to the subscriber's location. The subscriber would pay a rate equal to fifty percent of the prevailing long distance rates specified in Section A18. for each call received in addition to a fixed monthly charge as specified in B. following. The Incoming Discount option is only available to customers who subscribe to either of the above described Discount or Premium options. (C)
- d. Drop-back - This option permits customers to reduce their unlimited local calling area to their exchange at a reduced flat rate as specified in B.2 following. With this option a subscriber would still be able to receive local calls from the local calling area described in A3.3. However, any calls placed from the subscriber's location to exchanges in the local calling area but not in the subscriber's exchange would be billed at the rates specified in Section A18. Such calls will be summary billed based on minutes, discount period and toll rate band mileage. On the customer's bills Band 1 designates calls in the 0-10 mileage bracket; Band 2, 11-22 mileage bracket; and Band 3, 23-55 mileage bracket. (C)

5. Suspension of EOEAS is allowed subject to the terms and conditions specified in A2.3.16 of this Tariff. During the suspension period, the monthly recurring rates for the service are rated at one-half their normal amounts.
6. During the six month period following the effective date of each authorized EOEAS plan, the normal service order charge will be waived for the initial selection of one of the options and for one subsequent change (to a different option or back to original service). Following this six month period the appropriate service order charge as specified in Section A4. will apply to EOEAS activity. Customers selecting the Incoming Discount option who do not at that time request a non-published number (for the line assigned in the added exchange) will pay a secondary service order charge if they later order non-published number service. Note that as stated above in A3.7.1; there will be no monthly recurring charge for this non-published number service.
7. The rates for the Premium options in the Bunnell, Flagler Beach, Palm Coast, Geneva, and Sanford exchanges and for the Drop-back option *in all exchanges* are basic local exchange service rates as these options may be selected instead of other existing basic local exchange access line options. The rates for the Premium options in all exchanges not listed above and for the Discount and Incoming Discount options are in addition to rates for basic local exchange service. (C)
8. The Premium option monthly rates are per residence subscriber line. The Discount option monthly rates are per subscriber account. The Incoming Discount option monthly rates are per line number assigned in the added exchange. The Drop-back option monthly rates are per subscriber line.
9. For each exchange that has an EOEAS offering, the access lines in the specified added exchange or exchanges will be recalculated yearly to determine if the residence Premium option monthly rate needs to be adjusted based on the rate matrix provided in B.1. following. Similarly, the access lines in each exchange that has an EOEAS offering will be recalculated yearly to determine if the Drop-back option monthly rate needs to be adjusted. If a rate adjustment is required, it will be made effective within two months of the issuance of a new directory and will be preceded by an appropriate customer notification.

2. Premium Residence Option - A fixed monthly charge, in addition to the monthly access line charge, entitles residence customers to an unlimited number of messages to all exchange access lines within the entire ELS local calling area specified in A3.3.2. No other usage charges apply to calls made by premium residence customers.

3. Premium Business Option - A minimum usage monthly charge, in addition to the monthly access line charge, entitles business subscribers to a 50 percent discount on the BLCA usage rates specified in the standard usage schedule. This 50 percent discount applies to all calls in the BLCA except for operator assisted and credit card calls. A usage allowance applies to discounted BLCA usage. The minimum usage charge applies to each individual business line, PBX trunk and NAR in the customer's premises with outgoing call making capability.

C. Rotary charges are applicable only to residence lines, business lines, PBX trunks and NARs arranged for rotary service. They do not apply to outgoing-only lines, PBX trunks or NARs.

