Dear Representative Fasano:

I am writing this letter to thank you for your on-going concern over our "black water" problem with Aloha Utilities. My husband and I are new to this area; we moved from Chicago in February. When we built our home, we received a note from our Board President stating that some of the residents were experiencing black water problems. I called him and we spoke briefly about the problem. I was told that it was a temporary problem and that solutions were being made by the utility company.

Since moving here, we've experienced extremely bad water problems. I thought they were getting better about 2 weeks ago, but this week has been terrible. Yesterday, for example, the black water poured out of my bathroom faucet for such a long time that I ran out of hot water before it cleared. After I emptied the bath water, I had to clean the tub because of the residue left from the water.

It seems ashamed that Aloha thinks that the homeowners should have to pay extra for clean water. Since they are the only utility that we can get water from, we really have no choice but to pay our utility bills, but that should include paying for clean water not dirty water!

I hope you continue to keep hounding Aloha Utilities. We do need someone of your authority on our side. Thank you for all your assistance in this matter.



I am writing this letter to thank you for your on-going concern over our "black water" problem with Aloha Utilities. My husband and I are new to this area; we moved from Chicago in February. When we built our home, we received a note from our Board President stating that some of the residents were experiencing black water problems. I called him and we spoke briefly about the problem. I was told that it was a temporary problem and that solutions were being made by the utility company.

Since moving here, we've experienced extremely bad water problems. I thought they were getting better about 2 weeks ago, but this week has been terrible. Yesterday, for example, the black water poured out of my bathroom faucet for such a long time that I ran out of hot water before it cleared. After I emptied the bath water, I had to clean the tub because of the residue left from the water.

It seems ashamed that Aloha thinks that the homeowners should have to pay extra for clean water. Since they are the only utility that we can get water from, we really have no choice but to pay our utility bills, but that should include paying for clean water not dirty water!

I hope you continue to keep hounding Aloha Utilities. We do need someone of your authority on our side. Thank you for all your assistance in this matter.



BETMAR'S RESPONSES TO STAFF'S REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Please state whether the utility currently has a certified licensed operator as ordered on page 2 of the Consent Order dated November 27, 1996, as shown in Section I of the filing. If the utility has not done so, please explain why not.
- A. Yes. As shown in Exhibit "A" of the Limited Proceeding Application, Section 3, Page 1, Joseph M. Kuhns is the Licensed C Operator (License No. C-6754).
- Q. 2. Please describe what proof the utility has provided to DEP that well #5 has been and will remain permanently disconnected from the potable water system as ordered on pages 2 and 3 of the Consent Order dated November 27, 1996, as shown in Section I of the filing. If no proof has been provided, please explain why not.
- A. Attachment "A-1," SWFWMD Letter of Modification dated January 17, 1997, shows that three standby wells (District ID Nos. 1, 4 & 6) have been capped. The three standby wells were disconnected by ESG, and no invoice was rendered to the Utility. Well #5, as referenced in the Consent Order, was actually Well #6 (ID #6), which is located on Tara Avenue. Attachment "A-2" clarifies the error which was made on the Sanitary Survey of 1994. Unfortunately, the 1994 Sanitary Survey report incorrectly referenced Well #6 as Well #5 and Well #2 as Well #3. Copies of the original SWFWMD permit (Attachment A-3, Permit No. 202030.03) and the appropriate pages from the 1994 Sanitary Survey (Attachment A-4) have been attached to help clear up any misunderstanding.
- Q. 3. Please state whether the utility has installed approved chlorine weighing devices required by Florida Administrative Code Rule 62-555.320 and as ordered on page 3 of the Consent Order dated November 27, 1996, as shown in Section I of the filing. If the utility has not done so, please explain why not.
- A. The weighing scales have been installed per Chapter 62-555.320 as ordered. As indicated in the letter from the Department of Environmental Protection dated June 12, 1997 (Attachment "B"), all the conditions of the Consent Order have been satisfied.
- Please state whether the utility has installed an auxiliary power source with an automatic start-up device capable of operating the plant at one-

half the maximum daily flow demand, as required by Florida

Administrative Code Rule 62-555.320(6) and as ordered on page 3 of the Consent Order dated November 27, 1996, as shown in Section I of the filing. If the utility has not done so, please explain why not.

