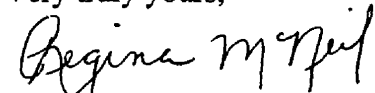

2. The filing by NECA of its proof of claim shall not be deemed an admission by the Debtors that such asserted claim is valid or accurate.
3. The Debtors and the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors hereby reserve their respective rights to object to the allowance of NECA's asserted claim in whole or in part on any grounds other than timeliness.

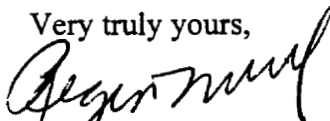

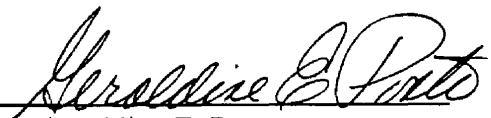

CERTIFICATION OF COLLEEN HARRELL

I, COLLEEN HARRELL, hereby certify as follows:

1. I am an Assistant General Counsel for the Kansas Corporation Commission ("KCC"), a creditor and party-in-interest of Minimum Rate Pricing, Inc., the debtor herein ("MRP" or "Debtor"). I make this certification upon my personal knowledge and review of the records of KCC.
2. As authorized by statutory law in Kansas (K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 66-2008), the KCC established the Kansas Universal Service Fund ("KUSF") in December, 1996. Accordingly, all telecommunications carriers, telecommunications public utilities and wireless telecommunications service providers that provide intrastate telecommunications services for a fee are required by statutory law to contribute to the KUSF on an equitable and nondiscriminatory basis as a regular course of conducting

business in the industry. Companies' contributions are based on an assessment of their intrastate retail revenues.

3. The National Exchange Carrier Association ("NECA") has been appointed the Administrator of the KUSF. As the administrator of the state universal service program in Kansas, NECA is responsible for the billing and collection of contributions which support high cost rural service, low income customers who are affected by rate balancing and residential customers who could experience rate shock.

4. MRP provides telecommunications services in the State of Kansas and as such is required to participate in this statutorily mandated program. See Exhibit A.

5. On February 3, 2000, an Order to Show Cause was issued by the KCC against MRP for MRP's failure to remit the required KUSF payments to NECA as required by Kansas statutory law, despite having reported intrastate retail revenues of \$667,000 and \$1,023,000 for 1997 and 1998 respectively. See Exhibit B.

6. By letter dated February 17, 2000, the KCC received a response from Drew Keena of MRP. The letter indicated that MRP had filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceedings on February 26, 1999, and blamed its lack of personnel for its failure to remit the funds collected from the customers to NECA. See Exhibit C.

7. Prior to the receipt of the February 17, 2000 letter, the KCC/KUSF never received any notice of the filing of a bankruptcy by MRP.

8. Both the KCC/KUSF and NECA attempted to contact MRP for information regarding the bankruptcy filing, specifically requesting documentation confirming whether or not the KCC/KUSF or NECA were listed as creditors in the bankruptcy matter. See Exhibit D.

9. Having received no response from MRP, the KCC reviewed bankruptcy filings via the internet and obtained the name of MRP's attorney and a list of creditors. Neither the KCC/ KUSF nor NECA were listed as creditors.

10. Accordingly, I sent a letter dated July 12, 2000 to Mr. Louis Pashman, attorney for MRP, seeking an explanation as to KCC/KUSF and NECA's omission as creditors. Additionally, I sent letters dated July 28, 2000 and September 27, 2000 to Angel & Frankel, attorneys for MRP, seeking an explanation as to KCC/ KUSF and NECA's omission as creditors. See Exhibit E.

11. At my request, on or about December 14, 2000 Regina McNeil, Senior Attorney for NECA, contacted Rochelle Weisburg of Angel & Frankel. It is my understanding that at that time Ms. Weisburg agreed, given the circumstances, to allow NECA as Administrator KUSF to file a proof of claim despite the fact that the bar date had elapsed.

12. NECA has obtained a copy of the Notice of Commencement of Case Under Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code, Meeting of Creditors, and Fixing of Dates, in which the Clerk's Office established August 17, 1999 as the last date for creditors to timely file proofs of claim or risk thereafter having their claims barred and/or disallowed (the "Bar Date").

