Dear Ms. Bayo:

In accordance with the Staff's recent request, I am writing this letter to grant an additional 120 day extension of time for the Commission to process the application in the above-referenced case. Because of delays in final action by Martin County, it is unclear at this time whether or not further processing of this case will be necessary or appropriate. However, it is our understanding that the County will take some action in January which should help to clarify whether or not we need to move forward with this case and if so, how quickly. Once the County Commission acts in January we will report back to the Commission at the beginning of February concerning the status of this case, and at that time make a decision as to whether we need to move forward with the final processing of the case or whether Hydratech Utilities, Inc. will withdraw the application until such time the County's position is clarified.

We will keep the Staff informed of the progress in this matter. In the meantime the Utility has no problem with the additional 120 day extension of time for processing this case in light of the delays caused by Martin County.