- A. An auxiliary power source has been installed and verified by James Berghorn and William Dunn of Department of Environmental Protection, as ordered. As indicated in the letter from the Department of Environmental Protection dated June 12, 1997 (Attachment "B"), all of the conditions of the Consent Order have been satisfied.
- Pursuant to Rule 62-555.320(6), Florida Administrative Code, a utility's auxiliary power requirements may be met by providing:
 - (1) a connection to at least two independent power lines, or
 - (2) an interconnection to at least one other public water supply system that has sufficient reserve capacity, or
 - (3) in place auxiliary power. . .
 - A. Please explain why the utility chose option (3) instead of option (1) above.
- A. Option 1 was not chosen because when the utility installed the wells, Florida Power had only one primary power line supplying that location. Therefore, if the power source was lost in that grid, all the wells would be inoperative. Because of this potential problem, the Utility connected to the Pasco County water supply in 1988, which could serve as an emergency source of water in the event of a power loss. In June 1996, when Pasco County discontinued the emergency water source, (see Section 1, page 29 of the filing), the Utility contacted Mr. Steve Bunner of Florida Power and was told that the well locations were still being supplied with just one primary power line. Therefore, since two independent power lines are not available and both Pasco County and the City of Zephyrhills will not provide emergency supply, the Utility was left with only one option, the installation of auxiliary power.
 - B. Please explain why the utility chose option (3) instead of option (2) above.
- As shown in Section 1, pages 29 and 30 of the Limited Proceeding Application, an interconnection to either Pasco County and/or the City of Zephyrhills is not available. Therefore, Option 2 is not possible.

- C. Please state whether Betmar made any investigation as to whether options (1) and (2) above would be less costly.
- A. The Utility agrees that Options 1 and 2 would most likely be less costly than Option 3, but, as stated in the answers to A and B, two independent power lines are not available to supply the wells and an interconnection to a public water supply is unacceptable to the only two owners of the public water systems available to the utility. Therefore, the Utility had no choice.
 - D. If the answer to C is yes, provide a cost/benefit analysis.
- A. Due to the unavailability of Options 1 and 2, a cost benefit analysis was not performed and is not available.
- Q. 6. Please state whether DEP has required auxiliary power for Betmar's wastewater operations. If not, please explain why Betmar is requesting in its application for auxiliary power of its wastewater operations.
- A. Attachment "D," letter from Joseph Squitieri of DEP dated June 19, 1997, indicates that Section 62-604.400(2)(a), Florida Administrative Code, addresses the need to have an emergency generator for the Utility's wastewater operations. Also, in Section 1, pages 31-35, of Limited Proceeding Application show that the customers who attended a Customer Meeting, dated August 3, 1995, indicated that they were concerned about the possibility of a power outage to the water and sewer systems. Betmar is providing auxiliary power for both the potable water system as well as the wastewater collection and disposal systems so that in a power outage the utility can continue to provide good quality service to its customers.
- Please state whether the utility has paid DEP \$6,900 for the settlement of the matters addressed in the Consent Order dated November 27, 1996, as shown in Section I of the filing.
- A. Included in Section 1, page 7 of the Limited proceeding Application, you will note the letter from James Berghorn of the Department of Environmental Protection, dated December 3, 1996, which indicates the utility has paid the \$6,900.00 in settlement of the Consent Order.
- Please state whether the utility has incurred any other fines relating to this Consent Order, dated November 27, 1996. If so, please briefly describe the circumstances leading to the incurrence of the fine(s).

- A. There were no additional fines incurred.
- Please list all fines the utility has paid in 1995, 1996 and 1997.
- A. There were no fines paid in 1995. In 1996 the \$6,900.00 was paid. In 1997 there have been no fines of any kind to date.
- Q. 10. Please state whether the utility is requesting recovery of any fines and/or legal fees associated with fines listed in response to question 9, above, in this limited proceeding. If so, please plain why such recovery is being requested.
- A. No, the utility is not requesting recovery of any fines or legal fees associated with fines. See #20.
- Please explain why Betmar is leasing the two generators instead of purchasing them.
- A. A lease arrangement gives the utility more flexibility in the future to seek less costly alternative arrangements to meet Rule 62-555.320(6) such as a connection to at least two independent power lines or an interconnection to at least one other public water supply system that has sufficient reserve capacity if circumstances in the future are different than they are today. The Utility was under an immediate obligation to meet the requirement of rule 62-555.320(6), and pursued a leasing arrangement to facilitate meeting the requirements of the Rule in a timely manner.

Furthermore, the Utility believes that leasing certain types of equipment, such as auxiliary power equipment, is better in the long run than purchasing. A Utility may be able to provide more reliable and up-to-date equipment through a lease agreement as compared to a purchase when one considers repairs, replacement and maintenance issues. The leased equipment comes with a preventative maintenance program, which gives additional assurance of reliability.

- Q. 12. Please explain why Betmar is leasing the 60 KW generator from ESG.
- A. ESG has a better credit rating that Betmar. It was therefore easier for ESG to lease the equipment than Betmar. ESG is charging Betmar the same monthly amount that it is paying to the lease company. (See Section III, pages 120 and 129 of the Limited Proceeding Application).

