At the Commission's December 19, 1995, Agenda Conference, the Florida Public Service Commission denied the Florida Interexchange Carriers Association's (FIXCA) motion for stay of a previous PSC order that approved the Extended Calling Service (ECS) plan for 284 routes in Southern Bell's service territory.

As a result of the Commission's decision, the ECS plan on specific routesincluding 186 one-way routes in the Southeast LATA, and 98 one-way routes in the Daytona Beach, Gainesville, Jacksonville, Orlando, Panama City, and Pensacola LATAs--will be implemented January 15, 1996. Dear Ms. Clark:

I am writing you on behalf of all of my constituents in District 98 of the Florida House of Representatives. This district, which it is my privilege to represent in the Legislature, consists mainly of the cities of Sunrise and Planation, which are located in west Broward County.

It is my understanding that the Public Service Commission will be voting again at your upcoming meeting on December 19, as to whether to delay implementation of Bell South's plan to reduce phone rates on 288 calling service routes, which has already been approved by the PSC, or if you will leave it for the Florida Supreme Court to decide. As I cannot attend this meeting in person, I am taking the liberty of writing to you instead.

Bell South has made a proposal to your Commission to reduce rates in certain calling areas to a flat rate toll call of twenty-five cents. What this would do is change telephone calls which are now considered long distance or toll calls to a flat rate of twenty-five cents, regardless of the duration of the call. It is my understanding that this is a bare rate reduction, with no offset increases in any service area. Among the new service lines that would be opened up for people in District 98 would be calls to Delray Beach, Boca Raton, Boyton Beach, Homestead, and Perrine.
