CASE BACKGROUND


- January 29, 1999 A. CoinPhone Services, Inc.'s (CoinPhone) 1998 regulatory assessment fee return reported gross intrastate revenues of \$1,491.90 and 20 pay telephones in operation.
- February 25, 1999 Staff performed routine service evaluations on a pay telephones operated by CoinPhone.
- April 9, 1999 Staff received Service Violation Correction Form from CoinPhone signifying that all apparent violations were corrected.
- April 22, 1999 Staff reevaluated the pay telephone station.
- June 22, 1999 Order No. PSC-99-1231-SC-TC was issued ordering CoinPhone to show cause in writing why it should not be fined \$400 or have its certificate canceled, pursuant to Section 364.285, Florida Statutes.

DISCUSSION OF ISSUES

ISSUE 1: Should the Commission accept the settlement offer proposed by A. CoinPhone Services, Inc. to resolve the apparent violations of Rule 25-24.515, Florida Administrative Code, Pay Telephone Service?

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Yes. The Commission should accept the company's settlement proposal. Any contribution should be received by the Commission within ten business days from the issuance date of the Commission Order and should identify the docket number and company name. The Commission should forward the contribution to the Office of the Comptroller for deposit in the State General Revenue Fund pursuant to Section 364.285(1), Florida Statutes. (Biegalski)

<u>STAFF ANALYSIS</u>: Staff performed service evaluations of a pay telephone station operated by CoinPhone on February 25, 1999. Through written correspondence, staff notified CoinPhone of the apparent violations. Staff reevaluated the same pay telephone station on April 22, 1999. Although CoinPhone reported that all violations had been corrected, the same apparent rule violations were still present.

Based on the showings of the reevaluations that the pay telephone station exhibited the same apparent violations, by Order No. PSC-99-1231-SC-TC issued June 22, 1999, the Commission ordered CoinPhone to show cause why it should not be fined \$400 or have its certificate canceled, pursuant to Section 364.285, Florida Statutes. On July 8, 1999, CoinPhone responded to the Order stating that the apparent violations had been corrected. On July 14, 1999, CoinPhone submitted it offer of settlement. In its settlement offer, CoinPhone agreed to do the following:

- CoinPhone will voluntarily pay \$400 to the General Revenue Fund.
- CoinPhone will conduct a thorough inspection of all its pay telephones to ensure compliance with Commission rules.

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• CoinPhone will ensure problems are clearly understood and fixed before reporting to the Commission that they are fixed.

Staff supports CoinPhone's offer to conduct a thorough inspection of all its pay telephones to ensure compliance with Commission rules. By initiating this action, CoinPhone has created a proactive approach to compliance rather than a reactive response to staff's inquiries. In addition, staff believes that the company's clear understanding of the violations will prevent it from inadvertantly responding that a violation has been corrected.

Moreover, the company has been cooperative in resolving all apparent violations. Any contribution should be received by the Commission within ten business days from the issuance date of the Commission Order and should identify the docket number and company name. The Commission should forward the contribution to the Office of the Comptroller for deposit in the State General Revenue Fund pursuant to Section 364.285(1), Florida Statutes. Staff believes the terms of the settlement agreement as summarized in this recommendation are fair and reasonable, and we support the voluntary contribution to the General Revenue Fund.

ISSUE 2: Should this docket be closed?

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: No. With the approval of Issue 1, this docket should remain open pending the remittance of the \$400 voluntary contribution. Upon remittance of the settlement payment, this docket should be closed. If the company fails to pay in accordance with the terms of the settlement offer, the monetary settlement will be forwarded to the Comptroller's office for collection, and this docket will be closed. (Caldwell)

STAFF ANALYSIS: This docket should remain open pending the remittance of the \$400 voluntary contribution. Upon remittance of the settlement payment, this docket should be closed. If the company fails to pay in accordance with the terms of its settlement offer, the monetary settlement will be forwarded to the Comptroller's office for collection, and this docket closed.
