Southern Company-Florida, LLC, ("joint petitioners") for
determination of need for a proposed electrical power plant. The
joint petitioners propose the construction of a 633 megawatt
(nominal) combined cycle power plant at the existing Curtis H.
Stanton Energy Center in eastern Orange County, Florida, with a
planned commercial service date of October 1, 2003. This matter
has been assigned Commission Docket No. 010142-EM.
