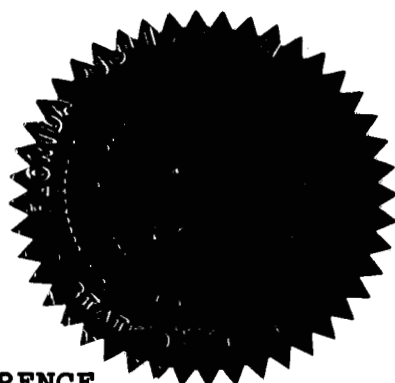

(Hearing convened at 9:30 a.m.)

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3 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Call the prehearing conference
4 to order. Could we have the notice read, please?

5 **MS. BARONE:** Pursuant to notice this time and place
6 has been set for a prehearing conference in 950737-TP,
7 investigation into temporary local telephone number
8 portability solution to implement competition in local
9 exchange telephone markets.

10 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Thank you. Take appearances.

11 **MS. WILSON:** Laura Wilson, appearing on behalf of
12 the Florida Cable Telecommunications Association, 310 N.
13 Monroe Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32301. Also appearing is
14 Charles F. Dudley.

15 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** I'm sorry, Charles?
16 Ms. Wilson, I'm sorry, who else was appearing?

17 **MS. WILSON:** Excuse me. Charles F. Dudley.

18 **MR. RINDLER:** Good morning. Richard Rindler,

16 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Thank you. Do we have any
17 preliminary matters?

18 MS. BARONE: Yes, we have several.

19 First, if the parties have any typos, I'd ask that
20 you submit those to me in writing by noon tomorrow. I will
21 not address those today.

22 Second, we'd like to note there are no pending
23 motions to be addressed today. Time Warner's motion to accept
24 direct testimony and exhibits of Danny G. Engleman was granted
25 in Order No. PSC-95-1241-PCO-TP.

1 Third, GTE Florida contacted Staff to clarify
2 language in Issue 3. I will read this clarification when we
3 address that issue.

4 Finally, to streamline this proceeding, I'd like to
5 ask the parties if they agree that Issues 1, 2, 6 and 7 have
6 been stipulated. And if so, do they concur with the
7 stipulated language provided by Staff that's in the draft
8 Prehearing Order? If not, we should proceed issue by issue.

9 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** I'll repeat that question:
10 Issues 1, 2, 6 and 7 are addressed in the stipulation that has
11 been approved by the Commission. The question is, is the
12 stipulated language as contained in the draft Prehearing Order
13 acceptable to all parties, and I'll ask that question at this
14 point. Is there any objection to that stipulated language?

15 **MR. MELSON:** Commissioner Deason, I've got a concern
16 about the stipulated language on Issue 2, in that I believe
17 that language may be incomplete and not -- let me take a step
18 back.

19 The stipulation has got a lot more language in it
20 than appears in the summary under the various issues. If
21 these are intended to be understood only as summaries, I do
22 not have a problem. To the extent that this is intended to be
23 a complete statement of the stipulation on the issue, I
24 believe there's some language that probably ought to be added
25 to the summary of the stipulation on Issue 2.

1 And it is in the second sentence of that
2 stipulation. "However, the parties agree that --" I would
3 insert the words "flexible direct inward dialing is an
4 alternative temporary local number portability mechanism, and
5 that --" and then continue with the rest of the sentence, "the
6 LECs will continue to negotiate," etcetera.

7 That language was something that we felt was
8 important in the stipulation itself, and I believe it's
9 appropriate to include here to make this as accurate summary
10 of the stipulation.

11 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** I think the stipulation speaks
12 for itself, but for the sake of clarity and precision, I don't
13 see where there would be a problem to adding that language,
14 unless there's something that I'm missing. Staff?

15 **MS. BARONE:** Could you repeat that again?

16 **MR. MELSON:** Yes. "However, the parties agree that
17 flexible direct inward dialing is an alternative temporary
18 local number portability mechanism, and that --"

19 And, Commissioner, for your information, that
20 excerpt is a direct quote out of the final paragraph on Page 3
21 of the stipulation.

