Comes now AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc., (AT&T) and pursuant to Rule 22.006, Florida Administrative Code and Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, files this Notice of Intent to Request Specified Confidential Classification and Request for Temporary and Permanent Protective Order.

- 1. On December 15, 1997, the Office of the Public Counsel (OPC), on behalf of the Attorney General (AG) and Citizens of Florida, served upon AT&T its First Set of Requests for Production of Documents (Nos. 1-13) in this docket.
- 2. Certain documents requested by OPC in its Request for Production of

  Documents are confidential and proprietary under Florida Statutes, Section 364.183 and

  Rule 22.006, Florida Statutes. Because this information is proprietary, AT&T is filing

  this Notice of Intent to Request Confidential Classification in order to allow OPC and the

  AG to review and take possession of such documents and information without delay.

  AT&T also moves for a Temporary Protective Order exempting these documents from

Comes now AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc., (AT&T) and pursuant to Rule 22.006, Florida Administrative Code and Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, files this Notice of Intent to Request Specified Confidential Classification and Request for Temporary and Permanent Protective Order.

- 1. On December 2, 1997, the Office of the Public Counsel (OPC), on behalf of the Attorney General (AG) and Citizens of Florida, served upon AT&T a Notice of Deposition Duces Tecum in Docket No. 971433-TI for a deposition to be held on December 12, 1997.