D. Usage based charges for calls terminated within the BLCA will not exceed the usage cap indicated in A3.37.3.B.2 following. ~~Simple Residence and Simple Business Premises Work Charges are nonrecurring charges based on the labor time and miscellaneous materials required to complete the installation of Semi-Public Telephone Services and customer requested rearrangements on a customer's premises. Premises work is that work performed by a Company representative on a customer premises which includes, but is not limited to premises visit, mounting of a semi-public telephone set and directory, customer requests for rearrangement of a drop wire, protector, and/or network interface. Premises work does not include the work required to establish network access.~~

A4. SERVICE CHARGES¹

A4.1 Definitions

SERVICE CHARGE

Service Charge is a nonrecurring charge or charges applying to the ordering, installing, moving, changing, rearranging or furnishing of telecommunication services or facilities. Service Charges are categorized as:

- Line Connection Charge
- Line Change Charge
- Secondary Service Charge
- Premises Work Charge

Line Connection Charge (First Line and/or Additional Line) applies for establishing an exchange access line or trunk. The charge includes service ordering, central office work, exchange access line work and a standard voice miniature six position network interface.

Line Change Charge (First Line and/or Additional Line) applies per line to miscellaneous customer requested changes on existing service for, but not limited to, number change and suspend/restore.

Secondary Service Charge applies per customer request for the receiving, recording, and processing of customer requests to change services or add new or additional services.

Premises Work Charge is a nonrecurring charge based on the labor time and miscellaneous materials required to rearrange the drop wire, protector and/or network interface or to install semi-public telephone service.

CUSTOMER REQUEST

The term "per customer request" as used in this section shall be defined as a customer request for service that is ordered at the same time to be provided on the same date, the same premises, the same system, and the same account.

NETWORK INTERFACE

The network interface is a FCC approved standard registration program jack which is used at the demarcation point as a means of connection between the telecommunications network and the customer's inside wire and/or equipment.

DEMARCATIION POINT

The point of demarcation and/or interconnection between Company communications facilities and the customer's terminal equipment, protective apparatus or wiring at a subscriber's premises.* Company-installed facilities at, or constituting, the demarcation point shall consist of wire or a jack conforming to Subpart F of Part 68 of the Federal Communications Commission's rules.

The charges for the installation of services are set forth in A9.1.6 following as nonrecurring charges for the Local Channel and Interoffice Channel rate elements.

Nonrecurring charges apply for each service terminated at the subscriber's premises. When more than one of the same type of service, between the same locations and for the same customer, is ordered and installed at the same time, one local channel at each location is billed at the First Service Installed rate and the others are billed at the Additional Service Installed rate.

A central office work charge as described in A4.1 of this Tariff is also applicable, and is set forth in A9.1.6 following as a nonrecurring charge for the Exchange Access rate element.

b. Service Rearrangements

- (1) Service rearrangements are changes to existing (installed) services which do not result in a change in the physical location of the point of termination at a customer premises. Changes in the physical location of the point of termination are treated as moves and are described and charged for as set forth in C. following.

The charge to the customer for the service rearrangement is dependent on whether the change is administrative only in nature or involves actual physical change to the service.

Interoffice mileage is portrayed in mileage bands. A fixed rate and a rate per mile applies to each such channel and band.

This service requires design considerations and equipment different from the multipoint service described in the Private Line Service Tariff, and is not to be considered as a similar service.

~~Hotel Service is available in connection with certain types of dial as well as manual systems. Dial systems are furnished on a message rate basis or on a combination arrangement providing for administrative use on a flat rate basis and guests' use on a message rate basis. Access to flat rate trunks from the message rate stations furnished in guests' rooms is not permissible with the combination arrangement. Manual installations are made on a message rate basis only.~~ (C)

When a hotel subscribes to ELS, the ELS usage charge cap limits will not apply to any trunk facility that may be accessed from a hotel guest station. (N)

Hotel dial systems are furnished on a message rate basis or with ELS or on a combination arrangement. The combination arrangement may consist of flat rate service or ELS for exclusive use of administrative stations and message rate service for guest stations, or flat rate service for exclusive administrative use and ELS for guest station use. Access to trunks intended for administrative use from stations furnished in guest rooms is not permissible with the combination arrangement. Manual installations are made on a message rate or uncapped ELS basis only.

Except as provided hereinafter, flat and message rate, and Expanded Local Service (ELS) trunks are offered to business subscribers. Flat rate trunks are available to residence subscribers. Residence customers can subscribe to message rate service trunks or to Expanded Local Service trunks at the same rates, terms and conditions as for business customers.

