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PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. We're going to call this prehearing to order. Counsel, read the notice.

MR. FORDHAM: Pursuant to notice issued

March 5th, 2001, this time and place were set for a

prehearing in Docket Number 010102-TP, investigation of

proposed updates to the routing data base system and

business rating input database system affecting the Tampa

telecommunications carriers, for the purposes set forth in

the meeting — in the hearing.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. We'll take appearances, starting with Mr. Horton and going to the right.

MR. HORTON: Norman H. Horton, Jr., and Floyd R. Self of Messer, Caparello & Self on behalf of AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Intermedia Communications, Inc., and WorldCom, Inc. And I'd like to enter an appearance for Marsha Rule for AT&T; Scott Sapperstein for Intermedia; and Donna McNulty for WorldCom.

MS. CAMECHIS: Good morning.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Good morning.

MS. CAMECHIS: Karen Camechis for Time Warner
Telecom of Florida, L.P., and also Peter M. Dunbar of the
Pennington Law Firm.

1	MR. BECK: Good morning. My name is
2	Charlie Beck. I'm with the Office of Public Counsel,
3	appearing on behalf of Florida Citizens.
4	MS. CASWELL: Kim Caswell for Verizon-Florida,
5	Incorporated.
6	MR. FORDHAM: Lee Fordham, Commission Staff.
7	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. And let the
8	record reflect we have Karen (sic) Wheeler, counsel for
9	NANPA
10	MS. WHEELER: It's Kimberly Wheeler. Thank you.
11	And thank you for allowing me to attend by telephone.
12	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Our pleasure. We're just
13	going to jump right into it.
14	MR. FORDHAM: Commissioner, as you are well
15	aware, and all of us, this is a very compacted docket,
16	being only two months from the opening of the docket to
17	the hearing date itself. Consequently, the linguistics
18	have been somewhat of a challenge. I think at this point
19	I would recommend that we do go through the prehearing
20	order, and Staff also has some thoughts on the order of
21	witnesses when we reach that point.
22	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. Okay. Let's
23	we can go section by section. And if anyone has I'll
24	just call out the sections. If anybody's got any changes
25	that need to be suggested or made, speak right up.

1	MR. HORTON: Commissioner?
2	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Yes.
3	MR. HORTON: Over here, excuse me.
4	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: That's all right.
5	MR. HORTON: Before we start, maybe I noticed
6	that we're also given an appearance for Time Warner, and
7	that should be corrected
8	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right.
9	MR. HORTON: on the printed draft.
10	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay.
11	MS. CASWELL: Excuse me, Commissioner.
12	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Yes.
13	MS. CASWELL: I just noticed I don't think
14	I'm on the appearance list. They have our regulatory
15	people there instead.
16	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Right.
17	MS. CASWELL: So that should probably be changed
18	to my name.
19	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. We'll make those
20	changes. We're going to strike the regulatory.
21	MS. CASWELL: Yeah, that would be
22	Michelle Robinson and David Christian.
23	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Right. Okay. Sections
24	well, Section 1 and Section 2, any comments or changes?
25	Seeing none. Moving along to the confidential

1	information, Section 3.
2	MR. FORDHAM: Commissioner, there have been no
3	confidentiality issues raised in this docket at this
4	point.
5	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. Sections 4 and
6	5. This is all pretty much standard language, so let's
7	get to the order of witnesses. Staff, you had some
8	suggested order letting
9	MR. FORDHAM: Commissioner, I would recommend
10	that Verizon be the first witness to set out the
11	activities that gave rise to the opening of this docket.
12	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay.
13	MR. FORDHAM: And following Verizon, I would
14	recommend that Staff be second, and then thereafter, I
15	don't know that any particular order is favored over the
16	other, just we had initially listed them in the order
17	their prehearing statements came in.
18	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Right. Is there any
19	objections to having Verizon put their testimony on first?
20	MS. CASWELL: Commissioner, I have no objection.
21	But I would like to ask if we're assuming that direct and
22	rebuttal will be combined, because
23	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: That's the way we've usually
24	done it.
25	MS CASWELL: Yeah

1 MR. FORDHAM: That would be the Staff 2 recommendation, also, combining those. 3 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. We'll have the order reflect that, to combine those. 4 MS. WHEELER: This is Kimberly Wheeler, 5 6 representing NANPA. **COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Yes.** 7 8 MS. WHEELER: As far as Tom Foley, we submitted 9 his prefiled direct testimony at the request of Staff, and 10 we basically just directed the testimony toward how 11 Verizon's proposal might affect relief. We tried to give a couple of different scenarios, and we would like to ask 12 13 if the parties are willing to or would consider waiving 14 cross-examination of Tom Foley so that he would not need 15 to attend, but of course, we would be willing to attend if 16 anyone needed to ask questions. 17 **COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Ms. Wheeler, I think what** 18 we're trying to do here is just get an order of witnesses down so that we can issue the prehearing order in form. 19 And I think that those conversations can probably be taken 20 up as part of your normal interaction outside of the 21 22 prehearing. 23 MS. WHEELER: Okay. Thank you. That's fine. **COMMISSIONER BAEZ:** You're free to approach --24

