The purpose of this letter is to agree to an additional condition of settlement of the above show cause proceeding against Integrated TeleServices, Inc., which additional condition was suggested by staff. As a communication in furtherance of a settlement, this letter is privileged and confidential, and nothing herein may be viewed as an admission against interest or in any way used against Respondent if this dispute is not settled.

The additional condition suggested by staff is that Integrated agree not to re-enter the Florida intrastate market for a time certain. Such a condition is actually consistent with Integrated's intentions, because it believes that given sufficient time its recent problems will indeed be seen as aberrational. For ease of reference, the original proposed resolution is restated below, app ___along with the additional condition that Integrated not seek to enter the Florida intrastate telecommunications market in any form Defore January 1, 1999.

final order approving the settlement provided for cancellation of the certificate within 60 days.

- 2) Integrated will take appropriate steps to insure that its existing intrastate customers are not inconvenienced by Integrated's withdrawal from the Florida market.
- 3) If any consumer inquiries concerning Integrated remain open, Integrated will insure that staff has sufficient information to close them. In addition, if the Commission receives consumer inquiries about Integrated in the future, Integrated will respond fully as if it were still certificated in Florida.
- 4) Neither Integrated, its management, nor its principals will enter or seek to enter, either directly or indirectly, the Florida intrastate telecommunications market over which the Florida Public Service Commission has jurisdiction before January 1, 1999.

Integrated remains hopeful that staff and the Commission will find this modified good faith offer of settlement acceptable and in the public interest.
