## **POST-HEARING STATEMENT OF METROPOLITAN FIBER SYSTEMS OF FLORIDA, INC.**

Pursuant to Rule 25-22.038(3), Florida Administrative Code and Order No. PSC-95-1246-

PHO-TP, Metropolitan Fiber Systems of Florida, Inc. ("MFS"), by its undersigned attorneys, hereby

files this post-hearing statement of issues and positions.

- What is the definition of temporary number portability pursuant to Section 364.16(4), ISSUE 1: Florida Statutes?
  - \* Pursuant to the Commission-approved stipulation in this proceeding, temporary number portability is defined as an end user's ability at a given location to change service from a local exchange company to an alternative local exchange company or vice versa, or between two ALECs, without changing their local telephone number.
- What technical solutions will be available by January 1, 1996, to provide temporary number portability?
  - Pursuant to the Commission-approved stipulation in this proceeding, the only technical solution that will be available by January 1, 1996 is remote call forwarding. However, the parties agree that the LECs will continue to negotiate with the ALECs who desire to utilize Flexible Direct Inward Dialing.

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<u>ISSUE 2</u>: ACK \_\_\_ AFA ADD CAF CASE : CTE EAC: \_\_\_\_ 5 OFC SEC ..... WAS

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- ISSUE 3: What are the advantages and disadvantages of each solution identified in Issue 2?
  - \* RCF provides the critical function of permitting end users to change local service providers while retaining their existing telephone number, with virtually no impact to the incumbent LEC's customer base and network. RCF, however, requires all calls to be routed to the LEC switch before they can be forwarded to MFS.
- ISSUE 4: What costs are associated with providing each solution identified in Issue 2?
  - \* There are limited direct incremental switching costs, as well as certain trunking and processing costs. The RCF rate should include, direct incremental costs with no contribution. LEC costs should be carefully analyzed by the Commission and the parties.
- ISSUE 5: How should the costs identified in Issue 4 be recovered?
  - \* Pursuant to the Commission-approved stipulation in this proceeding, the cost is to be assessed on a per-line, per-month basis. RCF should be a monthly rate assessed on all working telephone numbers. As all subscribers benefit from RCF, the costs of RCF should be spread evenly across the entire subscriber base.
- <u>ISSUE 6</u>: What is/are the most appropriate method(s) of providing temporary number portability?
  - \* Pursuant to the Commission-approved stipulation in this proceeding, Remote Call Forwarding is the most appropriate method to provide temporary number portability by January 1, 1996. The parties will continue to negotiate possible future options if a party desires a different option.
- ISSUE 7: What are the appropriate parameters, costs and standards for the method(s) identified in Issue 6?
  - \* Pursuant to the Commission-approved stipulation in this proceeding, LECs shall offer RCF to certificated ALECs effective January 1, 1996. There will be coordination with 911 systems and the price charged for RCF will not be below costs. *See* Statement of MFS Position on Issues 2, 5 and 6.

# <u>ISSUE 8</u>: Should the docket be closed?

\* No. It should be left open to monitor implementation.