22 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Is there any objection by
23 Staff?

24 **MR. BARONE:** No.

25 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Any objection by any other

1 party to the insertion of that language as it was read by Mr.
2 Melson?

3 **MR. WAHLEN:** With the understanding that the
4 stipulation is the document that controls the agreement
5 between the parties, we don't have any objection.

6 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** I think that is clear.
7 Obviously the stipulation is the controlling document. Okay.
8 Just for the sake of clarity, Staff can make that change in
9 the final Prehearing Order.

10 Before we get to the specific issues realizing that
11 Issues 2, 3, 6 and 7 are just going to be stipulated, we will
12 not address those specific issues. So before we get to
13 issues, there are some preliminary sections of the draft
14 Prehearing Order.

15 **MS. BARONE:** Excuse me. Commissioner Deason, the
16 issues are 1, 2, 6 and 7 that have been stipulated to.

17 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** I'm sorry, 1, 2, 6 and 7.
18 There's a question as to whether Issue 3 is moot, I take it.
19 We'll get to that.

20 There are some preliminary sections of the draft
21 Prehearing Order, those being Section I, the case background.
22 Are there any changes or corrections to the case background?

23 Section II is procedure for handling confidential
24 information, which is fairly standard in Commission Prehearing
25 Orders. Any changes, questions?

1 Section III addresses the prefiled testimony and
2 exhibits. Any concern for Section III?

3 Section IV addresses the order of witnesses. Any
4 questions or concerns with the order of witnesses as
5 presented?

6 **MS. WEISKE:** Your Honor, Sue Weiske for Time Warner
7 Communications.

8 Mr. Engleman does have a prior commitment on
9 Saturday and wondered if it would be possible that he be
10 scheduled for a time certain on Friday, or some point on
11 Friday, so he can return to Denver on Friday night?

12 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Staff?

13 **MS. BARONE:** We have one concern. We need to be
14 sure that the three LEC witnesses go on Friday because one of
15 our Staff members will not be here on Saturday.

16 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** I'm sorry. You'll have to
17 speak a little louder.

18 **MS. BARONE:** The three LEC witnesses need to go on
19 Friday because one of the Staff members will not be here on
20 Saturday. That's the only concern that we have.

21 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** I take it then that the order
22 is going to stay as is. There's just been an expression that
23 Mr. Engleman be allowed to testify on Friday, but there's also
24 been an expression that the three LEC witnesses who are the
25 first three witnesses also testify on Friday.

1 It would be my desire we hear all witnesses on
2 Friday. I think that's probably a concensus, and I would
3 anticipate that that is a likely event. I don't think anyone
4 wants to be here on Saturday.

5 I cannot guarantee that Mr. Engleman will be heard
6 on Friday, but that we will endeavor to make that
7 accommodation as we typically do here at the Commission.

8 With him being the fourth witness, I would think
9 that the prospects are very good that he will testify on
10 Friday. Hopefully, all witnesses will testify on Friday.
11 Mr. Dunbar

12 **MR. DUNBAR:** Commissioner, I just wondered, because
13 Mr. Engleman is also offering rebuttal testimony, if we could
14 take both at the same time?

15 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** That's a good observation. I
16 did not catch that. Is there any objection to Mr. Engleman
17 offering direct and rebuttal simultaneously when he takes the
18 witness stand? We can make that accommodation, Mr. Dunbar.

19 **MS. BARONE:** Commissioner Deason, we could begin the
20 proceeding earlier. I think it's scheduled for 9:30 that day,
21 if that would be helpful.

22 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** My only hesitation is the
23 Chairman's office is the entity which does all of the
24 scheduling. I would encourage you to approach the Chairman's
25 office, and if there's not some other conflict, I certainly

1 have no objection to starting at an earlier time. Is there
2 any objection by any party starting earlier than 9:30 on that
3 Friday?

4 Just inquire with the Chairman's office and maybe we
5 can get started a little earlier, that would help, ensure we
6 could conclude it on Friday.

7 **MR. RINDLER:** Commissioner, Mr. Devine is scheduled
8 to be the last witness on rebuttal. His wife is expecting at
9 any time. I, again, would like to see whether we could do the
10 rebuttal and direct on Friday, all one day, so that he doesn't
11 have to be away.

