Q.	PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS.
	My name is Rand W. Smith. My business address is NUI Corporation, Southern
7.53	Division, 955 E. 25th Street, Hialeah, FL 33013.
Q.	BY WHOM ARE YOU EMPLOYED AND IN WHAT CAPACITY?
3500	I am employed by the NUI Corporation as Vice President - Finance for its Southern
	Division, which includes City Gas Company of Florida ("City Gas" or "the Company").
	The Southern Division also includes the North Carolina, Maryland, New York and
	Pennsylvania operations of NUI Corporation.
Q.	BRIEFLY STATE YOUR EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND AND EMPLOYMENT
	EXPERIENCE.
A.	I received a B.A. degree with a major in Social Sciences from Hofstra University in
	Hempstead, Long Island, in June 1971 and an M.B.A. with a major in Accounting
	from the same school in June 1974.
	I was employed as an auditor by Arthur Andersen & Co., independent public
	accountants, from June 1974 through January 1979 in that firm's New York City
	office. From January 1979 to April 1983, I was employed by The Continental Group,
	Inc., in Stamford, CT as Assistant Director of Accounting Compliance. From April
	1983 until January 1986, I was employed as Director of Accounting and Finance by
	the Continental Can Company in Norwalk, CT, a principal subsidiary of The

Continental Group. I was promoted to Assistant Controller of Continental Can Company in January 1986 and held that position until March 1989, when I joined NUI Corporation as Assistant Vice President. I was promoted to Vice President of NUI Corporation in March 1993 and had served as NUI Corporation's Chief Accounting Officer since February 1992. In March 1994, I transferred to the City Gas Company division of NUI Corporation as Vice President - Finance. In April 1995, NUI formed its Southern Division, with headquarters in Hialeah, FL, by combining City Gas and NUI's North Carolina, Maryland, New York and Pennsylvania operations under common management. At that time, I was named Vice President of Finance for the Southern Division, the position I hold today. I have been a Certified Public Accountant since 1976.

12 Q. PLEASE EXPLAIN THE PURPOSE OF YOUR TESTIMONY.

13 A. The purpose of my testimony is to present the comparison of Actual versus Original
14 estimate of the purchased gas adjustment cost recovery factor and true-up provision
15 for the period October 1994 through September 1995 for City Gas. Through this
16 testimony, I will also like to present the actual over- or under-recovery for the twelve
17 month period ending March 1995.

18 Q. HAS THE COMPANY PREPARED THE FORMS PRESCRIBED BY THIS 19 COMMISSION FOR THIS PURPOSE?

Yes. The forms prescribed by the Commission, Schedules A-1 through A-6 for the months of October 1994 through September 1995, Schedule A-7 and schedule E-4 for the same period, are attached to my testimony. I also provide Schedule A-7 for the twelve month period ending March 1995.

1	Q.	HAS CITY GAS PREPARED A SCHEDULE WHICH SHOWS THE ACTUAL GAS
2		COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE GAS ADJUSTMENT COST RECOVERY
3		FACTOR?
4	A.	Yes. City Gas prepared Schedule A-7, attached, which describes the total fuel cost
5		for the periods in question, recovery of such cost from ratepayers through the Gas
6		Adjustment Cost Recovery Factor, and remaining over- or under-recovery of gas
7		cost.
8	Q.	WHAT WAS THE TOTAL GAS COST INCURRED BY THE COMPANY DURING
9		THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 1995?
10	Α.	As shown on Schedule A-7, Line 1, the total cost of gas for the twelve months ended
11		September 30, 1995 is \$20,759,579. This amount includes gas cost incurred or
12		behalf of the Company's end-use transportation customers in the amount of
13		\$128,021.
14	Q.	WHAT WAS THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF GAS COST RECOVERED BY THE
15		COMPANY DURING THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 1995?
16	A.	The Company recovered \$21,741,851. This includes recovery of the \$128,021 from
17		end-use transportation customers.
18	Q.	HOW DO YOU RECONCILE THE ACTUAL COST OF GAS INCURRED AND
19		ACTUAL COST OF GAS RECOVERED AS SHOWN ON SCHEDULE A-7 WITH
20		THE NUMBERS SHOWN IN MONTHLY SCHEDULES A-1?
21	A.	The sum of the Total Cost of Gas Purchased (Line 11, "Actual" column on schedules
22		A-1) for each of the months of October 1994 through September 1995 is
23		\$20,631,558. If we add \$128,021 of end-use transportation cost, the end result is
24		\$20,759,579 as shown on Schedule A-7.

1	Q.	WHAT IS THE COMPANY'S ACTUAL TRUE-UP FOR THE TWELVE MONTHS
2		ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 1995?

- A. The actual true-up amount, including interest, is an over-recovery of \$1,338,247, as shown on the September 1995 Schedule A-2, "Actual" column, line 11.
- 5 Q. CAN YOU EXPLAIN HOW YOU ARRIVED AT THAT AMOUNT OF OVER-6 RECOVERY?
- 7 A. Yes. As shown on Schedule A-7, the total over-recovered amount for the twelve
 8 month period ending September 30, 1995 is \$1,041,284. The beginning balance on
 9 September 30, 1994 was an over-recovery of \$394,521. The sum of these two
 10 balances yields \$1,435,805. By subtracting \$97,500, which is the amount that City
 11 Gas refunded its customers during the period in question, and subtracting \$58, which
 12 is the amount that resulted from a re-calculation of the interest applied, one arrives at
 13 the total over-recovered amount of \$1,338,363.
- 14 Q. WHAT WAS THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF GAS COST RECOVERED BY THE
 15 COMPANY DURING THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDED MARCH 30, 1995?
- The Company recovered \$21,781,946 for the twelve month period ending March
 17 1995. The cost of gas for this period was \$21,385,439. This results in an over18 recovery of \$396,507 plus \$3,026 in interest. In addition, City Gas received a refund
 19 from Florida Gas Transmission Company in the amount of \$850,590. Therefore, the
 20 final over-recovered amount for this period is \$1,250,123.
- 21 Q. DOES THIS CONCLUDE YOUR TESTIMONY?
- 22 A. Yes.
