NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER WITH REQUIREMENT FOR FLORIDA TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMPANIES AND ACCEPTANCE OF ADMINISTRATOR'S BUDGET WITH CERTAIN MODIFICATIONS

BY THE COMMISSION:

Notice is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for formal proceeding pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

The Florida Public Service Commission (FPSC) is seeking certification by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the state relay system. Section 427.702(3)(b), Florida Statutes, states it is the intent of the legislature that the Florida telecommunications system meets or exceeds the certification requirements of the FCC.

In part 64 of its rules, the FCC has described a procedure for a state to receive certification of its relay program. The FPSC filed its request for state certification on December 22, 1992. By letter dated April 26, 1993, the FCC identified areas requiring additional information or clarification.

REQUIREMENTS FOR LOCAL EXCHANGE COMPANIES AND ALL FLORIDA TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMPANIES

FCC Rule 64.604(c)(2), requires:

Carriers, through publication in their directories, periodic billing inserts, placement of TRS (Telephone Relay Service) instructions in telephone directories, through directory assistance services, and incorporation of TT numbers in telephone directories, shall assure that callers in their service areas are aware of the availability and use of TRS.

To ensure compliance with this regulation, the local exchange companies need to:

(a) publish the toll-free Florida Relay Service telephone number in the alphabetical (white pages) listings under "Florida Relay Service," "Relay Service," and "TDD Relay Service," in all directories issued on or after December 1, 1993.

(b) add to the annual bill insert regarding services provided by the LEC to the handicapped as required by Rule 25-4.079(3), F.S., a description of the services provided by the Florida Telecommunications Relay, Inc., (FTRI), and the Florida Relay Service (FRS), that includes telephone numbers to contact both organizations.

(c) publish in all telephone directories issued on or after December 1, 1993, instructions on how to use the Relay Service and how to obtain services of FTRI and locate that information in sections of the directory's information pages that could be easily located by both people with hearing or speech impairments as well as those without such impairments.

In addition, all Florida telecommunications companies which provide directory assistance must ensure by August 1, 1993, that customers are able to obtain from direc ory assistance services telephone numbers for the FRS based upon either specific requests for that listing or broad requests for relay assistance.

The FPSC accepts the budget submitted by the FTRI with certain modifications. The budget shall be grouped into five categories as shown on Attachment A. FTRI may move amounts between these five categories not to exceed 10 percent of the category from which the funds are being moved, without prior Commission authorization.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the above requirements be followed.

ORDERED that in the event any one portion of this order is protested, the other portion shall become final. Any protests must specify the portion of the order being protested.

ORDERED that this Docket No. 910496-TP shall remain open.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

The action proposed herein is preliminary in nature and will not become effective or final, except as provided by Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code. Any person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed by this order may file a petition for a formal proceeding, as provided by Rule 25-22.029(4), Florida Administrative Code, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036(7)(a) and (f), Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting at his office at 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0870, by the close of business on July 28, 1993.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become effective on the day subsequent to the above date as provided by Rule 25-22.029(6), Florida Administrative Code.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this order becomes final and effective on the date described above, any party adversely affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
