RESOLUTION NO. 96-01-03

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF ORANGE CITY, FLORIDA, REQUESTING THAT THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION (PSC) URGE THE APPROPRIATE FEDERAL OFFICIA S TO RATIFY THE EXTENDED AREA OF SERVICES REVIEW FOR TELEPHONE RATE CHANGES BETWEEN ORANGE CITY AND ORLANDO; REPEALING ALL RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS OF RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Volusia County, on behalf of the residents of Deltona and DeBary presented a petition to the Public Service Commission in 1992 to lower the toll call rate to Orlando to \$.25, and

WHEREAS, the City of Orange City was not included in that petition; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Public Service Commission has reviewed and approved the application to charge \$.25 for calls to Orlando for the neighboring Cities of DeBary and Deltona; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Orange City by virtue of their geographic location, are no different than the citizens of Deltona and DeBary, relative to their distance to Orlando, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Orange City finds it to be both fair and equitable to include its residents with those of Deltona and Debary, to have access to the \$.25 toll charge to Orlando, and

WHEREAS, the City of Orange City requests that the Public Service Commission act on this matter as soon as possible.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF ORANGE CITY. FLORIDA:

- SECTION 1. The City Council of Orange City concurs with the ruling of the Florida Public Service Commission on the extended area service rates.
- SECTION 2. The City Council of Orange City requests that the Public Service Commission urge the Federal Courts to act speedily in approving these rates.
- SECTION 3. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
- SECTION 4. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council of the City of Orange City, Florida, at a regular meeting of said Council held on the Bid day of January . 1996, and approved as provided by law.
