1. Gulf's entire response to data request numbered 1 of Commission Staff's Informal Data Request to Gulf Power Company (Nos. 1-6) contains proprietary confidential business information regarding contractual data and competitive interests, the disclosure of which would

This information is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to §366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes, as information, the public disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to the competitive interests of Gulf Power and the contracting entity as well as the ability of Gulf to enter into contracts on terms favorable to it and its ratepayers. The information for which confidential classification is sought is intended to be and is treated by Gulf Power Company and the contracting entity as private and is not otherwise publically available.

- 2. Gulf's entire response to data request numbered 2 and 3 of Commission Staff's Informal Data Request to Gulf Power Company (Nos. 1-6) contains proprietary confidential business information regarding contractual data and competitive interests, the disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to Gulf Power Company and the entity with whom it has contracted. This information is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to §366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes, as information, the public disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to the competitive interests of Gulf Power and the contracting entity as well as the ability of Gulf to enter into contracts on terms favorable to it and its ratepayers. The information for which confidential classification is sought is intended to be and is treated by Gulf Power Company and the contracting entity as private and is not otherwise publically available. The information provided contains details regarding the contracting entity's business that are considered by it to be extremely competitively sensitive and involves some level of trade secrets.
- 3. Gulf's entire response to data request numbered 4 and 5 of Commission Staff's Informal Data Request to Gulf Power Company (Nos. 1-6) contains proprietary confidential business information regarding contractual data, the disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to Gulf Power Company and the entity with whom it has contracted. This information is

entitled to confidential classification pursuant to §366.093(3)(d), Florida Statutes, as information, the public disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to the competitive interests of Gulf Power and the contracting entity as well as the ability of Gulf to enter into contracts on terms favorable to it and its ratepayers. The information for which confidential classification is sought is intended to be and is treated by Gulf Power Company and the contracting entity as private and is not otherwise publically available. Gulf is bound by a non-disclosure provision with the contracting entity that prohibits public dissemination of the contents of said contract. Gulf Power Company requests that this information be granted confidential classification pursuant to Section 366.093(3)(d), Florida Statutes.

- 4. Submitted as Exhibit "A" is a copy of the responses to requests 1-5 of the Commission Staff's Informal Data Request to Gulf Power Company (Nos. 1-6) which has highlighted the information for which confidential classification is requested. Exhibit "A" should be treated as confidential pending a ruling on this request. Attached as Exhibit "B" are two (2) edited copies of the responses which may be made available for public review and inspection. Attached as Exhibit "C" to this request is a line-by-line or field-by-field justification for the request for confidential classification.
- 5. The material for which confidential classification is requested is intended to be, and is treated as confidential by Gulf Power Company and the entity with whom it has entered into a CSA and has not been otherwise publicly disclosed.
- 6. The information for which confidential classification is sought are contractual matters that by their own terms are to be held confidential for a period in excess eighteen months. Since the contracts and the provision therein are to be held confidential for a period in excess of eighteen months, Gulf asserts that based on the facts herein, that good cause has been shown to

allow this information to be granted confidential status for a period of 10 years, at the end of such time said confidential classification being subject to an extension for good cause shown.

WHEREFORE, Gulf Power Company respectfully requests that the Commission enter an order protecting the information highlighted on Exhibit "A" from public disclosure as proprietary confidential business information.

Data Request 1 Response All Pages, All lines

This response contains proprietary confidential business information regarding contractual data and competitive interests, the disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to Gulf Power Company and the entity with whom it has contracted. This information is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to §366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes, as information, the public disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to the competitive interests of Gulf Power and the contracting entity as well as the ability of Gulf to enter into contracts on terms favorable to it and its ratepayers. Specifically, the response provides copies of the contracts entered into between Gulf and CSA parties. The contents of the contract as well as the name of the entity with whom Gulf has contracted are regarded by both Gulf and the CSA party as extremely confidential. The Commission recognized the need for confidentiality in these matters at the time that the Commercial/Industrial Service Rider Pilot Study was granted approval.

Data Request 2 and 3 Responses All Pages and All Lines

These two responses contain proprietary confidential business information regarding contractual data and competitive interests, the disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to Gulf Power Company and the entity with whom it has contracted. This information is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to §366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes, as information, the public disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to the competitive interests of Gulf Power and the contracting entity as well as the ability of Gulf to enter into contracts on terms favorable to it and its ratepayers. The information for which confidential classification is sought is intended to be and is treated by Gulf Power Company and the contracting entity as private and is not otherwise publically available. The information provided contains customer specific details that are considered by the customer to be extremely competitively sensitive and reveals information that is in the nature of trade secrets of that customer.

Data Request 4 and 5 Responses All Pages and All Lines

These two responses contain proprietary confidential business information regarding contractual data, the disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to Gulf Power Company and the entity with whom it has contracted. This information is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to §366.093(3)(d), Florida Statutes, as information, the public disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to the competitive interests of Gulf Power and the contracting entity as well as the ability of Gulf to enter into contracts on terms favorable to it and its ratepayers. The information for which confidential classification is sought is intended to be and is treated by Gulf Power Company and the contracting entity as private and is not otherwise publically available. Gulf is bound by a non-disclosure provision with the contracting entity that prohibits public dissemination of the specific provisions that may or may not be a part of the contracts between Gulf and the customer. Gulf Power Company requests that this information be granted confidential classification pursuant to Section 366.093(3)(d), Florida Statutes.