12 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Is there any objection to
13 having the direct and rebuttal testimony of Mr. Devine taken
14 simultaneously when he first appears? We'll also make that
15 accommodation.

16 **MR. MELSON:** Chairman Deason, with the last person
17 who is both the direct and rebuttal witness, Mr. Price, if
18 we're going to combine them, we might as well combine his.

19 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Any objection to combining the
20 direct and rebuttal of Witness Price? Hearing no objection,
21 we'll do that also. I guess then that Mr. Guedel will be the
22 last witness. What commitment does he have, Mr. Tye?

23 **MR. TYE:** I expect he can think of something better
24 to do on Saturday, Mr. Chairman, but he'll be here.

25 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Okay. Thank you, Mr. Tye.

1 Any other clarification on the order of witnesses?

2 MR. WAHLEN: I'm not sure if this is in the nature
3 of a typo, but Centel and United would like the Prehearing
4 Order to reflect that Mr. Poag will testify on all issues.

5 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. Okay. We'll
6 proceed then to Section V, which is the basic positions. Any
7 changes or corrections to the basic positions as stated?

8 MR. RINDLER: Commissioner, I have a change to
9 Metropolitan Fiber Systems'. I will provide it to Staff in
10 writing. The addition would be at the end of the statement,
11 which is on Page 9. I would add "that costs should be spread
12 across all providers based on the relative quantity of
13 telephone numbers forwarded. And then charged on a per line
14 per month basis."

15 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Staff, did you get that
16 language or are you going to need a written version?

17 MS. BARONE: I'd like a written version. If you
18 could submit that to me in writing. Thank you.

19 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. Okay. Section VI
20 of the Prehearing Order addresses issues and positions. We've
21 already addressed Issues 1, 2, 6 and 7. We will now address
22 Issue 3.

23 I believe at least one party raised the possibility
24 that Issue 3 is moot. Did I read that correctly?

25 MS. BARONE: Yes. GTE raised that, and also GTE

1 made this clarification. GTE states that they believe the
2 stipulation has rendered Issue 3 moot. "If, however, the
3 Commission Staff believes, or the Commission rules, that this
4 issue is, in fact, still open, GTE Florida reserves the right
5 to take a position at a later time."

6 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Staff, what is your position
7 concerning Issue 3 as to whether the issue is or is not moot?

8 **MS. BARONE:** We think it could be moot if everyone
9 agrees. The reason it's in there is because of Issue 6 and
10 they wanted to address it in Issue 3 and Issue 6.

11 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** I'll open the question then to
12 the parties. Is there any concern that Issue 3 is or is not
13 moot, and if it is moot, then Issue 6 adequately addresses all
14 matters which may be in question. I'm sorry, is it Issue 6?

15 **MS. BARONE:** There were concerns earlier that these
16 issues wouldn't be able to be addressed in Issue 6, so we let
17 Issue 3 stay so that they could address the issues.

18 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** So I guess the question is is
19 that Issue 6, since it's stipulated, does it adequately
20 address all matters which are relevant thereto? Do any of the
21 parties have any position one way or the other concerning
22 Issue 3 as to whether that issue is or is not moot?

23 Ms. Wilson.

24 **MS. WILSON:** Commissioner, on behalf of FCTA, we do
25 not believe Issue 3 is moot. We believe that the

1 disadvantages with remote call forwarding will bear upon the
2 price that should be established for that. So we would not
3 agree with GTE that it is moot.

4 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Very well. Mr. Melson.

5 **MR. MELSON:** We echo FCTA's comments. Issue 5
6 relates to the price for the service, and we believe the
7 advantages and disadvantages are relevant inputs into the
8 pricing decision.

9 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Very well. Any other
10 comments?

11 **MR. CARVER:** Southern Bell. We believe it is moot,
12 because as originally drafted, 3 was to be a discussion of the
13 advantages and disadvantages of whatever the parties proposed
14 in 2. We've now stipulated to the only option that's
15 technologically feasible within the time frame we have, so it
16 seems to us whether that one has advantages or disadvantages
17 really is moot, to the extent it's the only thing available.

