

**TAMPA ELECTRIC COMPANY'S
MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME**

Tampa Electric Company (“Tampa Electric” or “the company”), pursuant to Rule 28-106.204, Florida Administrative Code, moves the Commission for a one-week extension of time within which to respond to the Florida Industrial Power Users Group’s Third Set of Interrogatories and Third Set of Requests for Production of Documents and, as grounds therefor, says:

1 Tampa Electric’s answers to the Florida Industrial Power Users Group’s (“FIPUG”) Third Set of Interrogatories and Third Set of Requests for Production of Documents are currently due September 20, 2001.

2. Travel disruptions stemming from last week’s tragic events and remedial efforts following tropical storm Gabrielle, have affected key Tampa Electric employees involved in responding to FIPUG’s discovery requests. Tampa Electric does not believe that it will be able to complete the company’s responses by the due date.

3. Tampa Electric requests a one week extension of time through an including September 27, 2001 within which to respond to FIPUG’s discovery requests. To the extent the company is able to respond sooner than September 27, it will do so.

4. Tampa Electric is authorized to represent that FIPUG does not oppose this Motion based on the circumstances described above.

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
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