13. Neither KCC/KUSF nor NECA received formal notice of the commencement of MRP's bankruptcy case. The notice that KUSF and NECA received inadvertently on February 18, 2000, was after the Bar Date. Thus, neither KUSF nor NECA was afforded the opportunity to file a proof of claim before the Bar Date.

14. Based on the foregoing, cause exists to permit NECA as Administrator for KUSF to file a proof of claim in the amount of \$185,369.42 for the period of March 1, 1997 to February 26, 1999. See Exhibit F.

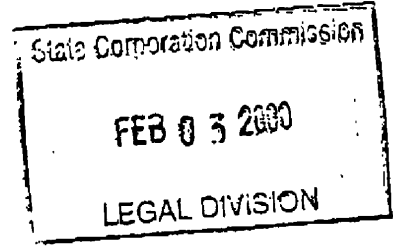

ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for a decision. Being fully advised in the premises and familiar with its files and records the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

1. The Commission established the Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF) pursuant to K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 66-2008, by its order issued in Docket No. 94-GIMT-478-GIT on December 27, 1996. All telecommunications carriers, telecommunications public utilities and wireless telecommunications service providers that provide intrastate telecommunications services are required to contribute to the KUSF on an equitable and nondiscriminatory basis. K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 66-2008(b). In the December 27, 1996 order the Commission determined that companies would contribute based on an assessment on their intrastate retail revenues.

2. Minimum Rate Pricing Inc. (MRP) is certificated to provide telecommunications services in the State of Kansas. Since the inception of the KUSF, March 1, 1997, MRP has not remitted the required worksheets for reporting revenues and contributions to the KUSF administrator, the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA). MRP has made no payments to the KUSF, in spite of the fact that its Annual Reports filed with the Commission show that it

had intrastate retail revenues of \$667,000 and \$1,023,000 for 1997 and 1998 respectively.

3. NECA has repeatedly sent MRP past due notices, including certified past due notices and contacted the company regarding its delinquent status. On September 8, 1999, Staff sent MRP a certified letter informing MRP that if it failed to remit worksheets and payments within 30 days Staff would initiate a show cause proceeding. In November of 1999, MRP contacted Staff counsel, stating it would remit KUSF worksheets and payments to NECA.

4. As of January 25, 2000, NECA has not received either worksheets or payments, nor has MRP further contacted NECA or Staff. Staff also checked MRP's status with the Secretary of State's Office as part of its routine investigation of delinquent companies and learned that MRP was forfeited by the Secretary of State on July 15, 1997, for failure to file a timely annual report.

5. On January 18, 2000, Staff submitted a Memorandum to the Commission setting out the above facts and recommending that the Commission establish a Docket to require MRP to Show Cause why MRP should not be sanctioned and fined and its certificate to provide service in the state cancelled.

Findings and Conclusions

6. The Commission finds that Staff's recommendation that MRP be required to show cause why it should not be sanctioned and fined for its failure to comply with Commission orders and NECA and Staff implementation of those orders, to contribute to the KUSF. In order for the fund to function and to be equitable and non-discriminatory all providers of intrastate retail telecommunications services must contribute to the fund. The Commission finds MRP has blatantly disregarded Commission orders and the follow-up by NECA and Staff pursuant to those orders.

7. MRP is hereby required to show cause within 15 days of the date of this order why it should not be sanctioned and fined and its certificate to provide service in the state cancelled. Regardless of MRP's response and Commission action in this show cause proceeding MRP remains liable for all amounts it owes the KUSF, including late payment penalties.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

(A) MRP shall file a response to this order to show cause why it should not be sanctioned, fined and its certificate cancelled within 15 days of the date of this order.

(B) Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of this Order within fifteen (15) days of the date this Order is served. If service is by mail, service is complete upon mailing and three (3) days may be added to the above time frame.

(C) The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further order or orders as it may deem necessary and proper.

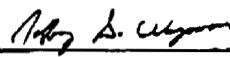

Minimum Rate Pricing, Inc. (MRP) is in receipt of the above referenced Order To Show Cause. For the reasons explained below, it is MRP's position that it should not be sanctioned, fined or have its authority revoked.