18 I'd also submit, while pricing is an issue, we
19 believe that's really going to rely more upon the testimony
20 that you hear regarding cost. Our position is that even if
21 there are disadvantages, that will not justify pricing it
22 below cost. So to some extent that discussion also is moot,
23 and not particularly relevant to the pricing testimony that
24 you'll hear and what will need to be determined.

25 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Okay. Any other comments?

1 **MR. MELSON:** Chairman Deason, if I might respond to
2 the last statement.

3 We think that the question of advantages and
4 disadvantages may go to the question of how much, if any,
5 above cost the service should be priced. There's a difference
6 on that issue.

7 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** I understand. I'm not at this
8 point going to make any decision which is going to foreclose
9 the possibility of the full Commission having all information
10 relevant to the determination of what price should be. That
11 being the case I'm not going to determine that Issue 3 is
12 moot. During the deliberations it may be that Issue 3 is
13 determined to be moot, but I'm not making that decision here
14 today. So well retain Issue 3 as an issue. That being the
15 case, are there any changes or corrections to the positions as
16 provided within the draft Prehearing Order on Issue 3? I
17 believe there are none.

18 We can then go to Issue 4. Are there any changes or
19 corrections to the positions as stated for Issue 4?

20 **MS. WILSON:** Commissioner, FCTA is able to take a
21 position, revised positions for Issue 4 and 5, which I have
22 supplied to Staff and I can supply to the parties at this
23 time.

24 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Very well. Let me revert back
25 to Issue 3 while you're doing that, Ms. Wilson. I understand

1 that GTE is going to provide a position for Issue 3 and that
2 will be provided to Staff by -- is that noon tomorrow?

3 MS. BARONE: Yes.

4 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. Ms. Menard, is
5 that acceptable?

6 MS. MENARD: Yes.

7 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. I have been handed
8 some revised language for positions on Issues 4 and 5 by the
9 Florida Cable Telecommunications Association. Staff has this
10 information; is that correct?

11 MS. BARONE: Yes, we do.

12 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Any other changes to Issue 4?
13 Hearing none, we'll go then to Issue 5. Changes corrections
14 concerning Issue 5.

15 MR. RINDLER: Commissioner, with respect to MFS's
16 position stated on 28, there is a corresponding change to the
17 one made in the basic position. It would read in substitution
18 for what is presently there, "The costs should be based on
19 incremental direct cost with no contribution. The costs
20 should be spread across all providers based on the relative
21 quantity of telephone numbers forwarded, and then charged on a
22 per line per month basis."

23 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. That's consistent
24 with the previous change. If you'll also provide that
25 language to Staff as well.

1 **MR. RINDLER:** Yes.

2 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Any other changes for Issue5?
3 Issue 6 has been stipulated. Issue 7 has been stipulated.
4 Issue 8, changes or corrections to positions for issue eight.
5 Hearing none, that take us then to Section VII, which is the
6 exhibit list. Any changes or corrections to the exhibit list?
7 Very well.

8 Section VII addresses the proposed stipulations. I
9 think we've already addressed that by the specific issues.
10 Section IX is pending motions. We've already addressed that
11 pending motion, have we not?

12 **MS. BARONE:** Yes, we have.

13 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Very well. And I assume the
14 rulings will reflect that.

15 **MS. BARONE:** Yes.

16 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** Any other matters to be
17 brought up to the Prehearing Officer at this time?

18 Mr. Melson.

19 **MR. MELSON:** Just a housekeeping matter, on the
20 issues that have been stipulated, is the intention to have the
21 Prehearing Order reflect just the stipulation or to reflect
22 all of the additional language from the various parties?

23 **COMMISSIONER DEASON:** It would be, I think, just for
24 clarity and for preservation of paper, it would be easier just
25 to show the stipulation.

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MR. MELSON: That would be my hope.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Any objection? Very well,
that will be contained in the Prehearing Order, just the
stipulation language.

Okay. I believe that then disposes of 950737.


