Dear Mr. Walker:

Please find enclosed the tollowing responses to your requests on July 11. I hope this information will be sufficient for you to permit issuance of exemption permits for the following communities.

The Savannahs (Docket No. 960220-WS):

Yes, the base facility charges are different. There are fifteen (15) meters each 1 1/2" in size (\$14.20/water) and (\$21.55/sewer) which makes the total base fees \$213.00/water and \$323.25/sewer.

Woodbridge @ the Lake (Docket No.960221-WS):

Yes, the base facility charges have changed. They have three (3) meters each 3" in size (\$75.35/water) and (\$54.50/sewer) which makes the total base fees \$226.05/water and \$163.50/sewer.

Coopers Hawk (Docket No. 960222-WS):

This community has six (6) meters each 2" in size (\$39.70/water) and (\$27.30/sewer) which makes the total base fees \$238.20/water and \$163.80/sewer.

The Hamptons (Docket No. 960231-WS);

You are correct. Brevard Co. does provide the wastewater service to this property @ \$2.85/1000g. The City of Melbourne bills for the County and pays them for what they collect. At the Hamptons, you will find two (2) meters 2" in size (\$43.12/water) and (\$11.55/unit/sewer, residential B).

Also enclosed are the rates from the respective cities you needed. Please call if you have any more questions or require more information in order to make the exemptions.

(e) Gallonage charge: Each customer connected to the city's wastewater system to whom a monthly bill shall be rendered for water furnished by the waterworks system of the city shall pay a charge per one thousand (1,000) gallons, or portion thereof, of water passed through the water meter for wastewater services in accordance with the schadule set forth below:

- (d) Adjustments to bills. The city manager or his designes shall be sutherised to provide adjustments to sewer bills resulting from excessive water consumption because of leaks in the water service lines, defective plusshing fixtures or unusual circumstances where the water did not enter the sanitary sewer system as waste pursuant to the following conditions:
 - (1) Excessive water consumption is defined as water consumption resulting from one of the above described causes, where the billed consumption exceeds the average monthly consumption for the previous six (6) months by at least one hundred (100) per cent and is minimum of ten thousand (10,000) gallons above said monthly average.
 - (2) The account holder shall submit a written request for adjustment within sixty (60) days of the date of the bill for which adjustment is requested.
 - (3) The account holder must establish that the water did not flow through the sanitary system.
 - (4) An adjustment to a sewer bill has not been granted in the previous twalve (12) months.