- Q. 13. Please state whether Betmar is also leasing the 100 KW generator from ESG. If so, please explain why. If not, please explain why Betmar leases the 60 KW generator from ESG and not the 100 KW generator.
- A. ESG and Betmar Utilities are Co-Lessees, Jointly and Severally Responsible on the lease for the 100 KW generator. ESG appears on the lease for the same reason as stated in answer number 12. Furthermore, the 100 KW is on Betmar Utilities' well site; therefore, Betmar had to sign as well as ESG on the lease. This now gives the leasing company the right to go on Betmar Utilities' property and repossess the generator if necessary.
- Q. 14. If Betmar were to purchase the 100 KW generator, please state how much it would cost and what the expected life of the generator would be. Please provide proof of the expected cost and expected life of the generator (i.e. proposed bill of sale or invoice).
- A. When the utility pursued leasing the 100 KW generator, it went to Onan-Cummins, the company that gave it the best price for the 60 KW generator. However, their electrical sub-contractor did not want to give the utility a turnkey price to meet Pasco County's electrical codes. The quote for the generator was \$48,397 (Attachment "E-1"). Next the utility pursued Robert Hugues Enterprises, Inc. and received a quote of \$48,300 (Attachment "E-2"). The quote was a turnkey price that included all upgrades to be done in the well building to meet the updated codes. It also included a 225 amps transfer switch, which was 100 amps heavier than Onan-Cummins quoted transfer switch. Finally, a quote was received from J&M Electric, Inc. for \$51,000 (Attachment "E-3"). Even though the utility believes that the equipment may become obsolete before it is fully depreciated, Rule 25-30.140 requires a 20-year depreciation period for this type of equipment (Account 310).
- Q. 15. If Betmar were to purchase the 60 KW generator, please state how much it would cost and what the expected life of the generator would be. Please provide proof of the expected cost and expected life of the generator (i.e. proposed bill of sale or invoice).
- A. Prime Equipment submitted a quote for \$23,800. plus shipping costs of \$1,200. and sales tax of \$1,428. for a total of \$26,428 (Attachment "F-1"). Tri-W Rental quoted \$29,584 (Attachment "F-2"). Finally, Onan-Cummins quoted a price of \$19,305 (Attachment "F-3"). The quotes did not include a service policy or preventative maintenance policy, only factory warranty. Even though the utility believes that the equipment may become obsolete before it is fully depreciated, Rule 25-30.140

requires a 12 year depreciation period for this type of equipment (Account 395).

- Please provide at least two other bids from unaffiliated companies regarding the cost of the lease for a 100 KW generator.
- A. The Utility company pursued alternative providers of equipment, however it only received telephone quotes regarding a lease of the 100 KW generator from two sources. One was from T&W Financial Corporation for the Robert Hugues Enterprises, Inc. generator. The other one was from Finova Capital Corporation for the Onan-Cummins generator. The utility chose the cheaper of the two monthly lease amounts. However, the Finova quote was received over the telephone, therefore the utility does not have a document to support that quote.
- Please explain why the lease for the 100 KW generator is for 48 months.
- A. ESG and Betmar Utilities, Inc. requested a 60-month lease from T&W Financial Corporation, n/k/a Colonial Pacific Leasing. T&W would only approve a 48 month lease.
- Please provide at least two other bids from unaffiliated companies regarding the cost of the lease for a 60 KW generator.
- A. The Tri-W Rental quote for \$29,584 (Attachment "F-2"). contains indications of monthly lease payments for alternative leasing periods. Betmar Utilities is leasing the turnkey Onan-Cummins generator for \$557.31 per month from Finova Capital Corporation, which is substantially less than the equivalent lease amount quoted by Tri-W Rental.
- Please explain why the premium of \$709.50 for the liability insurance on the 60 KW generator is more than four times the premium of \$175 for the liability insurance on the 100 KW generator.
- A. The higher liability insurance on the 60 KW is because it is on a trailer, which is insured under a commercial automobile policy. The 100 KW is anchored on a concrete slab, which is insured under a property policy A letter is enclosed from Roe Insurance Company. (See Attachment "G").
- Please explain why the utility believes the legal costs of \$1,245, shown in Exhibit H (page III - 110, 116 and 117) from Gerald T. Buhr, should be recovered in this proceeding.

A. The legal costs of \$1,245, shown in Section III, Pages 110-117 of the Limited Proceedings Application, are legitimate utility expenses which were incurred in connection with the Department of Environmental Protection Consent Order. As such, they are appropriate for recovery in this proceeding.

Well ID # 6 has been capped (Tara Avenue).

Well ID # 7 has been permitted for the future.

