Staff believes that GTE Communications Corporation n/k/a Verizon Select Services Inc. (Verizon), during the period December 15, 1997, through September 30, 1999, was in violation of Rule 25-4.118, Florida Administrative Code, Local, Local Toll, or Toll Provider Selection, which requires that a customer's toll provider shall not be changed without the customer's authorization. During the period in question, staff has determined that Verizon committed 209 unauthorized carrier changes in violation of Rule 25-4.118, Florida Administrative Code.

d. <u>Staff's Position on the Issues</u>

ISSUE 1:

- (a) During the time period of December 15, 1997 through September 30 1999, did GTE Communications Corporation, (n/k/a Verizon Select Services, Inc.) willfully violate Rule 25-4.118, Florida Administrative Code, which prohibits unauthorized carrier changes?
- (b) If so, how many willful violations were there, and what is the appropriate action, penalty, and/or fine amount to be imposed by the Commission for any such violations?

Position

- (a) Staff believes that Verizon did willfully violated Rule 25-4.118, Florida Administrative Code.
- (b) Staff closed 209 consumer complaints against Verizon as apparent infractions of Rule 25-4.118, Florida Administrative Code. Staff believes the appropriate penalty should be comparable to that imposed in similar cases.