MRP filed for protection under Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code on February 26, 1999. As a result of the bankruptcy filing, MRP has significantly fewer employees now than it had at its height of operation. Since two of the employees who are no longer in MRP's employ were the individuals responsible for the filing of the USF remittance worksheets, it is difficult for MRP to answer the allegations set forth in the Order To Show Cause. Notwithstanding, the 1997, 1998/1999 and 1999/2000 KUSF Remittance Worksheets have been filed with the appropriate party. Additionally, payment for MRP's 1999/2000 KUSF assessment has been made. The assessments for 1997 and 1998/1999 are pre-petition debt, which MRP is not permitted to pay without bankruptcy court approval.

The letter further stated payment had been made for 1999/2000, but because MRP filed for bankruptcy protection on February 26, 1999, pre-petition payments could not be made.

NECA has never received any notice regarding this bankruptcy filing, and NECA has been informed that the Kansas Commission has not received notice of the filing. The Trustee generally provides such notice. Please provide NECA and/or Ms. Eva powers, KCC, with a case number for the filing and documentation showing NECA or the Kansas Universal Service Fund is listed as a creditor in that filing. I am an assistant general counsel for the Kansas Corporation Commission and I write to you regarding your client, Minimum Rate Pricing, Inc., of Cedar Grove, New Jersey.

On February 3, 2000, an "Order to Show Cause" was issued by the Kansas Corporation Commission ("KCC") against Minimum Rate Pricing, Inc. ("MRP"). I have enclosed a copy of that order for your information. As you can see from the order, this show cause was initiated because MRP had failed to remit the required Kansas Universal Service Fund payments to the National Exchange Carrier Association ("NECA"), as required by Kansas Statutes Annotated 66-2008(b), despite having reported intrastate retail revenues of \$667,000, and \$1,023,000 for 1997 and 1998 respectively. See Show Cause Order, paragraph 2. The KCC's order indicated that MRP must show cause within 15 days of the date of the order why it should not be sanctioned and fined and have its certificate to provide service in the state revoked. See Show Cause Order, paragraph 3.

On February 18, 2000, the KCC received a response from MRP in the form of a letter from a person named Drew Keena. This person's position with MRP was not identified in the letter, as you can see from the copy enclosed. The letter indicated MRP had filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceedings on February 26, 1999, and blamed a lack of personnel with the failure to remit the funds collected from customers to NECA.

This revelation came as a complete surprise to the KCC, as the KCC has never received any notice of filing of bankruptcy, listing the KCC as a creditor. As such, we contacted NECA to see if MRP had listed NECA as a creditor. That was not the case. Both the KCC and NECA attempted to contact MRP for information on the bankruptcy filing, specifically requesting documentation that the KCC or NECA was listed as a creditor in the bankruptcy. Neither received a response, despite one letter being sent as a certified letter, signed for by a person named Dwayne Robinson with MRP on June 29, 2000. As a last resort, the KCC reviewed bankruptcy filings via the Internet, receiving your name and address and the list of creditors. Neither the KCC nor NECA were listed as creditors

on the list, however, we notice that the Federal Communications Commission was listed as a creditor. You may also be interested to know that MRP has not been registered with the Kansas Secretary of State's office to do business in the state of Kansas as a foreign corporation since 1997.

We have not contacted the court yet regarding our omission as a creditor, preferring first to contact you, as the attorney, to contact your client to see if this was an intentional or inadvertent oversight on their part, and to formulate a course of resolution.

I would appreciate a response no later than Friday, July 21. If we have not received a response by that date, we will have no choice but to inform the bankruptcy court of this error and ask for the court's assistance in resolving the matter.

I received your fax of one week ago consisting of an order for sale of assets, pages of addresses, and an affidavit of service by first class mail. I still have some questions and concerns.

I did receive the check sent by MRP. I failed to tell you on the phone, however, that the check should be sent directly to the National Exchange Carrier Association. I had the check endorsed over to NECA and forwarded there for crediting against MRP's account, however, I expect that further checks will go directly to NECA. I suggest that you instruct the appropriate person at MRP to contact NECA (website address www.neca.org) for information and forms for proper reporting and remittances.