This arrangement does not permit outgoing calls access to flat rate trunks from the message rate stations in patients' rooms. Incoming calls to both flat rate and message rate stations may be accessed over trunks with both flat rate incoming trunks and message rate both-way trunks combined in a single rotary group. However, a sufficient number of flat rate trunks must be installed and maintained to handle the administrative incoming busy hour load. This number of flat rate incoming trunks will be determined by the Company based on initial estimates of calling loads and is subject to review at reasonable intervals when in the Company's judgment it may be required.~~ (C)

E. Flat rate or message rate ^{or ELS} for a combination flat rate ^{or ELS} and message rate service ^{or ELS} may be provided to a retirement complex licensed as an Adult Congregate Living Facility. (C)

F. Time Share (Interval Ownership) Condominiums may be furnished business message rate ~~or measured~~ service for the joint use of management and occupants of living units. Management may subscribe to separate business service for its administrative use. Occupants of living units may individually subscribe to separate residence service. (T)

The basic objective of statewide rate making is to apply throughout the state a well balanced and coordinated pattern of rate treatment providing rates which are uniform under substantially similar conditions. Any such plan must produce, in the aggregate, rate levels perceived by customers to be in line with the values those customers get from the services. In turn, these rate levels must be capable of producing, together with other services, reasonable earnings on the Company's total telephone operations within the state.

In order to achieve the basic objective of statewide rate making in the exchange area, rate levels are based on the relative value of service considerations rather than absolute costs. These value-of-service considerations include such factors as relative costs, the direction or trend of costs in one area versus another area and the desire to promote the goal of universal service.

These are then specifically applied through the use of objectives such as the objective relationship between individual flat rate residence lines in the smallest and largest exchange rate groups.

Relationships such as the preceding provide substantive guides for pricing decisions which have resulted (and can continue to result) in fair and reasonable prices for basic services; especially when considered in the context of the "minimized residual revenue requirements" approach. Importantly, the actual results of past decisions using these value-of-service considerations have been well accepted (virtual achievement of universal service) which clearly indicates their fairness and usefulness.

Cost Support for Southern Bell's Grouping Plan in Florida

Actual cost levels are not used in the establishment of the rate group plan for flat rate exchange service in Florida. The general objectives in setting up the grouping for a given state is to provide: 1) enough groups to permit a reasonable spread of rates within the state, with moderate increases in rate levels in going from any one group to the next higher group, but not so many groups as to result in insignificant differences in the rates of different groups; 2) broad enough grouping to avoid the probability that many exchanges will grow out of their groups within a relatively short time period (width of groups generally increases in size of exchange); and 3) group limits such that exchanges of about the same size, or which customers think of as similar, will fall into the same group.

It should be emphasized that these kinds of objectives do not yield precise statements or results; nor should these be considered that such are necessary. Further, it must be recognized that the break points between exchange rate groups have developed over time through similar considerations and Commission approvals in past rate cases.

Attached is Scheduled E-6 that describes the current exchange groupings, exchanges regrouped in the test year and those regrouped or anticipated to be regrouped in the year following the test year.

11. Narrative Description of Methodology (including time period) Used to Develop Holding Time/Line

In order to provide the data required on Schedule E-9, Southern Bell devised a study methodology that included construction of a random sample of ten percent of the wire centers in Florida, weighted by the number of lines in the various rate groups. Wire centers included in the study were from each of the following exchanges: Cedar Key, Belle Glade, Bronson, Welaka, Sugar Loaf Key, Daytona Beach, DeLand, Jensen Beach, Eau Gallie, Gulf Breeze, Jupiter, Middleburg, Jacksonville, Jacksonville Beach, Mandarin, Orlando, Hollywood, Pompano Beach, Fort Lauderdale, Miami and North Dade.

Usage data was collected via Southern Bell's billing system for each and every line in these 22 wire centers and sorted by category of service for March 1993. The data was aggregated for business day, busy hours in each of the twenty-two wire centers. The busy hour usage was then added together, divided by the number of business days in the period and then by the number of lines in the particular category of service. The result of this method is the average number of minutes (holding time) per line during the average business day busy hour.
