Dear Ms. Bayo':

I respectfully request that you give this order reconsideration. This is based on the following reasons:

1. As stated in the order dated May 21, 2001, I received no letter from the commission on February 1, 2001. This letter apparently explained that "staff could not recommend acceptance of his settlement offer since the check register was insufficient ..."
2. The original assessment of \$59 was paid in March of 2000. In September of 2000 once I found out the check was never received, the fee was paid. A letter offering a fine of \$50 was also submitted. A \$500 fine, based on a \$59 fee appears to be excessive. I felt a \$50 fine was acceptable, even though I did pay the assessment on time; unfortunately the check was mis-posted or never received.

Ms. Bayo', if I had received the letter of February 1, 2001 I would have acted immediately. I have no reason not to, especially considering the magnitude of this fine. I am a law-abiding citizen and I know the importance of paying taxes and fees.

If I must pay this fine, I will have to declare bankruptcy due to the fact that I only have six active phones and it would take me 8 months to pay the \$500 from profits. The pay phone business is suffering dramatically.

Thank you for taking the time to reconsider this order.