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you know, you're free to broach the subject with any of

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1	the parties' counsel to see if they have any objections.
2	And I guess I don't want to cut anybody out, but if
3	anybody has objections to that now that it's been asked,
4	maybe we can discuss it now if you'd like.
5	MS. CAMECHIS: I would have no objection.
6	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: You have no objection.
7	MR. HORTON: Subject to check, I don't think we
8	have any objection.
9	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. Ms. Wheeler, I'n
10	not going to make that ruling now. It's something that we
11	can straighten out headed up to hearing. Okay? But it's,
12	you know, out there for discussion.
13	MS. WHEELER: Thank you. And in that case, we
14	have no preference as to the order of witnesses.
15	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. Any of the
16	remaining parties have any objection to having the Verizon
17	witness first, Staff second?
18	MS. CAMECHIS: No objection at all.
19	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: No objections.
20	MS. CAMECHIS: I prefer that. Actually, I would
21	just like to ask Staff to make sure that Craig Tystad is
22	listed for direct and rebuttal on there.
23	MR. FORDHAM: Yes. We're going to combine
24	those, direct and rebuttal. And, Commissioner, since we
25	are the one sponsoring Tom Foley's testimony, that would

be second following Verizon, Mr. Foley's testimony. 1 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. We'll make the 2 3 necessary changes. MR. FORDHAM: Okay. 4 **COMMISSIONER BAEZ:** Anything else on the witness 5 6 order? 7 MR. HORTON: Commissioner, not on the order of witnesses, but as noted, Denise Thomas is adopting the 8 testimony of Mr. Joeger, James Joeger. 9 10 **COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Yes.** 11 MR. HORTON: I will refile this afternoon that 12 testimony that just simply puts her background and 13 qualifications in the front of it, just so that it's 14 clear. 15 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. Thank you. And 16 then my understanding is the basic positions -- I mean, 17 the order of the statements is going to get rearranged. 18 MR. FORDHAM: Commissioner, we basically entered those on the draft prehearing order in the order we 19 20 received their prehearing statements, which were not due 21 until this past Friday; therefore, there are a couple that 22 are not even totally complete because a couple of the 23 parties did not supply CDs or tapes, and therefore, we are 24 having to manually enter those. So a couple of them are 25 not complete. But basically the issues here on the draft

1	prehearing order are verbatim off of their prehearing
2	statements.
3	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. Are there any
4	I guess we should ask the question. Is there any
5	objection to the way the issues are presented in the
6	draft?
7	MS. CAMECHIS: No objection.
8	MR. HORTON: None.
9	MR. BECK: No objection.
10	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: We're okay with okay. I
11	apologize. I just got this draft. I mean, we're working
12	pretty fast, and I'm sure probably no one has had a chance
13	to look at it for too long.
14	OPC, I see your comments are up here somehow
15	first. So if you have any changes that you need to
16	make
17	MR. BECK: No, I have no changes.
18	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: No changes. Alltel,
19	Mr. Horton? And let's just go through if you have any
20	comments on the positions as they are reflected in the
21	order.
22	MR. HORTON: No, sir. On behalf of the ones we
23	are appearing for, there's no changes.
24	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. Time Warner?
25	MS. CAMECHIS: Commissioner, I haven't had an

1	opportunity to read through all of the positions, but if
2	Staff is just incorporating them from the prehearing
з	statement, that's perfectly acceptable.
4	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Is that a fair
5	MR. FORDHAM: Yes, Commissioner, they are
6	directly off of the individual intervenors' prehearing
7	statements.
8	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. Ms. Caswell?
9	MS. CASWELL: I have no changes.
10	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Section 9, the exhibits
11	list.
12	MR. FORDHAM: Commissioner, the majority of
13	exhibits, of course, are being tendered by Verizon. What
14	we will do on these exhibits, and again, these are right
15	off of the prehearing statements, and we will conform the
16	order to the order of the witnesses, but as far as the
17	designation and the content, it's right off of the
18	prehearing statement.
19	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. We don't have
20	any have any proposed stipulations at this time, although
21	given the comments, you know, we're going to have some
22	discussion
23	MR. FORDHAM: At this time we don't,
24	Commissioner, but as you indicated possibly before the
25	final draft of this is prepared, there may be, but at this

1	point there are none.
2	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Pending motions?
3	MR. FORDHAM: There are no pending motions at
4	this time.
5	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Anything else that we need
6	to discuss today? We don't have confidentiality matters.
7	All right. Are we done? Anything else that's out there?
8	MR. FORDHAM: There's nothing else that Staff
9	has that we should discuss at this time, Commissioner.
10	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. Are there any
11	future dates where we have to convene or are we just
12	MR. FORDHAM: Well, only for the hearing, which
13	is the 27th.
14	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. All right. We're
15	adjourned then.
