





TECHNICAL QUALIFICATIONS AND SUMMARY OF NETWORK PLAN

Technical Qualifications and Network Plan Summary

US ONE plans to install a switching center in Tampa and to provide initial service in Tampa and the surrounding areas of Tampa and Miami (via a remote systems, and then later deploying a switch in Tampa also), ultimately encompassing all of the State of Florida (in all areas as authorized by the Commission open to competition). This will be accomplished by interconnecting to the public switched network and by other private transport facilities when technically and economically feasible. US ONE will collocate at key LEC central offices (CO), and those COs will be connected to US ONE's switching system (and each other) through a combination of either fiber, copper, or wireless technology which will be procured from existing suppliers (i.e., LECs, CAPs, etc.). US ONE will provide local exchange services utilizing a Class 5/4 (Lucent Technologies) switching systems, which will be equipped with advanced software and feature packages to provide state of the art services to consumers within the State of Florida. For transport services, US ONE will utilize private line and other services obtained from other carriers. US ONE also intends to purchase unbundled network elements from incumbent LECs and other carriers and to interconnect with equipment and networks of other carriers.

US ONE has the technical qualifications necessary to be granted a CPCN from the Commission. US ONE has already deployed a Class 5/4 switching system in Denver, CO, and is in the process of deploying a similar Class 5/4 switching system within New York City. US ONE has the technical expertise required to deploy and maintain a local exchange network. Jim Sturges, US ONE'S CEO, was previously the VP, Engineering and VP Strategic Development for LDDS/WorldCom responsible for Engineering, Network operations, network information systems, advanced technology acquisitions and international development. Owen Palmer, VP, Research and Development, through Network Design Corporation, was the principle individual responsible for developing the network design and simulation software used by LDDS/WorldCom to manage its non-facilities base long distance network. In addition, Kevin Wright, Sr. VP of Engineering and Operations has nearly 20 years of engineering and operations expertise gained from previous employment with companies such as Qwest Communications, LCI International, Long Distance Service, MidAmerican Communications, Telecom*USA, GTE and the US Government. VP of Network Design, Amy Gardner has over six years of experience in network design with LDDS/WorldCom and ACC Corp. Other senior members of the management team have considerable experience in both local and long distance operations and design at NYNEX, AT&T, MCI, Frontier and Allnet.

Barry Wagar is a senior telecommunications industry executive with extensive general management, sales and marketing, operations and program management experience with MCI and AT&T. 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
