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DIRECT TESTIMONY OF WILLIAM D. ALLEN, P.E.

- Q. Please state your name and business address.
- 3 A. William D. Allen, P.E., Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative
- 4 | Services (FDHRS), Lee County Public Health Unit, 60 Danley Drive, Unit No. 1,
- 5 Fort Myers, Florida 33907.

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- Q. Please state a brief description of your educational background and7 experience.
- 8 A. I have a B.S. in Engineering. I am a registered professional engineer
- 9 in Florida, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia, and a registered professional
- 10 surveyor in Pennsylvania. I have worked 38 years in construction,
- 11 engineering, and environmental engineering management, the last 7 years
- 12 | specifically in potable water projects.
- 13 | Q. By whom are you presently employed?
- 14 A. I am employed by the Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative
- 15 | Services (FDHRS), Lee County Public Health Unit, Environmental Engineering.
- 16 Q. How long have you been employed with the FDHRS and in what capacity?
- 17 A. I have been employed by FDHRS 5 years as a professional engineer,
- 18 administrator, and director of environmental engineering.
- 19 Q. What are your general responsibilities at the FDHRS?
- 20 A. My responsibilities include project and permit application reviews,
- 21 issuance of permit approvals, compliance with Florida Department of
- 22 Environmental Protection (FDEP) rules, supervision of 18 persons consisting
- 23 of staff engineers, technicians, and clerks. Inspection of utilities for
- 24 compliance and enforcement of state regulations and consultations with public
- 25 and utility management.

- 1 | Q. Are you familiar with the Southern States Utilities, Inc. water systems
- 2 located in the South District?
- 3 A. Yes, I am familiar with Lehigh Utilities.
- 4 Q. Was this system inspected by you, or by FDHRS staff under your
- 5 | supervision?
- 6 A. Yes.

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Lehigh Water System

- Q. Does the utility have a current construction permit from the Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) for Lehigh Water System (Lehigh)?
- 10 A. Yes. The utility has permits DS 36-274079 (to add a 0.5 MGD ground
- 11 | storage tank); DS 36-278591 (Leonard Boulevard Water Line); and DS 36-282849
- 12 (Greenbriar Transmission Line).
- 13 Q. Are the utility's treatment facilities and distribution system
- 14 sufficient to serve its present customers?
- 15 A. Yes.
- 16 Q. Does the utility maintain the required 20 psi minimum pressure
- 17 throughout the distribution system?
- 18 A. Yes.
- 19 Q. Does the utility have an adequate auxiliary power source in the event
- 20 of a power outage?
- 21 | A. Yes.
- 22 | Q. Are the utility's water wells for Lehigh located in compliance with Rule
- 23 | 62-555, Florida Administrative Code?
- 24 A. Yes.
- 25 Q. Does the utility have certified operators as required by Rule 61E12-41,

- 1 | Florida Administrative Code?
- 2 A. Yes.
- 3 Q. Has the utility established a cross-connection control program in
- 4 accordance with Rule 62-555.360, Florida Administrative Code?
- 5 A. Yes. SSU's cross-connection control program was received June 1, 1993.
- 6 Q. Is the overall maintenance of the treatment plant and distribution
- 7 facilities satisfactory?
- 8 A. Yes.
- 9 Q. Does the water produced by the utility meet the State and Federal
- 10 maximum contaminant levels for primary and secondary water quality standards?
- 11 A. Yes.
- 12 Q. Does the utility monitor the organic contaminants listed in Rule
- 13 62-550.410, Florida Administrative Code?
- 14 A. Yes.
- 15 Q. Do recent chemical analyses of raw and finished water, when compared to
- 16 regulations, suggest the need for additional treatment?
- 17 A. No.
- 18 Q. Does the utility maintain the required chlorine residual or its
- 19 equivalent throughout the distribution system?
- 20 A. Yes.
- 21 | Q. Are the plant and distribution systems in compliance with all the other
- 22 provisions of Chapter 62, Florida Administrative Code, not previously
- 23 | mentioned?
- 24 A. Yes.
- 25 Q. Has Lehigh been the subject of any FDEP enforcement action within the

past two years?

A. Yes. The utility installed a corrosion control system in 1994 for compliance with the lead and copper rule (Rule 62-551, Florida Administrative Code). In September, 1995, lead sampling results exceeded the allowable limits in more than 10% of random sampling. The utility must return to sampling every 6 months. In the October, 1995, re-sampling, lead results were within the allowable limits in more than 90% of random sampling.

- Q. Do you have anything further to add?
- A. Yes. The SSU/Lehigh management has always been cooperative and has made every effort to comply with Federal, State and Local regulations.

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
