- Parties will promptly notify the assigned Judge in the event of a settlement or other development which might alter the scheduled hearing.
- 6. The parties are expected to discuss the possibility of settlement, enter into prehearing stipulations of fact and law, identify and limit issues, and exchange exhibit and witness lists prior to the hearing.
- 7. If all parties agree, this case may proceed as a summary hearing, without discovery, if requested by motion within 15 days from the date of this Order. The Judge will enter a Final Order within 30 days after the hearing.
