PURPOSE

The purpose of this workshop is to discuss current abbreviated dialing code issues, including N11 code assignment and recent FCC actions.

Specifically, we will discuss issues such as: what abbreviated dialing codes are available; what is the status of additional abbreviated dialing codes; should abbreviated dialing codes, including N11 codes, be restricted to ensure that there is no confusion with Florida's 911 emergency system; and should any N11 codes be restricted from use as a result of recent FCC actions.
