Issue 1: Recommendation that extended calling service (ECS) should be implemented on all the routes listed in Table A shown in staff's memorandum dated August 3, 1995, including the Boynton Beach/Boca Raton route which currently has the \$.25 plan. Residential customers should pay \$.25 per call regardless of duration, and business calls on these routes should be rated at \$.10 for the first minute and \$.06 for each additional minute. ECS should be implemented on these routes as soon as possible, but not to exceed six months from the issuance date of the order from this recommendation.

Pay phone providers will charge end-users \$.25 per message and pay the standard measured interconnection usage charge. Interexchange carriers (IXCs) may continue to carry the same types of traffic on these routes that they are now authorized to carry.

Issue 2: Recommendation that extended calling service (ECS) should be implemented on the McIntosh/Gainesville route. Residential customers should pay \$.25 per call regardless of duration, and business calls on these routes should be rated at \$.10 for the first minute and \$.06 for each additional minute. ECS should be implemented on these routes as soon as possible, but not to exceed six months from the issuance date of the order from this recommendation. Pay telephone providers will charge end-users \$.25 per message and pay the standard measured interconnection usage charge. Interexchange carriers (IXCs) may continue to carry the same types of traffic on these routes that they are now authorized to carry.

Issue 6A: Recommendation that extended calling service (ECS) should be implemented on the Freeport/Fort Walton Beach route. Residential customers should pay \$.25 per call regardless of duration, and business calls on this route should be rated at \$.10 for the first minute and \$.06 for each additional minute. ECS should be implemented on this route as soon as possible, but not to exceed six months from the issuance date of the order from this recommendation. Pay telephone providers will charge end-users \$.25 per message and pay the standard measured interconnection usage charge. Interexchange carriers (IXCs) may continue to carry the same types of traffic on this route that they are now authorized to carry.

<u>Issue 6B:</u> Recommendation that the Freeport exchange, which currently has the \$.20 plan, should not be balloted for nonoptional, flat rate, two-way EAS to the Valparaiso exchange. The calling rates and distribution factors on this route do not exhibit a sufficient community of interest to warrant a survey for EAS. Therefore, no further action should be taken on this route.
