21	Q.	WHAT IS THE COMPANY'S ACTUAL TRUE-UP FOR THE TWELVE

24	Α.	The actual true-up amount, including interest, is an under-recovery of \$2,924,887
25	as sh	own on the March 1997, Schedule A-2, "Actual" column, line 11
26		
27	Q.	CAN YOU EXPLAIN HOW YOU ARRIVED AT THAT AMOUNT OF
28		OVER-RECOVER?

1	A.	Yes. As shown on Schedule A-7, the total under-recovery amount for the twelve
2		month period ending March 31, 1997 is \$1,548,392. The beginning balance of
3		March 31, 1996 was an under-recovery of \$1,376,495. The sum of these two
4		balances yields the total under-recorded balance of \$2,924,887
5		
6	Q.	DOES THIS CONCLUDE YOUR TESTIMONY?
