NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER CANCELLING ALTERNATIVE LOCAL EXCHANGE TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND INTEREXCHANGE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CERTIFICATES

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

By letter dated May 8, 2001, NewSouth Holdings, Inc., parent company of UniversalCom, Inc. (UniversalCom), holder of Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications Certificate (ALEC) of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 4096 and Interexchange Telecommunications Certificate (IXC) of Public Convenience and

Necessity No. 3174, has requested the cancellation of ALEC Certificate No. 4096 and IXC Certificate 3174. UniversalCom has complied with the provisions of Rules 25-24.820(2) and 25-24.474(2), Florida Administrative Code, by providing adequate notice in writing of its request for cancellation of its ALEC and IXC certificates and by submitting its Regulatory Assessment Fees (RAFs) for the years 2000 and 2001. Accordingly, we find it appropriate to cancel ALEC Certificate No. 4096 and IXC Certificate No. 3174, effective May 8, 2001. UniversalCom shall return to this Commission the Order granting authority to provide ALEC and IXC services.

In addition, under Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, certificate holders must pay a minimum annual RAFs of \$50 if the certificate was active during any portion of the calendar year. A RAFs Return notice for the year 2001 will be mailed to UniversalCom. Neither the cancellation of its certificate nor the failure to receive a RAFs Return notice for the year 2001 shall relieve UniversalCom from its obligation to pay RAFs for the year 2001.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that UniversalCom, Inc.'s Certificate No. 4096 to provide Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications services is hereby canceled, effective May 8, 2001. It is further

ORDERED that UniversalCom, Inc.'s Certificate No. 3174 to provide Interexchange Telecommunications services is hereby canceled, effective May 8, 2001. It is further

ORDERED that UniversalCom, Inc. shall return to this Commission the Orders granting authority to provide Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications services and Interexchange Telecommunications services and remit Regulatory Assessment Fees for the year 2001. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is
