Dear Chairperson Clark:

As you know, the Jacksonville Electric Authority recently entered in o a Joint Settlement Agreement with the Florida Power & Light Company that proposes to resolve the territorial dispute initiated by JEA concerning service to electric customers in St. John's County. It has been brought to my attention that the Public Service Commission is once again scheduled to consider this Agreement tomorrow, February 6, 1996.

I greatly appreciate the assistance of the Commission in deferring this matter until JEA, FP&L, and Florida Steel Corporation could meet to discuss this territorial houndary agreement. However, it is my understanding that, as of this date, JEA, FP&L, and the Florida Steel Corporation have not had the opportunity to negotiate a settlement of this matter. As a result, my concerns, initially raised before the Public Service Commission on December 4, 1995, have not been addressed. Jacksonville may lose a major provider of highly-skilled, high-paying jobs, as Tampa distrecently, due to noncompetitive energy rates.

I have requested the Board of Directors of the Jacksonville Electric Authority, Florida Power & Light, and the management of the Florida Steel Corporation to meet to discuss a mutually satisfactory solution. It is my hope that by FP&L and JEA working together with the Florida Steel Corporation, we will be able to arrive at an answer that works for everybody, and keeps Florida Steel working.
