MR. ELIAS: Notice issued by the clerk of the Florida Public Service Commission on May 30th, 1997, advises that a prehearing conference will be held in Docket 970261-EI, that is the review of the nuclear outage at Florida Power Corporation's Crystal River Unit 3 on Tuesday, June 17, 1997, at 9:30 a.m. in Room 148 of the Betty Easley Conference Center, which is located at 4075 Esplanade Way, Tallahassee,

CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: Take appearances.

- MR. TWOMEY: I'm Mike Twomey. With me is Wayne Malaney for the Lake Dora Harbour Homeowners Association.
- MR. GROSS: Michael Gross, Attorney General's office.
- MR. McGEE: Jim McGee and with me is Alex Glenn and Gary Sasso, all appearing on behalf of Florida Power Corporation.
- MS. KAUPMAN: John McWhirter and Vicki Gordon Kaufman appearing on behalf of the Florida Industrial Power Users Group.

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MR. HOWE: I'm Roger Howe with the Office of Public Counsel. With me is Mr. Jack Shreve, the Public Counsel. The address and representation are as shown in the draft Prehearing Order.

MR. ELIAS: Bob Elias, and with me are Vicki Johnson and Leslie Paugh representing the Commission Staff.

CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: Very good. Are there any preliminary matters?

MR. MOWHIRTER: In keeping with the Commission's philosophy to see if the parties can work out their differences, since early in this case Public Counsel and I have met with Florida Power Corporation to discuss possibilities of coming to an amicable agreement. Today is the first time that all of the adversary parties are gathered together in one room. And we thought it might be helpful if you would agree that to give us maybe a two-hour recess before we go into the preliminary hearing in order that we might withdraw and sit around the table and see if we can reach some solutions, and settle some of the issues or maybe all of the issues. And if you think well of that, I would respectfully move that you give us a two-hour recess to go into more detail on that subject.

CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: Staff?

MR. ELTAS: That's certainly consistent with the purposes of the prehearing conference.

CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: I'm certain all of the parties then were aware of the need for that time and there were no objections? That will be fine.

I'll then -- show us in recess until -- I
will be in my office, so we'll say 11:30, but if youneed more time give me a call and we'll readjust that.

MR. McWHIRTER: Thank you very much.

CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: Thank you all.

(Recess taken.)

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CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: We're going to go back on the record. Preliminary matters?

the parties took a recess and we have engaged in some very meaningful discussions.