Also on the same Sanitation Survey, it shows the type of pumps in error. They should be ID #2 as a submersible pump 25 HP, and ID #5 as a turbine pump 40 HP.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

- If any of the statements in the application and in the supporting data are found to be untrue
 and inaccurate, or if the Permittee fails to comply with all of the provisions of Chapter 373,
 F.S., Chapter 40D, or the conditions set forth herein, the Governing Board shall revoke this
 permit in accordance with Rule 40D-2.341, following notice and hearing.
- 2. This permit is issued based on information provided by the Permittee demonstrating that the use of water is reasonable and beneficial, consistent with the public interest, and will not interfere with any existing legal use of water. If, during the term of the permit, it is determined by the District that the use is not reasonable and beneficial, in the public interest, or does impact an existing legal use of water, the Governing Board shall modify this permit or shall revoke this permit following notice and hearing.
- The Permittee shall not deviate from any of the terms or conditions of this permit without written approval by the District.
- 4. In the event the District declares that a Water Shortage exists pursuant to Chapter 40D-21, the District shall alter, modify, or declare inactive all or parts of this permit as necessary to address the water shortage.
- The District shall collect water samples from any withdrawal point listed in the permit or shall require the permittee to submit water samples when the District determines there is a potential for adverse impacts to water quality.
- 6. The Permittee shall provide access to an authorized District representative to enter the property at any reasonable time to inspect the facility and make environmental or hydrologic assessments. The Permittee shall either accompany District staff onto the property or make provision for access onto the property.
- Issuance of this permit does not exempt the Permittee from any other District permitting requirements.
- 8. The Permittee shall cease or reduce surface water withdrawal as directed by the District if water levels in lakes fall below applicable minimum water level established in Chapter 40D-8 or rates of flow in streams fall below the minimum levels established in Chapter 40D-8.
- The Permittee shall cease or reduce withdrawal as directed by the District if water levels in aquifers fall below the minimum levels established by the Governing Board.

- 10. The Permittee shall practice water conservation to increase the efficiency of transport, application, and use, as well as to decrease waste and to minimize runoff from the property. At such time as the Governing Board adopts specific conservation requirements for the Permittee's water use classification, this permit shall be subject to those requirements upon notice and after a reasonable period for compliance.
- 11. The District may establish special regulations for Water Use Caution Areas. At such time as the Governing Board adopts such provisions, this permit shall be subject to them upon notice and after a reasonable period for compliance.
- 12. The Permittee shall mitigate, to the satisfaction of the District, any adverse impact to existing legal uses caused by withdrawals. When adverse impacts occur or are imminent, the District shall require the Permittee to mitigate the impacts. Adverse impacts include:

a. A reduction in water levels which impairs the ability of a well to produce water;

 Significant reduction in levels or flows in water bodies such as lakes, impoundments, wetlands, springs, streams or other watercourses; or

c. Significant inducement of natural or manmade contaminants into a water supply or into a usable portion of any aquifer or water body.

13. The Permittee shall mitigate to the satisfaction of the District any adverse impact to environmental features or offsite land uses as a result of withdrawals. When adverse impacts occur or are imminent, the District shall require the Permittee to mitigate the impacts. Adverse impacts include the following:

a. Significant reduction in levels or flows in water bodies such as lakes, impoundments,

wetlands, springs, streams, or other watercourses;

b. Sinkholes or subsidence caused by reduction in water levels;

- c. Damage to crops and other vegetation causing financial harm to the owner; and
- d. Damage to the habitat of endangered or threatened species.
- 14. When necessary to analyze impacts to the water resource or existing users, the District shall require the Permittee to install flow metering or other measuring devices to record withdrawal quantities and submit the data to the District.
- 15. A District identification tag shall be prominently displayed at each withdrawal point by permanently affixing the tag to the withdrawal facility.
- The Permittee shall notify the District within 30 days of the sale or conveyance of permitted water withdrawal facilities or the land on which the facilities are located.
- All permits issued pursuant to these Rules are contingent upon continued ownership or legal control of all property on which pumps, wells, diversions or other water withdrawal facilities are located.

Re: Emergency Generators for Wastewater Collection Systems

Dear Mr. Turco:

This letter is in response to our telephone conversation on June 12, 1997, concerning the requirement for an emergency generator for wastewater lift stations.

The subject of emergency generators for wastewater lift stations is addressed in Section 62-604.400(2)(a), Florida Administrative Code. It requires that small lift stations have a standard receptable for connecting power generating equipment and appropriate piping to connect portable pumps. Larger lift stations shall have suitable design features to provide for uninterrupted flow. All stations shall be compatible with the available temporary service power generating and pumping equipment of the responsible authority. This certainly implies that even a small, private utility company providing wastewater collection and transmission services are to have the capability to provide emergency power in case of outages.

A power outage which causes raw sewage to overflow from lift stations and manholes, and possibly into residences is a violation of State environmental and public health regulations, as well as a substantial liability which should be avoided at almost all costs.

There are many utilities that have an emergency program which includes having emergency generators for their wastewater lift stations available at all times.