I had a staff member here contact NECA to see if MRP is current not only in its payments but also its reporting. Lori Tasca with NECA reports that MRP has not filed any of its Year 4 assessment calculation sheets, which should have been filed by the 15th of the month following the month being reported. MRP is delinquent for the months of March, April, May, and June, 2000. I expect that you will instruct MRP to complete the required forms, which are available on the website, and if MRP has questions on how to complete the forms, MRP may contact NECA for assistance.

I also request that you forward to me proof that MRP has regained its active and in good standing corporation status in Kansas. If I don't have proof of that by the end of August, 2000, I will investigate further the possibility of revoking MRP's certificate as it is not licensed to do business in the state of Kansas and, as such, should have no need for a certificate.

Finally, I am still quite uncomfortable with not having received any initial notice of MRP filing bankruptcy in February, 1999. We have found no evidence, and you have produced none, that MRP listed the Kansas Corporation Commission or NECA as a creditor, despite owing almost \$190,000 to the Kansas Universal Service Fund. If MRP collected this as an assessment on customer bills, this money should have simply been funneled to NECA and not retained by MRP. I would appreciate a written explanation as to why MRP did not list either the Kansas Corporation Commission or NECA as a creditor in its initial bankruptcy filing, which had the

result that neither organization received notice and had an opportunity to file a proof of claim within the allotted time. I am in the process of researching the appropriateness of MRP's actions in not listing either organization as a creditor.

Further, I would appreciate an explanation as to why MRP failed to respond to letters from the KCC and NECA, both, requesting information as to the bankruptcy filing as indicated in the letter that I initially sent to Mr. Pashman. Those letters were sent certified and signed for by someone at MRP, yet MRP failed to respond.

I will be out of the office for the next two weeks at a regulatory studies program, however, you may contact either staff analyst Susan Palmer, at (785) 271-3215, or assistant general counsel Eva Powers (785) 271-3173 should you have any questions.

I have been reviewing this file and have determined that, finally, Minimum Rate Pricing appears to have rectified its situation with regards to being registered with the Kansas Secretary of State's Office as a foreign corporation doing business in Kansas, currently in the process of reinstating. As such, in this area at least, all appears on its way to being in proper form.

I find, however, that you have still failed to answer questions that I put forth to you in my letter dated July 28, 2000. As such, I reiterate them here, now. As I stated before, I have found no evidence that Minimum Rate Pricing listed the Kansas Corporation Commission as a creditor in its initial filing in bankruptcy in February, 1999, despite owing almost \$190,000 to the Kansas Universal Service Fund. Normally, this money would have been collected on customer bills and, as such, should have been simply funneled by MRP directly to the fund.

I again request from you a formal explanation as to why MRP did not notice either the Kansas Corporation Commission or NECA as a creditor in its initial filing. I would also like an explanation as to how, despite having no notice and never having been listed as a creditor, the KCC would be barred from collecting the money due the KUSF. Based upon my initial review of bankruptcy law, it would appear that a debtor's failure to list a debt and notice a creditor creates a debt that is non-dischargeable.

4. Neither NECA, as administrator, nor the KCC, as creditor, received due process notice of MRP's bankruptcy status.

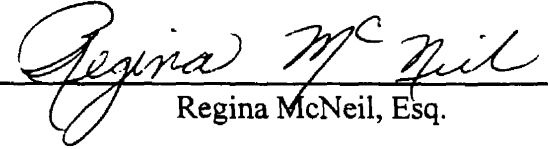
5. Only after the KCC issued an Order to show Cause for failure to report/remit KUSF charges was the KUSF and NECA notified that MRP was in bankruptcy.

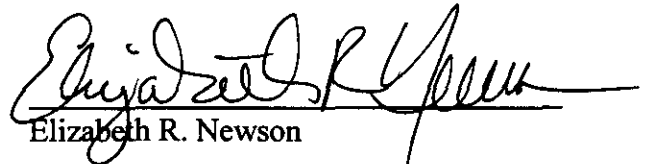
