II.

Andrews & Kurth is a national law firm that represents, among other clients, several of the major interstate natural gas pipeline companies and natural gas marketing companies.

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Andrews & Kurth's interest in this proceeding derives from the fact that the restructuring of the regulated natural gas industry will affect natural gas consumers and the natural gas market, which may impact the business activities of Andrews & Kurth's clients.

III.

In an order issued July 2, 1996, the Commission established this proceeding to investigate the unbundling of gas services of the local distribution companies ("LDCs") operating in the State of Florida. Andrews & Kurth's clients have an interest in the developments affecting markets behind the Florida LDCs' distribution systems. Andrews & Kurth understands that Commission Staff and interested parties are holding workshops to discuss generic issues concerning the proposed implementation of restructured/unbundled transportation services. In order to provide knowledgeable counsel to our clients, Andrews & Kurth may desire to attend the workshop scheduled for December 12-13, 1996, and to submit written comments if necessary.
