COMES NOW, American Communications Services, Inc., ("ACSI"), pursuant to Rules 25-22.034 and 25-22.035, Florida Administrative Code, and Rules 1.340 and 1.280 (b), Florida Rules of Civil Procedure, hereby submits the following objections to GTE Florida Incorporated's ("GTEFL") First Request for Production of Documents to ACSI.

The Objections stated herein are preliminary in nature and are made at this time for the purpose of complying with the ten-day requirement set forth in Order No. PSC-97-0056-PCO-TL issued by the Florida Public Service Commission ("hereinafter the "Commission") in the above-referenced docket on January 15, 1997. 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1. ACSI objects to the requests to the extent that such requests seek to impose an obligation on ACSI to respond on behalf of subsidiaries, affiliates, or other persons that are not parties to this case on the grounds that such requests are overly broad, unduly burdensome, oppressive, and not permitted by applicable discovery rules.

2. ACSI has interpreted GTEFL's requests to apply to ACSI's regulated intrastate operations in GTE's Florida territories and will limit its Answers accordingly. To the extent that any request is intended to apply to matters other than Florida intrastate operations subject to the jurisdiction of the commission, ACSI objects to such request as irrelevant, overly broad, unduly burdensome, and oppressive.

3. ACSI objects to each and every request and instruction to the extent that such request or instruction calls for information which is exempt from discovery by virtue of the attorney-client privilege, work product privilege, or other applicable privilege.

4. ACSI objects to each and every request insofar as the request is vague, ambiguous, overly broad, imprecise, or utilizes terms that are subject to multiple interpretations but are not properly defined or explained for purposes of these requests. Any Answers provided by ACSI in response to GTEFL's requests will be provided subject to, and without waiver, of the foregoing objection.

5. ACSI objects to each and every request insofar as the request is not reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence and is not relevant to the subject matter of this action. ACSI will attempt to note each instance where this objection applies.

6. ACSI objects to GTEFL's discovery requests, instructions and definitions, insofar as they seek to impose obligations on ACSI which exceed the requirements of the Florida Rules of Civil Procedure or Florida law.

7. ACSI objects to providing information to the extent that such information is already in the public record before the Florida Public Service Commission, or otherwise publicly available.

8. ACSI objects to each and every request, insofar as it is unduly burdensome, expensive, oppressive, or excessively time consuming as written.

9. ACSI objects to each and every request to the extent that the information requested constitutes "trade secrets" which are privileged pursuant to Section 90.506, Florida Statutes. To the extent that GTEFL requests proprietary confidential business information which is not subject to the "trade secrets" privilege, ACSI will make such information available to counsel for GTEFL pursuant to an appropriate Protective Agreement, subject to any other general or specific objections contained herein.

OBJECTIONS TO SPECIFIC REQUESTS

Subject to and without waiver of, the foregoing general objections, ACSI enters the following specific objections with respect to GTEFL's requests:



Pursuant to the General Objections stated above, ACSI objects to GTEFL's Request for Production of Documents Items 1, 7, 8 and 9 on the grounds they seek information that is neither relevant nor reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence related to ACSI's request for interconnection with GTEFL and the issues to be determined in this docket. ACSI further objects to these requests insofar as they are unduly burdensome, expensive, oppressive, or

excessively time consuming as written. Moreover, the information requested is subject to the work product and trade secrets privileges.

12. Pursuant to the General Objections stated above, ACSI objects to Items 3 and 4 on the grounds that they seek information that is neither relevant nor reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence related to ACSI's request for interconnection with GTEFL and the issues to be determined in this docket. ACSI further objects to these requests to the extent they seek information protected by the work product, attorney/client and trade secrets privileges.

13. Pursuant to the General Objections stated above, ACSI objects to Items 2 and 6 on the grounds that they are unduly burdensome, expensive, oppressive, or excessively time consuming as written. Moreover, the information requested is subject to the work product, attorney/client and trade secrets privileges.


