Docket No. 960666-WS; Request for exemption from Florida Public Service RE:

Commission regulation for provision of water and wastewater service in Pinellas

County by Spring Lake Village Apartments.

On April 8, 1996, this Commission received an application from Spring Lake Village Apartments (Spring Lake or reseller) for a reseller exemption pursuant to Section 367.022(8), Florida Statutes, (F.S.). Staff has determined that Spring Lake meets the requirements for status as an service entity that will resell water and wastewater at a rate that will not exceed the actual purchase price thereof provided in Section 367.022(8), F.S.

The application was filed in accordance with Section 367.022(8), F.S., and Rule 25-30.060(3)(h), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). Included with exemption application was a statement from the agent of the system describing the statutory and factual basis for the exemption. Spring Lake is owned by Spring Lake Associates, Ltd. Mr. Warren Schob, Owner/Agent of Spring Lake Associates, Ltd. signed the application on behalf of Spring Lake. In addition, Mr. Schob acknowledged Section 837.06, Florida Statutes, regarding false statements. The applicant acknowledged the requirements of Rule 25-30.111 F.A.C., regarding annual reporting requirements. The applicant also acknowledged Chapter 367.122, F.S., which deals with the examination and testing of meters; and Rules 25-30.262 through 25-30.267, F.A.C., which explains the responsibilities of the utility owner for insuring the accuracy of the meters.

ACK	Spring Lake has named the City of St. Petersburg as the entity providing service to
AFA	the apartment complex and has submitted that company's rates and charges. The reseller
APP	has also provided its proposed rates and charges and an explanation of its proposed method
CAF	of billing. The actual rates billed to the tenants are identical to the rates charged by the
CMU	City of St. Petersburg. This demonstrates that the rates charged will not exceed the amount
	paid for water or wastewater by the resenter entity. Spring Lake does not require a deposit
CTR	and will notify this Commission of any change in this policy. Spring Lake also stated in its
EAG	application that tenants will be billed monthly, no miscellaneous charges or water charges
LEG	for common areas will be levied and that the service territory will be limited to the
	apartment complex only. The service area is identified by the following address: 6401 31st



Spring Lake has a 6.0" meter. The proposed rates for water and wastewater service for Spring Lake, charged monthly are as follows:

The 141 units at Spring Lake will be billed for consumption based on these rates. An example of a Spring Lake tenant with 6,000 gallons usage would be calculated as follows:

Base water charge	(287.22 / 141 = \$ 2.04)		\$ 2.04

In summary, staff has determined that Spring Lake meets the necessary qualifications for a nonprofit reseller exemption pursuant to Section 367.022(8), Florida Statutes and Rule 25-30.060(3)(h), Florida Administrative Code. Staff recommends that an administrative order be issued finding Spring Lake exempt from Commission regulation pursuant to Section 367.022(8), Florida Statutes. Staff further recommends that the order require Spring Lake to notify this Commission in the event of any change of circumstances or method of operation of its water system. Furthermore, staff recommends that this docket be closed.

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
