ORDER APPROVING ONE-WAY INTERCONNECTION AGREEMENT

BY THE COMMISSION:

On October 30, 2000, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. (BellSouth) and Telepersonal Communications, Inc. (Telepersonal Communications) filed a request for approval of a one-way interconnection agreement pursuant to 47 U.S.C. §252(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (the Act). The agreement is incorporated by reference herein. A copy of the agreement may be obtained by contacting our Division of Records and Reporting.

The Act encourages parties to enter into negotiated agreements. Under the requirements of 47 U.S.C. § 252(e), negotiated agreements must be submitted to the state commission for approval. Section 252(e)(4) requires the state to reject or approve the agreement within 90 days after submission or it shall be deemed approved.

This agreement covers a two-year period and governs the relationship between the companies regarding local one-way interconnection and the exchange of traffic pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 251. Under 47 U.S.C. § 252(a)(1), the agreement shall include a

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detailed schedule of itemized charges for interconnection and each service or network element included in the agreement.

Upon review of the proposed agreement, we believe that it complies with the Act; thus, we hereby approve it. Commission's approval of this agreement should not be construed as a determination that BellSouth has met the requirements of Section 271 of the Act. BellSouth and Telepersonal Communications are also required to file any subsequent supplements or modifications to their agreement with the Commission for review under the provisions We note that Telepersonal Communications of 47 U.S.C. § 252(e). not currently hold a Florida certificate to provide local exchange telecommunications service, alternative therefore, it cannot provide alternative local telecommunications services under this agreement until it obtains a certificate from this Commission.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the one-way interconnection agreement between BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. and Telepersonal Communications, Inc., is incorporated by reference in this Order, and is hereby approved. A copy of the agreement may be obtained as specified in the body of this Order. It is further

ORDERED that any supplements or modifications to this agreement must be filed with the Commission for review under the provisions of 47 U.S.C. § 252(e). It is further

ORDERED that this Docket shall be closed.
