ALABAMA POWER COMPANY'S AND GULF POWER COMPANY'S MOTION TO SUPPLY MATERIAL OMITTED FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE RECORD

Pursuant to Rule 16 of the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure, Alabama Power Company ("APCo") and Gulf Power Company ("Gulf Power") respectfully move this Court for permission to supply it with materials that have been omitted from the administrative record. In support of this motion, APCo and Gulf Power submit the following:

APCo and Gulf Power have filed petitions seeking review of the September 8, 2000 Order ("Order") issued by the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"). This Court has consolidated the two petitions. The FCC has filed with the Court the purported Certified List of Items in the Record, listing items contained within the administrative record. The List submitted by the FCC is not complete, omitting several documents before the FCC at the time it issued the Order challenged in this case.

APCo and Gulf Power do not seek to supplement the record with documents not before the FCC at the time of its action. Rather, they seek merely to include the documents listed below which are part of the administrative record and are critical to a complete understanding of the case:

- 1. Motion of Alabama Power Company for Leave to File Motion to Dismiss Complaint for Lack of Jurisdiction–July 6, 2000
- 2. Alabama Power Company's Answer to Petition for Temporary Stay–July 6, 2000
- 3. Alabama Power Company's Motion for Leave to File a Motion for Confidential Treatment of Commercial and Financial Information–July 24, 2000

This Motion is filed in accordance with Rule 16 of the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure which provides that "[t]he parties may at any time, by stipulation, supply any omission from the record or correct a misstatement, or the court may so direct." Fed. R. App. P. 16(b) (emphasis added). Because APCo and Gulf Power merely seek to "supply an omission from the record," this Motion is due to be granted. Furthermore, it is important for this Court to be able to review all of the materials viewed by the agency at the time of the challenged action in order for it to render an informed decision on the merits of the case.

Counsel for the Petitioners have conferred with counsel for the Respondents concerning this inadvertent omission, and the parties have stipulated to this correction of the Certified List of Items in the Record.

WHEREFORE, Petitioners APCo and Gulf Power respectfully request that this Court permit them to supply the administrative record with the materials listed above.
