SOUTHERN BELL TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY'S
RESPONSE AND OBJECTIONS TO PUBLIC COUNSEL'S
SIXTY-THIRD REQUEST FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS
AND MOTION FOR A TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER

COMES NOW, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company ("Southern Bell" or "Company"), and files, (1) pursuant to Rules 25-22.034, Florida Administrative Code, Rule 1.350, Florida Rules of Civil Procedure, its Responses and Objections to the Office of Public Counsel's ("Public Counsel") Sixty-Third Request for Production of Documents dated October 19, 1993 and 2) pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(5)(c), Florida Administrative Code, its Motion for Temporary Protective Order.

MOTION FOR TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER

Some of the documents that will be delivered to or made available for review by Public Counsel contain proprietary, confidential business information that should not be publicly disclosed. Thus, pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(5)(c), Florida Administrative Code, Southern Bell moves the Prehearing Officer to issue a Temporary Protective Order exempting these documents from 119.07(1), Florida Statutes. These documents contain, among other things, financial information relating to nonregulated entities, and other proprietary confidential business information. Such information is specifically included as

proprietary confidential business information pursuant to § 364.183, Florida Statutes. If Public Counsel subsequently notifies Southern Bell that any of the proprietary documents are to be used in a proceeding before the Commission, Southern Bell will, in accordance with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, file a detailed motion for protective order specifically addressing each of the documents identified.

GENERAL RESPONSE AND OBJECTIONS

1. Southern Bell objects to Public Counsel's proposed "Instruction" relating to details of privileged documents. To the extent a document responsive to any of the requests is subject to an applicable privilege, some of the information requested by Public Counsel would be similarly privileged and therefore not subject to discovery. Notwithstanding this objection, Southern Bell will provide a general description of any material withheld due to an applicable privilege.

2. With regard to Public Counsel's definition of "document" or "documents", Southern Bell has made a diligent, good faith attempt to locate documents responsive to the scope of Public Counsel's individual requests for documents.

3. Southern Bell objects to Public Counsel's definition of "you" and "your" as well as the definition of "BellSouth." It appears that Public Counsel, through its definition of these words, is attempting to obtain discovery of information in the possession, custody, or control of entities that are not parties

to this docket. Requests for production of documents may be directed only to parties, and any attempt by Public Counsel to obtain discovery from non-parties should be prohibited. See Rule 1.340, Florida Rules of Civil Procedure; Broward v. Kerr, 454 So.2d 1068 (4th D.C.A. 1984).

4. Southern Bell does not believe it was Public Counsel's intent to require Southern Bell to produce again the same documents previously produced in other dockets, but to the extent it does, Southern Bell objects on the basis that such a request would be unduly burdensome, oppressive and unnecessary, and for these reasons is prohibited.

5. Southern Bell objects to the specific time and place designated by Public Counsel for the production of documents for the reasons that the designation is not reasonable, but has no objection to producing the documents that are responsive and to which no other objection is made, at a mutually agreed upon time and place.

6. The following Specific Responses are given subject to the above-stated General Responses and Objections.

SPECIFIC RESPONSES

7. With respect to Request No. 868, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody, or control at a mutually convenient time and place subject to the Motion for Temporary Protective Order set forth above.

8. With respect to Request No. 869, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody,

or control at a mutually convenient time and place subject to the Motion for Temporary Protective Order set forth above. Also Southern Bell refers Public Counsel to Southern Bell's Response to Public Counsel's Forty-First Request for Production of Documents, Item No. 595.

9. With respect to Request No. 870, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody, or control at a mutually convenient time and place subject to the Motion for Temporary Protective Order set forth above.

10. With respect to Request No. 871, Southern Bell refers Public Counsel to Southern Bell's Response to Public Counsel's Forty-Eighth Request for Production of Documents, Item No. 736; Thirty-Second Request for Production of Documents, Item No. 460; Fortieth Request for Production of Documents, Item No. 553; and Eleventh Request for Production of Documents, Item No. 108.

11. With respect to Request No. 872, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody, or control at a mutually convenient time and place subject to the Motion for Temporary Protective Order set forth above.

12. With respect to Request No. 873, Southern Bell objects to this request on the basis that it requests material subject to the attorney-client privilege (detailed descriptions of the work performed) and also on the grounds that some of the material requested deals with expenses retained by BellSouth or charged to nonregulated subsidiaries having no transactions with BellSouth Telecommunications. However, in an attempt to be as cooperative

as possible with the Public Counsel's request (in light of the above), BellSouth agrees to provide a list which summarizes payees, amounts and nature of representation for all 1992 outside legal service charges which resulted in allocations or billing to BellSouth Telecommunications. The compilation of this material is underway. Since hundreds of vouchers and invoices must be individually reviewed, the response cannot be finalized by the original due date but will be provided as soon as possible.

13. With respect to Request No. 874, Southern Bell refers Public Counsel to Southern Bell's Response to Public Counsel's Sixty-First Request for Production of Documents, Item No. 865.

14. With respect to Request No. 875, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody, or control at a mutually convenient time and place.

15. With respect to Request No. 876, Southern Bell refers Public Counsel to Southern Bell's Response to Public Counsel's Fifty-Third Set of Interrogatories, Item No. 1330.

16. With respect to Request No. 877, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody, or control at a mutually convenient time and place.

17. With respect to Request No. 878, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody, or control at a mutually convenient time and place subject to the Motion for Temporary Protective Order set forth above.

18. With respect to Request No. 879, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody,

or control at a mutually convenient time and place subject to the Motion for Temporary Protective Order set forth above.

19. With respect to Request No. 880, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody, or control at a mutually convenient time and place.

20. With respect to Request No. 881, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody, or control at a mutually convenient time and place.

21. With respect to Request No. 882, Southern Bell refers Public Counsel to Southern Bell's Response to Public Counsel's Sixty-Third Request for Production of Documents, Item No. 879 and First Request for Production of Documents, Item No. 14.

22. With respect to Request No. 883, Southern Bell refers Public Counsel to Southern Bell's Response to Public Counsel's Fifty-Second Set of Interrogatories, Item No. 1304.

23. With respect to Request No. 884, Southern Bell will produce responsive documents that are in its possession, custody, or control at a mutually convenient time and place subject to the Motion for Temporary Protective Order set forth above.
